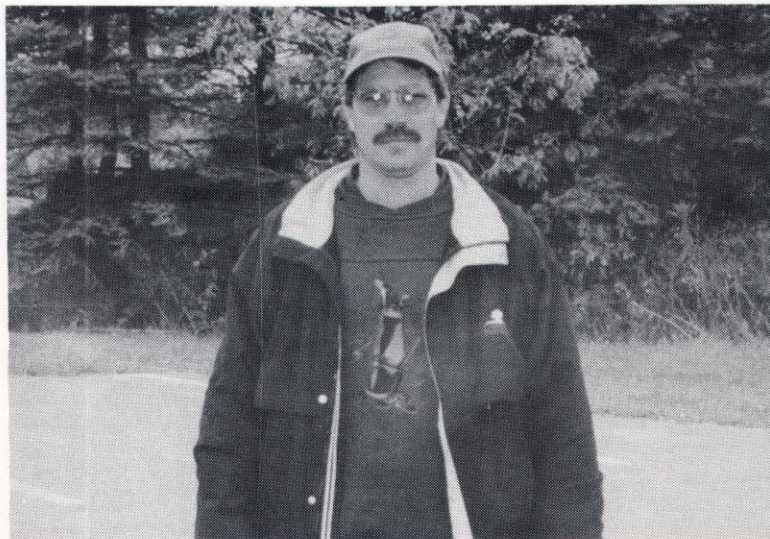
Erickson, Meier, Schultz and Grundstrom Capture Final MGCSA Mixer for 1998
