Speaker Bio: J. Rhett Evans is the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America's chief executive officer. Evans joined the GCSAA team in July 2009 as chief operating officer and was promoted to CEO in January 2011. He is the eighth CEO since the association's founding in 1926.

Evans is focused on expanding GCSAA's reach and influence to become the global leader in golf course management. Under Evans, GCSAA has elevated the superintendents' and industry's voices through advocacy efforts at the national and grassroots levels. In addition, through Evans' leadership of GCSAA and its philanthropic organization, the GCSAA Foundation, the discussion of sustainability has progressed from theory to action. GCSAA is spearheading the development of centralized best management practices at the state and facility level.

GCSAA's enhancement of the vitality of the game of golf has been

strengthened through Evans' work with allied and industry organizations. Evans was instrumental in helping establish the strategic priorities of the American Golf Industry Coalition (AGIC), a coalition of golf's leading organizations working together to communicate the game's economic, charitable and



environmental benefits to congressional leaders and local lawmakers. He served two terms as chairman of the board and is currently serving on the executive board of AGIC as well as serving on the board for the World Golf Foundation. Evans represents the association and profession on the Golf Channel, Sirius XM Radio and other national media outlets.





Letter from the Editor

Greetings and Salutations,

On October 25th I had the pleasure of visiting GCSAA Headquarters in Lawrence, Kansas for the 2022 Chapter Delegates Meeting. First thing on the schedule is a reception and then the beginning of the meeting took place in the hotel where we were also staying. There were many first-time delegates in attendance and each one of them seemed to have a good time. Throughout the events the GCSAA staff, board members and field staff maintained a high level of energy that was infectious. I really enjoyed meeting new superintendents and talking turf. Chapter Delegates Meeting Recap

80 delegates representing 84 chapters meet in person at GCSAA Headquarters and the Hilton Kansas City Airport

Delegates from the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) met in-person during a two-day event at GCSAA Headquarters in Lawrence, Kan., as well as the KCI Airport Hilton Hotel October 25-26, 2022.

The meeting brings delegates together from GCSAA's 97 chapters to discuss initiatives, provide insight on moving the association forward, and to begin discussions on electing board members and officers at the February 2023 annual meeting.

First-day highlights included updates and information from CEO Rhett Evans on "Leading Out Together." Delegates were asked to encourage participation and engagement from their staff and colleagues. A government affairs update was provided, recognizing GCSAA members and their efforts across the country. Delegates also received an update on the Conference and Trade Show. The 2023 show in Orlando will be an interactive experience, with facility learning tours, an interactive grass stage and a new Send Off Celebration to conclude activities Thursday.

Delegates met at Headquarters in Lawrence on day two. Discussion included various department leader updates, including information from the GCSAA Foundation and progress with the implementation of facility Best Management Practices.

A report on the new chapter affiliation agreement was discussed. Chapters have been asked to add an equipment manager membership classification. Adding this category at the local level allows promotion at all levels and reflects opportunities for professional development among the members.

Delegates also heard about the importance of branding, using the GCSAA affiliated chapter logo to connect the industry, working together.

A bylaws change to GCSAA's Benevolence Fund was also discussed. This change will update the Bylaws to align with current management practices within the fund.

Chapter Delegates Meeting Recap Continued

A member dues discussion also took place. GCSAA follows a dues adjustment process created in 2006 from input and approval from chapter delegates. With the recent rise of inflation, delegates were asked to consider a dues adjustment for 2023, following an adjustment in 2022. Normally, the adjustment is considered every two years. The process is tied to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and equates to smaller and more frequent adjustments in dues rather than infrequent, but larger adjustments.

This year's proposal is the following:

- 7.9% adjustment in CPI in 2022
- \$35 adjustment for A and B (\$465) and \$20 adjustment for C (\$240)
- Approval rates for dues adjustments using this process has ranged from 87% 96%

The GCSAA Board of Directors will consider delegate feedback as they discuss the proposal. Delegates are encouraged to communicate the proposed dues adjustment with their membership and provide chapter feedback to GCSAA.

The delegates offered their thoughts on a variety of industry issues during breakout sessions. Questions on labor, professional development and best management practices were of focus.

Wednesday's town hall session allowed delegates the chance to ask questions of the GCSAA Board. The interactive session focused on processes with the annual meeting and allowed further discussion on items discussed during the two-day event.

Candidate breakout sessions concluded activities. The delegates were awarded ample time to interact and ask questions of the candidates. Those running for the GCSAA Board in 2023 are:

- For President Kevin P. Breen, CGCS
- For Vice President Jeff L. White, CGCS Kevin P. Sunderman, CGCS
- For Secretary/Treasurer T.A. Barker, CGCS; Paul L. Carter, CGCS
- For Director (electing three) H. Scott Griffith, CGCS; Steven J.
 Hammon; Ryan S. Kraushofer, CGCS; Christopher A. Reverie; Jennifer L.
 Torres; Michael L. Upchurch; Richard A. Wit, CGCS

There are three two-year director positions available. Mr. Barker and Mr. Carter are both at the end of their two-year term. Whoever is not elected Secretary/Treasurer will need to run off the floor for Director.

With former vice-president Kevin Sunderman CGCS leaving Vice President post and superintendent position to become GCSAA's Chief Operating Officer, Breen will seek a 2nd term as president.

Delegates were also asked to discuss a possible bylaws change allowing immediate past president Mark F. Jordan to continue in that position for a 2nd year.

GCSAA's Annual Meeting will take place Thursday, February 9, 2023 from 9-11 a.m. at the Orlando Convention Center.

Equipment Manager Update

I must say, this was not too hateful of a summer for equipment. The majority of our rain fell during overnight hours, and we avoided long wet or drought-stricken stretches where height of cuts or roller amendments were called for. Perhaps it is just the optimism from the regained sense of normalcy, but we seem to have more comfortable weather days than years in recent memory. Most mornings included simple routines like dragging fairways, checking equipment, and ensuring our fans made it through the night.

One issue we had in particular that took up quite a bit of time diagnosing was a failure to shut-down when a warm problem occurred on a turbine blower. Sometimes it can be difficult to discern mechanical or electric characteristics when temperature is involved. Metal tolerances change as do resistance in circuits and this was quite peculiar. Ignition and fuel are both shut down in tandem when a switch is turned off on usual circuits but this machine only relied on disabling the fuel system which complicated matters. The engine would misfire and idle extremely low but not shut off when turned off after warming up.

Typical pointers aim at faulty shut-off solenoids, ignition switch, coil, carbon in the cylinder. We prefer to test rather than replace parts to save cost and frankly to know what the exact issue is for future reference. In the end it turns out the mechanical fuel pump was leaking internally, diluting the engine oil, and allowing the crankcase breather air charge to be just flammable enough to run the engine at a low idle after being warmed up and "loose". Quite an irregular cause but one I'll be sure to remember.

This Fall's education segment focused on lithium light-duty carts. We feel as though runtimes and efficiency have crossed a threshold where these tools can reliably handle transportation needs without the noise and maintenance of the gasoline powered counterpart. Andy Bonizzi from Cushman arranged for Richard Waggett, technical instructor from their Augusta headquarters, to train us on diagnosing and troubleshooting the 72 volt and lithium systems. All attendees were given handouts of diagnostic fault codes, electrical schematics, and brief procedures to begin troubleshooting. This is another great example of our vendors working with us to improve equipment reliability to keep the operation going. The more technicians know, the better we can maintain our equipment.

We are in the process of arranging a chainsaw maintenance and safety event along with an Equipment Manager's social. GCSAA testing is continuing to grow in the area and we are planning to have a testing preparation small group training event as well. 


