

Ewers was on a sabbatical leave from Indiana.

Warren Cantrell, PGA president, was hospitalized recently for high blood pressure . . . You don't have to be an All-American M.D. to guess that the work and worries Cantrell acquired for no pay in serving as PGA president has damaged his health . . . Cantrell bore the heavy load of labor, abuse and risk in saving the pro association members several million dollars on the Palm Beach Gardens headquarters and golf course deal . . . The earnest Cantrell and his team weren't warv enough to sidestep the trap that caught them as the purchased innocents in a deal for trying to convert an exhibition match into a so-called "World Championship" . . . How buying the PGA okay alone would make an exhibition a World Championship involving also the USGA and Royal and Ancient and Masters champions is an embarrassing question the promoter of the exhibition leaves for the PGA to explain.



agement it continues to be a risky business to put on a major tournament in mid-August, worst time of the year for grass in most areas . . . Erath and his crew have more hours of work and worry in their part of the PGA championship than the winner will have.

Connecticut GCSA members and their chairmen met at CC of Farmington, Conn., July 8 for an afternoon of golf and informal discussions of current problems, especially those associated with drought . . . Pres. Burke, Supt. John Perry, Green Chairman Lou Teich of the host club, William Jaschinsky, Connecticut GCSA president and supt., Torrington CC, John C. Schread, Jess De France and Herb Graffis, GOLFDOM editor, spoke briefly at the dinner concluding the meeting . . . 

Peter Thomson has used his driver one time . . . His other drives were hit with a brassie and he's kept the ball in the fairway . . . In a news story from Royal Birkdale at Southport, where Thomson won his fifth British Open (and about \$5,000) with a 285, there was reference to Thomson being angry with the treatment he got on the American circuit . . . I doubt that . . . He was disqualified twice for signing incorrect scorecards kept by prominent U.S. pros with whom he played . . . During interviews he took these disqualifications gracefully and blamed nobody but himself . . . The second time was at a Masters and there he told me that the American chaps always acted as though he were one of their own instead of a visitor.

Complaints of professionals that clicks of cameras disturb them at major championships, especially at the British Open, makes me wonder why there rarely are any good golf tournament action photos any more despite vast improvements in equipment used by news still, movie and TV photographers and facilities made available for the work . . In U.S. and British newspapers and magazines you won't see a half dozen unusually interesting golf action news pictures a year.

An advertisement in a weekly magazine offered a Paul Hahn golf instruction booklet to anyone who'd write Paul Hahn, Cape Coral, Fla. . . . It was a Cape Coral real estate ad . . . Paul's home is there . . . There were 36,000 requests for the booklet . . And what a job it was picking Hahn's urgent business mail out of the flood of ad responses!

Seven club tournaments played in Chicago District in June raised a record \$2,182,700 for Combined Jewish Appeal . . . Randy Glover in his final round 68 at St. Paul became the third to take only 19 putts in a PGA tournament round . . . Bill Nary took 19 putts and 41 other strokes in the third round of the 1952 El Paso Open and Bob Rosburg had only 19 putts in shooting a third round 62 in the 1959 Pensacola Open.
