Equipment Manager Update Summer Recap

In August I had the opportunity to volunteer at the BMW Championship hosted by Caves Valley. My week was spent in Jim Sollier's shop alongside Jim Nedin where we maintained the quality of cut, made several small repairs, and shared lots of experiences. The team at Caves did a fantastic job through hot conditions and passed on lots of knowledge to a group of eager volunteers. Despite the long days, there was never a moment of boredom when I was with a group of people that share the same interest/passion. Being humble and able to share lessons learned from previous mishaps really goes a long way and I was able to bring newfound wisdom back to work the following week.

Returning to work the following week brought about the busiest stretch of the year thus far. We were fourteen days post-aeration and doing plenty of reel grinding and typical maintenance ahead of Labor Day weekend which brings about the Fall event lineup. Our preference when the remaining topdressing sand has been collected and the turf has healed is to restore the factory relief on the reels and keep our edge by backlapping every 8-10 hours of mowing. For us this keeps the quality of cut at a great level and the reel assembly is honed as one cutting system without constantly being disassembled. Adjustments tend to last longer, and we remove less material than a normal spin grind.

Speaking of reels, we were happy to host Mark Luffy for an Equipment Manager's meeting September 15th which had a solid turnout at 29 guests. Mark went into detail about all manufacturers of cutting units, their attachments, and typical troubleshooting. I found this to be particularly helpful because while the core issue is not always the cutting unit- there are ways and accessories to manipulate equipment into improving the situation. An example that Mark explained using photographs of same-day improvements is to install shouldered rollers in combination in locations where overlap is being particularly present. The hands-on portion in the afternoon allowed us to see different manufacturers reels and discuss proper setup and adjustment.

Preparing the shop alongside our typical work schedule was a welcomed task by Walter and I and we were thrilled with the comradery we're hoping to expand upon with future events. If anyone would like to recommend a topic or event, please feel free to contact me. Currently we are looking into a snow removal equipment event with a couple vendors. Looking forward to what the future has in store for us as we make our way through the Holidays!



- Fully integrate the association's direct and grassroots lobbying efforts.


How are PAC funds spent?

Who can donate to the GCSAAPAC?

By law, contributions to GCSAAPAC are limited to a restricted class of donors, including:

- GCSAA corporate members. Limited to the executive and administrative staff, stockholders and their families.



- GCSAAPAC cannot accept corporate funds or donations from chapters.
- GCSAAPAC cannot accept contributions from anyone who is not a citizen of the United States.
- According to the Federal Election Commission, no person may solicit donations for GCSAAPAC on social media or in other outlets in the public domain.
- Ineligible contributions will be returned.

Letter from the Editor

Greetings and salutations, I hope you enjoyed the incredible weather we had in September and October. We were overdue for this and turf everywhere is appreciating all of the optimum temperatures.

I traveled to Kansas City for the annual Chapter Delegates meeting from October 21 to 23. I was given a list of topics to consider as talking points during the meetings. I am sharing them with you and ask you for your feedback.

Labor/Workforce

- 1. Finding staff and competing for workers continues to be a challenge.
 - a. What creative ideas have you seen golf facilities, or other businesses use to attract employees? How could those be implemented?
- 2. What can GCSAA provide members/facilities to assist members in finding employees/staff?
 - a. Is there a current program that could be expanded to assist?
- 3. What ideas do you have to get students involved?

Career Development/Resources

- 1. Many turfgrass programs at colleges, universities and technical schools are seeing a student shortage. How can GCSAA assist? How can you as an active, engaged member assist?
 - a. Has anything been tried in your area to address the issue and has it been successful?
 - b. What career services can GCSAA offer to members

Phase 2&3 BMPs

- 1. The effort to have all 50 states with a completed BMP was accomplished in 2020. Facilities are currently working on completing their facility BMP.
 - a. How can GCSAA work with facilities to complete the project?
 - b. If you have completed your facility BMP, could you share an example of why this is valuable?
- 2. The third phase of BMPs may include a validation process
 - a. Do you see this as important?
 - b. If so, what steps should be included in this process?
 - c. How can we promote this to regulatory agencies?
 - d. How can we get chapters on board?

The labor shortage is a concern for every industry. Having seasonal positions to fill is our biggest challenge at Musket. We offer no benefits, no paid leave and one of the lowest hourly wages compared to other industries. (Cannot imagine why we struggle to find and retain help). I have found that offering very flexible schedules, part time hours and time off as needed keeps enough people around to get the primary maintenance done. Afternoon work, small projects, course repairs and cleaning up around the shop are harder to accomplish without fulltime staffing.

GCSAA is asking how they can help with the labor shortage. As your delegate I am being asked to bring ideas to the board or staff. My personal opinion is to use the media to advertise we are hiring and paint a picture of the good things about working outside at a golf course. I also think that all of our partners, PGA Tour, PGA of America, USGA etc, need to do more to understand our side of the industry and how they can support us through educating golfers. I know, it sounds like a long shot but it is worth a try.

The other area of focus is the BMP program. Implementing the Best Management Practices program can be tricky if an operation is having trouble just keeping staff for basic maintenance, it will be difficult to accomplish many of the goals in the BMP program. As usual the many pieces of what we do are connected and affect each other. However, every winter season is another opportunity to plan, organize and improve the operation. Having BMP's in place at the start of the season is the best way to make improvements. Shop cleanliness goals and operational BMP's can be implemented when staff return for the season and new people begin. While you are writing your facility BMP keep in mind that you can throw out the things that you are not doing.

I want to support the GCSAA to move forward on their initiatives for the adaptation of the BMP program. I agree with a validation process and suggest an email campaign that will encourage members to take on sections of the BMP program and walk them through steps toward adapting the goals.

Please consider the GCSAA's initiatives for yourself. The end game of all of this can lead to keeping more of our tools by showing that we are willing to adapt to protect the environment, maintain safe workplaces, and be good neighbors.






