survived, even though it was outlawed in 1457. The Scottish Parliament of King James II decided that golf was interfering with archery training and thus weakening national defense. Through the centuries, the game and its playing equipment have been refined. Golf shafts made of hickory wood appeared in the early 1900's and, despite their lack of uniformity, truly great players developed such as Britain's Ted Ray and Harry Vardon, and America's Francis

for celebrated golfers like Walter Hagen, Gene Sarazen, and Bobby Jones. By the 1930's, the steel shaft had arrived. And with it the long hitters. Bright new stars appeared. Jimmy Demaret, Byron Nelson, Sam Snead, Ben Hogan. As steel revolutionized the golf shaft in the 20's, the introduction in the 1970's of carbon-graphite may be the beginning of a new golden golf era. 


