

RUDY WILL DIES

Rudy Will, former golf course superintendent at Woodmont Country Club, died February 23rd of a heart attack at his home in Orlando, Florida.

Mr. Will was superintendent at Woodmont for 25 years before his retirement in 1953. He was 72 years old.

Rudy started golf course work at the old Argyle Country Club (now Sligo Park Golf Course) in Silver Spring, Maryland. Later he moved to Harper Country Club, now known as White Flint Golf Course, then on to Woodmont in 1929, where he helped the club through the dull depression years.

He had been a member of the Kid-Atlantic since 1930 and was given a Life Membership on his retirement from active greatkeeping.
