News Release

James A. Fisher, director of sales and service for Toro's Turf Products has announced the development of a new low-cost utility vehicle designed specifically for golf course service. It is called the "Workmaster" and will be available in limited quantities in the fall of 1974, with a second production run planned for early in 1975. This equipment will have a load capacity of 1,000 pounds, excluding the weight of the operator, a maximum speed of 11 mph, low center gravity and oversized rear tires to improve hill-climbing ability. It will have many other important and safety features. Mr. Fisher says surveys of golf course superintendents "to obtain a consensus of the kind of utility vehicle they wanted" contributed to the design of the "Workmaster."
