Cooperators Requested for Gypsy Moth Trapping

Editor's Note: Julie Nara, Entomologist for the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, has requested the support of Wisconsin's Golf Course Superintendents in the 1985 Gypsy Moth Trapping Program. Julie is hopeful that the cooperation will be on the same level that it was for 1984 when a number of WGCSA members participated in the program. Let's lend our support for another year.

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection is seeking cooperators to conduct local trapping for gypsy moths.

The gypsy moth, which was introduced and accidentally released in the state of Massachusetts in 1869, has now attained outbreak populations in the northeastern United States. In Wisconsin, isolated infestations are present in Oconomowoc, Monona and Hubertus. Possible infestations have been found in Sheboygan and Bonduel. Moths have also been caught near the Wisconsin border in Minnesota, Michigan and Illinois.

Gypsy moth trapping requires adherence to the following timetable in the southern part of the state.

July 14 July 20 Last week of July	 All traps should be in place. First moths expected to emerge. First check of traps. If possible, check at weekly intervals afterwards.
End of August	 Remove and check traps again. Send us a map or sketch with trap locations indicated
September	and trapping results.

Gypsy moth trap density is 1 - 4 traps per square mile. Location of traps, placement date, dates and results of checks should be recorded.
