Turfgrass Pathology Program at the University of Maryland

The new turfgrass pathologist:

Dr. Fereshteh Shahoveisi is the Turfgrass Pathologist at the University of Maryland. She started her position on May 1st, 2022. Dr. Shahoveisi received her Bachelor's and Master of Science degrees in Plant Pathology from Tehran University and her Ph.D. in Plant Pathology from North Dakota State University (NDSU). She also was a postdoctoral researcher at NDSU and holds a College Teaching Certificate. Being a plant pathologist for more than 15 years, Dr. Shahoveisi brings unique expertise in epidemiology, statistics, genetics, and nematology to the turfgrass program at the University of Maryland. Her goal is to develop a multidisciplinary program and conduct applied and basic research projects to facilitate the sustainable management of turfgrass diseases in the area.

Evening gathering and plot walk event:

We held our plot walk event on July 20th, 2022, and presented fungicide and variety trials, and athletic field management trials. Letter from the Editor

Greetings and salutations, are we having fun yet? This summer has been quite a ride so far. I have to say that the weather has been kind to us in Myersville. We have had our tough days but compared to some of the brutal summers I have seen in the Mid-Atlantic this one ranks right in the middle for me.

What has been a challenge is staffing. I know many members can relate to this. I am forced to patch the work week together with a variety of part time workers. Some have been around for several seasons so they are able to do many jobs. This is a blessing but we have a different mix of guys on a daily basis. We have gotten use to it over the past 3 years. I have 16 employees on my payroll. This sounds like a huge crew. However some of these are weekend warriors some get in a day or two during the week and a weekend day. The payroll with the most total hours when calculated for 40 hour equivalent workers is 7.5. My low pay week calculated to be 4.5 full time equivalent workers. Musket Ridge is a \$100 course on the weekends so there is a fairly high expectation for conditions. However, I have had to make many concessions.

I follow the mantra of focusing on the greens and working my way out from there. So the greens are good. I never topdress as frequently as I want but that is not knew. From there our other full sprays are being made on tees and fairways. Primary mowing and rough mowing is fine as well. Where we are showing the lack of labor hours is everything else. Filling divots has been a challenge all season. Typically afternoon work, many of my part time staff leaves at lunch time. I have just hired a PE teacher that is more interested in practicing his golf game then the pay he gets. He will be working afternoons and weekends. In the afternoon he will be filling divots. It is amazing the difference one dedicated part time person can make when it comes to keeping up with divots. I have also started some of the older cart staff to work some days around their cart staff schedule. This is working great and I will be continuing to share employees from the cart staff and banquets in the future.

Bunker maintenance has been a challenge to say the least. I think we are getting by but we had a dedicated bunker employee in previous years. We are getting by because we just do what we can when we can. I may have a guy for 2 hours so he will work around play and get what he can. This is not ideal but it is better than nothing.

The biggest challenge this season has been keeping up with landscaping. Usually I look to landscape beds last because nobody plays golf out of them but not everybody follows this logic. We have had some overgrown beds this year believe me. I am sure there have been some guests scratching their heads wondering what is going on.

So for now we are catching up because of the students we have but we will be looking for full time seasonal help. If you know people needing work send them my way. I have said that to probably 100 people in past month.

Good luck out there.

Equipment Manager Update

Bridging the gap between Spring and Summer takes coordination between the golf course management team and the equipment shop. Usually, golf rounds and events peak before Father's Day then there is a transition to defense until aerification. Typical transitions during this period include going to smooth or less aggressive rollers on cutting units, raising the mowing height on rough mowers, and utilizing some sort of fan(s) on putting surfaces. We find it best to check radiators for buildup to avoid overheating and to remain vigilante on quality of cut as this has a direct effect on turf stress.

Our July 6th Ventrac training event at Turf Equipment and Supply had a great turnout! Shaun Blosser and other Ventrac representatives oscillated from classroom to hands on instruction throughout the day covering operation, maintenance, and repair of the versatile machine's hydraulic system and cutting unit. We feel that the educational events that focus on newer technology or equipment that is merging its way into our industry is pertinent to our success and will continue to integrate this alongside the fundamental learning opportunities as well. We're in the process of organizing a Fall event with EZGO that focuses on the Cushman lithium cart and the maintenance and diagnostics associated with using electric light duty carts.

MAAGCS Career Event at Woodmont CC Workforce Development

I think most of us would agree that people are the life blood of any operation. All the resources in the world don't mean much if you don't have a great staff to support them. For most, this is also the most difficult part of the job to satisfy. Less students are in school pursuing degrees in Turfgrass Management, making it tougher to find interns and graduates to fill management positions. What we do also isn't easy work. There are many hours spent outside in extreme conditions doing physical work. All this has made it imperative to find multiple recruiting avenues, be creative with how we staff our departments, and grow people within our organizations. We also must promote our industry to others who are unaware of the opportunities and how much fun a career in golf can be. I know I love it!

One of the many tools we have used at Woodmont Country Club is participating in the Maryland Apprenticeship Program. This allows us to extend opportunities for those who have interest in our field to learn and grow within our operation, with tools for education and promotion. This past April, with the support of the MAAGCS and Tyler Bloom, along with leadership from the Montgomery County Public Schools who focus on career opportunities for students, we were able to host an event to support this program and to educate students of opportunities in our industry. More than 40 teachers and a handful of students from Montgomery County Public Schools attended our event.

The focus of our event was to educate leaders at MCPS who focus on student apprenticeship and workbased learning opportunities, so that they may have the proper information to promote opportunities to students. After a brief introduction, participants were broken into small groups for 5 separate breakout sessions. The 5 sections were as follows:

Station 1: MAAGCS Station:

Cover MAAGCS career and job opportunities. Current job openings. MAAGCS Education and scholarship opportunities. Salaries and Pay Wages. Other Career Paths Available. Continuing education.

Station 2: BMP's/MythBusters:

Dispelling the myths that golf courses waste resources and have a negligent impact. Go over golf course environmental stewardship. Water Conservation, fertilizer, and chemicals. State and Local Regulations. MD and GCSAA BMP's.

Station 3: Technology:
