





Congratulations go out to Jeff Linder, Worthington Country Club, and his wife Julie on the birth of their child in early December.


In hopes your holiday season was in good cheer and safe times, I hope the start of the new year (millennium) also finds you in good health. With that I'll close...see ya next month.
