October 21 will mark 7 years since longtime Ozaukee Country Club Superintendent Wayne Otto lost his battle with Cancer. In respect for Wayne's legacy as a great person, friend and superintendent his colleagues started the Wee One Foundation to honor their longtime friend.

Wayne was given the name "Wee One" on a 1985 golf trip to Scotland. The local caddies were making wagers on the four friends when one caddie declared, "My money's on the Wee One!"

The Foundation was developed to assist golf course management professionals (or their dependents) who incur overwhelming expenses due to medical hardship. Through the Foundations work, Wayne's legacy will never be forgotten.

Membership in the Wee One Foundation has grown to over 270 in 17 states. Member dues along with event proceeds have allowed the Foundation to give over \$375,000 to deserving families.

The golf industry is unique as we are all competitors of each other for the almighty round of golf or member but

at the same time we are all willing to help each other with equipment needs or turf problems. Through the Wee One we can take it one step further and help through the donation of funds at a time families need them the most.

Sheboygan Country Club was founded in 1905 and moved to its current "Pine Hills" location in 1929. The new course was designed by Harry Smead. The course plays to a par 71 at 6,481 yards over rolling terrain crossing the Pigeon River a few times.

The format for the Wee One is a select drive alternate shot played in 6-somes and thanks to your support the field maxed out again at 162 players. Attendees are treated to a Taco Bar and Sheboygan Brat Stand on the course, great prizes and raffles along with Hors d'oeuvres with plenty of camaraderie after the round.

Membership in the Wee One is currently \$75 per year and the money truley goes to a great cause helping those in our industry through their most troublesome times.


