The course has a full irrigation system with a storage capacity of 82 million gallons of water. Frank assumed his position as course superintendent on March 1, 1961. At the meeting Mr. Bob Minard of United Airlines will be the guest speaker and will show a film on California as well as discussing air travel to the National Conference in February.
