

ROBERTS RE-ELECTED: GARNERS RECORD VOTE TOTAL IN HOUSTON

Wisconsin's Bill Roberts was overwhelmingly re-elected to a two-year term on the GCSAA Board of Directors at the recently completed 1988 GCSAA Conference in Houston. Rod Johnson, the WGCSA voting delegate and chairman of Bill's re-election effort, said it was the largest vote total for a single candidate in the history of the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America.
