During March research invoices were mailed to your golf clubs. In many instances it is the superintendent's responsibility to see that this invoice is presented to the proper official at the club. All too often that invoice is set on the superintendent's desk or lost in the shuffle of his paperwork and it ends up in the circular file.

Over the years more and more clubs have contributed to the Research Fund. In 1971 only twelve courses participated. In 1981 forty-three clubs donated \$6,000.00 to the Research Fund. In this day and age, research is a valuable asset to the superintendent who has many

alternatives available to him. Those alternatives properly researched will benefit the golf course which is our main objective.

This summer Dr. Taylor will return to the Twin Cities. Our Research Fund will help purchase equipment and supplies so Dr. Taylor can continue with the sand program for greens. USGA NAMES GREEN SECTION NATIONAL DIRECTOR

William H. Bengeyfield, who joined the United States Golf Association staff in 1954, has been named National Director of the U.S.G.A. Green Section.

Bengeyfield, formerly Technical Director of the Green Section and Editor of the Green Section Record, assumed his new duties on February 1. He replaces Alexander M. Radko, who retired November 30, 1981 after thirty-five years of service.

"Bill Bengeyfield is probably the most eminently qualified person in the country for this position", said U.S.G.A. Senior Executive Director Harry W. Easterly, Jr. "We consider ourselves most fortunate to have a man of Bill's stature in this vital position." Bengeyfield will continue to serve as Green Section Record Editor. In his new duties, he will supervise the U.S.G.A.'s twelve-man Green Section staff and will have overall responsibilities for course preparations at U.S.G.A. Championships. He will be based in the Green Section's Western Region office in Tustin, California.
