Dear Dan:

On Monday of last week I called the EPA, Washington, D.C., to obtain further clarification of the announced ban on the use of virtually all fungicides containing mercury in the United States. My principal interest, of course, was confirmation of the news releases which reported loss of such materials in turf disease control, one of the areas where pending loss had been seriously contested.

I am writing you, Dan, since you may be able to share the information with colleagues through the Association's newsletter.

Dr. Eugene Wilson with the EPA Office of Pesticide Programs, Washington, D.C., confirmed that Administrator Train has formally ruled that only three very minor uses for mercury-containing fungicides will remain after presently manufactured supplies have been used up. One is

for brown stain disease control in the lumber industry of the west coast; another is for the use of PMA in the manufacture of certain awnings and tarps for outdoor use; the third, curiously enough, is for "Freir's Dutch Elm Disease Arrester" which has been registered for years, but the use of which is not condoned by any shade tree researchers. The rationale for permitting the latter is that (1) the minute quantity of mercury used is injected within the tree where environmental contact is almost non-existent; (2) there may be some benefit in isolated instances; and (3) the legitimacy of such use must be determined by October, 1977, anyway which is the date that all other pesticides must have passed re-examination and be classified as to restricted or general use category.

When asked if the Administrator's ruling was binding and final, Dr. Wilson indicated that the route of appeal

opinion that the decision will not be reversed, however.

I am personally disappointed that mercurials were not retained as a restricted use chemical for snow mold control purposes. The earlier optimism that such would occur was obviously not justified. I believe that we can effectively control the disease complex in most instances in southern Wisconsin with alternative compounds, but probably not with the same level of confidence from season to season as we would like to have. Courses further north will face additional concerns.

Mercurial fungicides already manufactured may be used up. No cut-off date has been announced.


If I receive additional information, I will plan to share it with the Golf Course Superintendent's Association.
