# **Towson Golf and Country Club**

Towson Golf and Country Club opened for play in 1970. It was designed by Geoffrey Cornish and Bill Robinson from Amherst, Mass. Bill Emerson was the superintendent during construction and remained there until May of 1977. Then the present superintendent Paul O'Leary took over

The greens are primarily penncross with about 10% poa. They are verticut every Monday and are mowed at 5/32". They are mowed seven days a week and roll to about an eight on the stimpmeter. They receive a light topdressing every three to four weeks except in July and August. They are aerified twice a year; once in May and once in August with a Cushman Greensaver. They receive 3½ to 4 lbs.N per year. The tees are penncross. They are verticut bimonthly and topdressed monthly. They are cut at ½", four days a week. They receive 3 lbs.N per year.

The fairways are primarily ryegrass with some original bluegrass here and there. They are mowed at 3/4", four days a week with a crosscut on Thursdays. They receive 21 lbs.N per year.

Paul was born and raised in Alexandria, Va. He is a 1973 graduate of the Institute of Applied Agriculture at the Univ. of Maryland. He is married and has two children.

# PUTTING THE BRAKES ON TENSION
