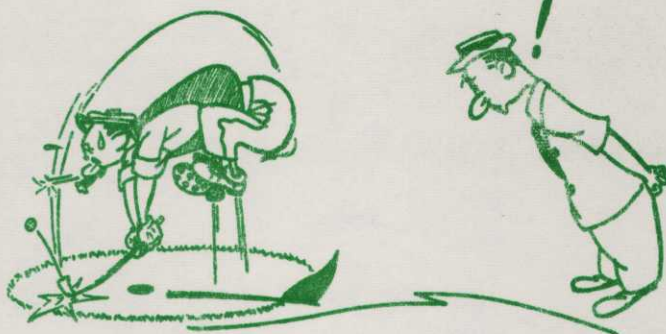

REMEMBER -- Educational Conference, Lowry Hotel, St. Paul, February 27, 28 and March 1, 1963.

Registrations will begin 8:30 AM on the Mezzanine Floor of the Lowry Hotel.

Wednesday and Thursday sessions will be in the Lowry Ballroom.
