

Shoot out


The September 9, 1980 Mid-Atlantic meeting will be our annual joint meeting with the Philadelphia Association. Our host at Hercules C.C. will be their 21 year veteran Thomas Kelleher.

The greens are Penncross, cut daily at 3/16". They are fertilized with Nitroform Blue Chip at 4 lbs. N, 1 lb. of P. and 3 lbs. K per year. The fairways are a mixture of Blues and fine ryes with Poa Annua making its usual appearance. They are cut 3 times a week at 3/4". Fertilizer is normally applied spring and fall on a 2-1-2 basis.

The Greens fees have been waived and golf cars will be available.

Meet Dr. Thomas R. Turner

Tom is the new assistant professor of agronomy in turfgrass management at the University of Maryland. He was born in Richmond, Virginia, in 1951 and raised in Wilmington, Delaware. Tom received his B.S. in agronomy at V.P.I. and S.U. in 1973, specializing in turfgrass management. While at V.P.I., he worked during summers with the golf course grounds crews of the Dupont C.C. and Wilmington C.C., and received scholarships from the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America. He received his M.S. and Ph.D. at Penn State, doing research in the area of turfgrass soil testing and nutrition. He was also involved in research concerned with turfgrass soil modification and evaluation of nitrogen fertilizer sources. Tom started at the University of Maryland on September 24, 1979 and will be acting as Turfgrass Extension Specialist.

Reminder — The finals of the match play tournament will be played at the September meeting.


Deceptive Packaging — Humor
