GOLF COURSE DESIGN PRINCIPLES

On March 12th and 13th, a full roster of 60 persons from the WGCSA and associates from related fields from Wisconsin and neighboring states had the pleasure of attending The Golf Course Design Principles Seminar at the Holiday Inn West in Milwaukee.

I his seminar has been presented some 19 times throughout the United States by two very fine gentlemen representing the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (sponsored locally by our WGCSA). The men I speak of are Robert Muir Graves, ASGCA out of Walnut Creek, California and Geoffrey S. Cornish, ASGCA and co-author of the historical reference *The Golf Course* out of Amherst, Massachusetts. Both men are world renowned architects and well versed in golf course design and communication involved in all aspects of this business.

The seminar consisted of lectures on an overview of the complexities of golf course design, history of golf architecture, slides to complement the well organized presentations, actual drawings, topographical maps, blue prints and so on, and of course workshops. (We created our own 18 hole course and detailed one of those holes on an actual site map - without income - but without responsibilities either!)


My impression, if I may, was that this was one of the best presentations that I have attended, but is an example of the fine seminars available through our national organization. The content was valuable and pertinent. The two outstanding teachers are capable of helping us understand the ideal relationships from the design into the construction and onto the time of actual play. Your attention is kept with frequent humor, beautiful slides, well planned materials, and hands-on drawings with "gentle" critique. The test at the end culminates the two-day event. The open discussion atmosphere and genuine interest of the instructors helps us all better understand each of our own part of the architect-superintendent-contractor-member relationship.

Some of our photographs only depict the setting of the days at the Holiday Inn, and not the quality and content of the sessions. I cannot explain in words the total image presented to us but can only recommend this seminar to those of you who may not yet have been able to take advantage of it.





Many exciting golf courses were designed during the seminar!






