As a golf course superintendent, you are responsible for making sure that your course provides enjoyable play for your club members.

In addition, application techniques are important to your effort to reduce the amount of pesticides applied to your golf course.

Through demonstrations and opportunities for hands-on learning, your spray technician will learn the principles of effective sprayer operation, which will in turn allow you to feel more comfortable about your chemical applications.

You can be sure your spray technician will:

- ❖ Learn how to use various types of sprayers.
- ❖ Understand components of sprayers and how they work.
- ❖ Gain exposure to calibration and application methods including effects of pressure, boom height, vehicle speed, and weather conditions.
- ❖ Learn about equipment maintenance and storage.
- ❖ Practice safety procedures including emergency spill clean up and first aid.
- ❖ Know how to eliminate costly errors and apply pesticides in the most effective manner possible.
- ❖ Increase the safety factor in all chemical applications.
- ❖ Know how to use equipment in a manner that will prolong its lifespan and reduce the need for servicing.

This seminar will provide your spray technician with the necessary training—without your having to take the time to provide training yourself
