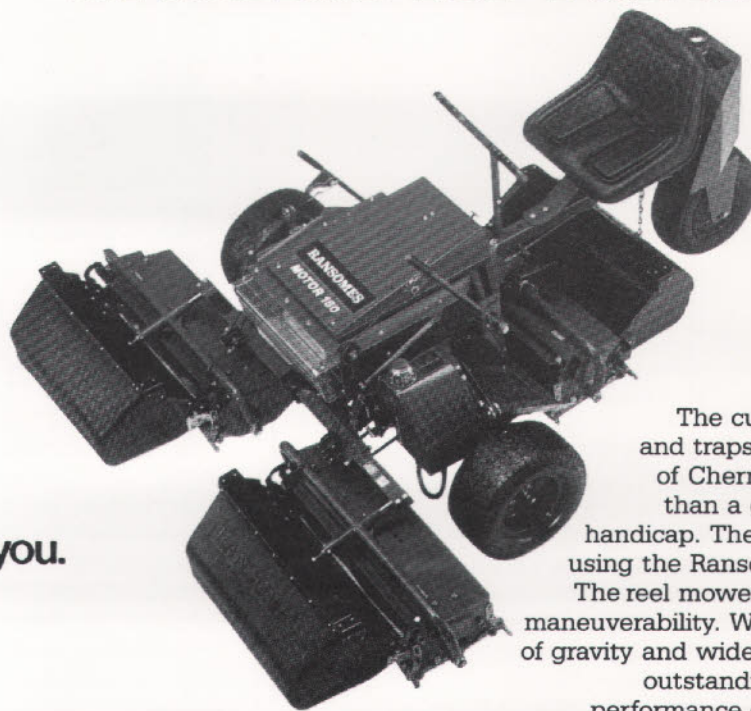

Sartoretto also handed out a very informative reprint from his 1982 article which says, "There is a great economic and performance benefit in being able to spray a mixture of chemicals at the same time." Sartoretto illustrated these benefits by explaining how chemicals are grouped (S, SP, EC, WP and F — the EPA signal letters), showing various chemical combinations and discussing the general do's and don'ts of tank mixing.
