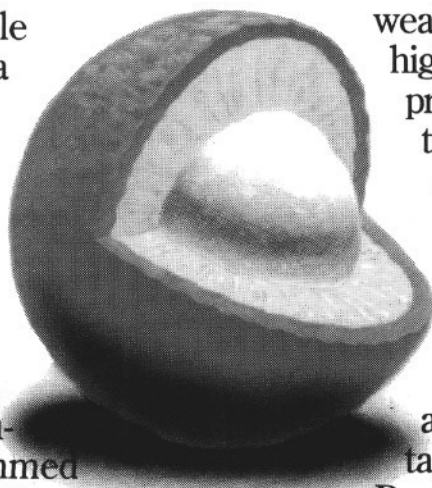

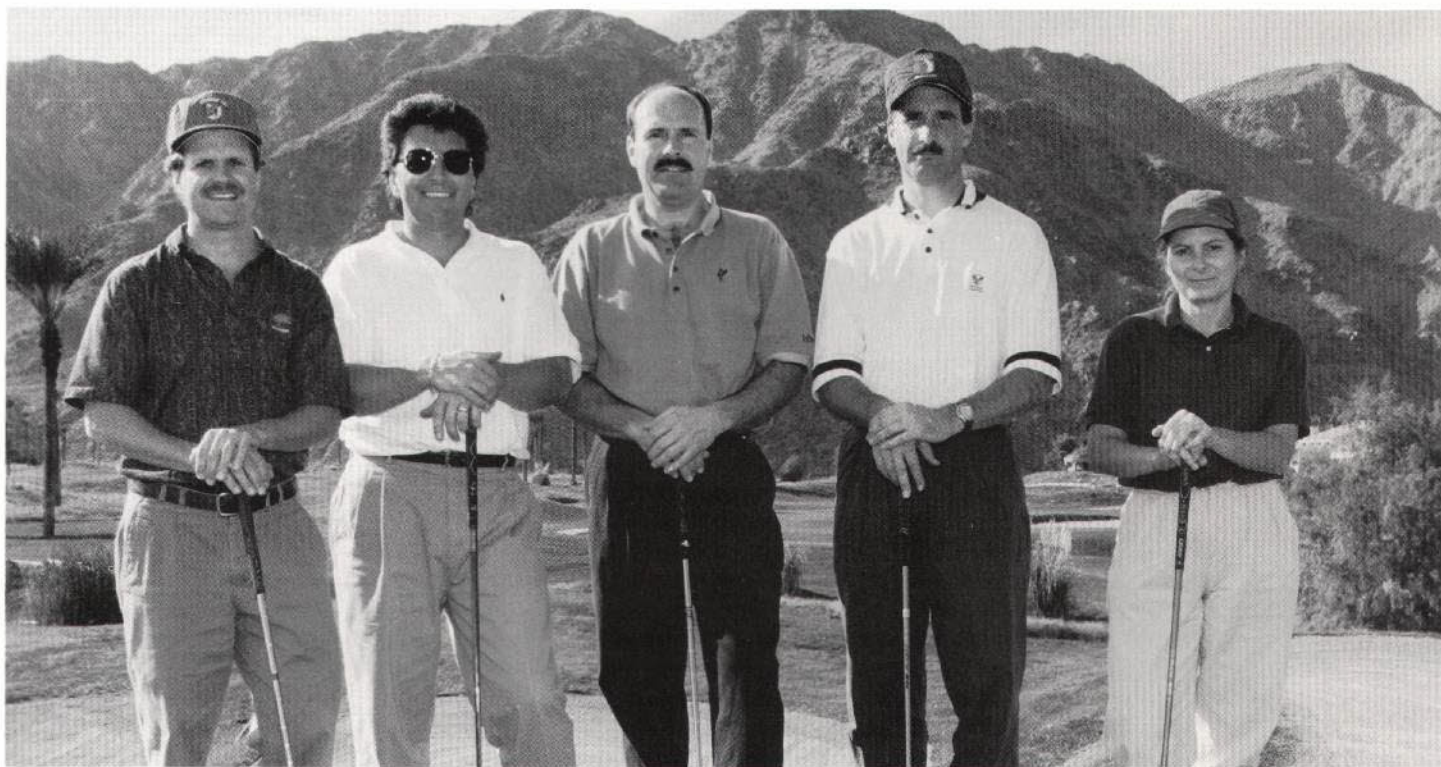
respectively. Streff was an extra Monroe Country Club Director who filled in for manager Tim Arndt who had surgery just before the competition.

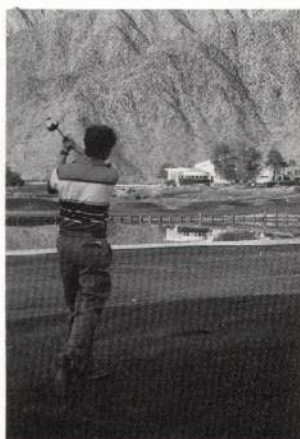
The golf results might not have been that great. The tournament was a definite 10 on the fun and entertainment scale though. I hope the 1994 team has just as much fun. ♣



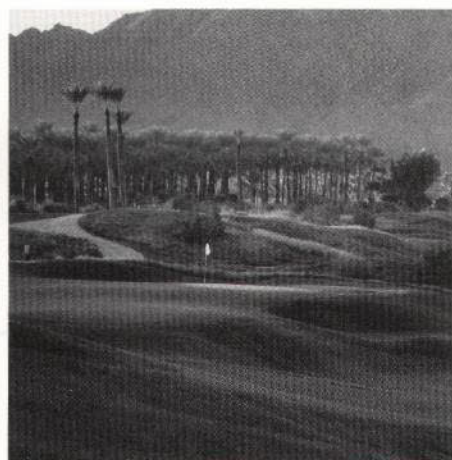

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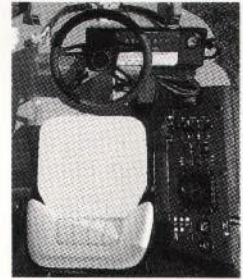
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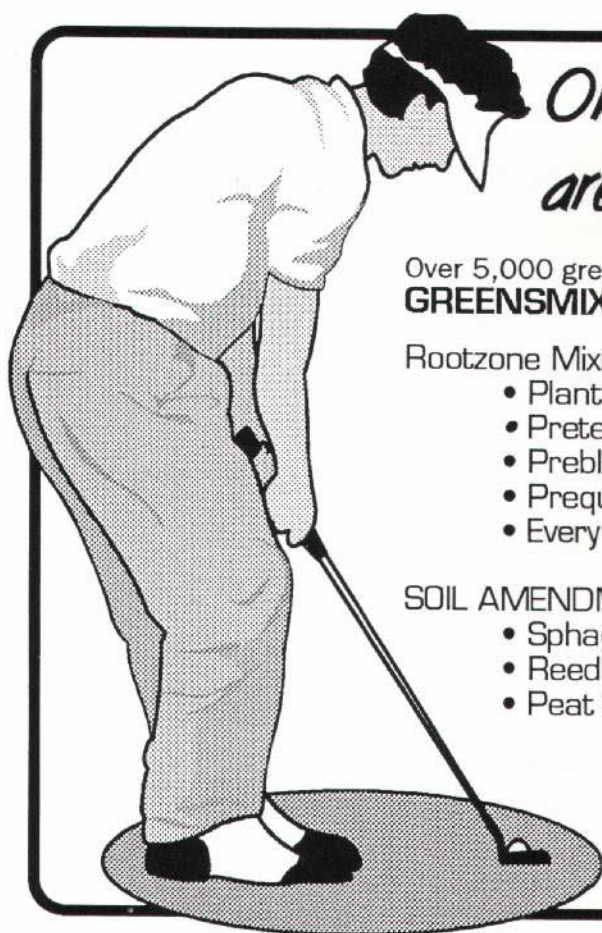


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
