# December 14 Election Meeting

Twin Lakes GC
Buck Whetsell - Host

The Fairfax County Park Authority owns and operates 63 holes of golf in the County of Fairfax. The Twin Lakes Golf Course is an 18-hole regulation located in Clifton. The Burke Lake Course is an 18-hole, par-3, located in Burke Lake. The Jefferson Golf Course is a regulation 9-hole located in Falls Church and the Greendale Golf Course is a regulation 18-hole located on Telegraph Road in Alexandria. Each of the courses has its own clubhouse manager who is responsible for the control of the greens fee tickets, inventory, cash, power carts, pull carts, and reserved tee times. Tee times are taken on Thursdays at 1:30 p.m. prior to a weekend or holiday. The tee times are set at every eight minutes.

The maintenance program is prepared and scheduled by the golf course superintendent and is expedited by the groundskeeper foreman at each of the golf courses.

The greens, tees, and fairways are mowed three times a week. Penncross bent grass on the greens is cut at ¼ inch in height. The bluegrass mixture in the fairways is mowed at 1¼ inches, and the tees at ½ inch. The roughs are mowed at 2 inches twice a week.

The preventive spray program for disease and insects is scheduled weekly for the many fungus problems that work in the turf. Some diseases that are predominant in our area are pythium, dollar spot, brown patch, snow mold, and frog eye.

The greens receive eight to ten pounds of actual nitrogen per year derived from a 38% Parex 20-0-16, 24% 16-8-8 or 18-5-9 analysis.

The fairways at each of the golf courses receive three applications per year of fertilizer, averaging six to eight pounds of actual nitrogen. The tees receive eight to ten pounds of actual nitrogen derived from the same analysis as is used on the putting greens.

The tees, greens, and fairways at Burke Lake, Twin Lakes, Jefferson and Greendale have a fully automatic irrigation system. The greens, tees, and fairways are scheduled to receive one inch of water per week.

Buck has been in the golf course business for 30 years. He has supervised the construction of all the county courses plus Tantallon, Goose Creek and Westwood C.C.

Twin Lakes is located at 6100 Clifton Road in Clifton, Virginia. Beltway 495 to Rt. 29 & 211 West of Fairfax City. Turn left on Clifton Road before you get into Centerville.

The meeting will be held at the Black Orchard Restaurant on 3236 in Annandale. Exit 6 east to Little River Turnpike Shopping Center. Approximately 2 miles off 495.

#### Lely Calibration

If you are wondering if your Lely spreader is putting out the proper amount of material, here is a way to check. Set the feed ring at 5. The opening should measure 11/16". If not, move ring till opening measures 11/16". This is where your proper 5 setting should be.
