May 8-10, 2023



Letter from the Editor

Greetings and Salutations,

Congratulations, you made it to another spring and another season full of promise and opportunity. We all have experienced the last several mild winters with this past winter being more like North Carolina than winters we expect to have in the Mid-Atlantic region. However, I am not here to complain. The bentgrass at Musket Ridge went dormant as usual but started growing out of dormancy early during the warm temperatures we had in February and March. We aerated on March 27th with half inch diameter solid tines and ran the Greens King with verticutter reels over them first.

Every year we are asked to aerate as early possible so we are healed up before the regular golf season kicks in. This is the plan but the weather does not cooperate. We try to catch a good week and then we get a cold snap with freezing temperatures that halts the healing process. It never fails and we expect it. As mild as March was, the thing that affects the growth of the bentgrass is the nighttime low temperatures. March 2023 had 15 nights below freezing, mostly in the twenties. The day we were looking at was March 20th but freezing temperatures were in the forecast so we pushed it back a week. The 22nd to the 26th was beautiful so we proceeded on the 27th. The procedure worked well and the final product was good. Then we had 3 freezing nights in a row. The bent went backward instead of forward. It took a well-timed spray and three 80 degree afternoons in the second week of April to wake the bent up for good seventeen days after completing aeration.

One of the hardest things to manage with this aeration schedule is timing the Ethephon applications. I have found that Ethephon will not effect the bentgrass as much if it has not broken dormancy so I take advantage of warm days in February to knock the poa back. The trick is the timing after aeration. This year I had to let the poa bounce back a little because the bent was not breaking dormancy and healing the aeration holes. When I sprayed 3.6oz/1000 in the 80 degree weather the bent continued to thrive but seed heads became apparent at the same time. A few days later the poa receded.

It is important for a superintendent to be a team player and do the things that we are directed to do. I will keep aerating in March as long as my head doesn't roll if the greens have not healed in 5 days. Communication is key and advocating for the turf is part of our jobs. Keeping the club house staff aware of the frost and freezing temperatures is key so they see that the freezing temperatures and the greens lacking color happen simultaneously. The hardest thing about managing a daily fee golf course is the lack of time allowed for maintenance. It doesn't matter if it is a top 100 resort or Musket Ridge. The rounds are the focus and the superintendents must do what is necessary to work around play.

Equipment Manager Spring 2022

A busy Winter led to a productive Spring with our golf course operations! Mild temperatures in late February allowed us to begin cultivation practices and get some early mowing in. I prefer to get our first cuts in during these early warm ups to work out any kinks or fine adjustments. Then as usual, we experienced a cold blast in March where we can tie up any loose ends. This year's Golf Industry Show had much higher attendance and there were lots of innovative robotic and lithium products showcased. I personally am looking forward to demoing multiple items as runtime and longevity continues to improve.

Ten plus years ago the hybrid technology electric reel mowers hit the market and prevented many hydraulic leaks from happening by removing such a potent failure point of reel hoses and now all-electric equipment is becoming more common. Electric motors, steering/lift cylinders, and pumps are very efficient and quiet. There will be considerations when making entire fleet changes such as on-site backup generators and power grid capabilities, but we are certainly on our way. MAAGCS is committed to providing relevant information and education opportunities as we bridge this gap.

At the time of publication, we will have had our Spring Equipment Manager's Event. Tony Gustaitis from Golf Safety volunteered his personal time to complete a mock audit of Hampshire Green's maintenance facility. This concept mirrors an OSHA compliance visit so we can all learn what safety measures we need to consider. The information is also pertinent as the GCSAA CTEM level three attesting is heavily weighed on shop safety. A big thank you to Tony Gustaitis, Scott Fowler, and the Montgomery County Revenue Authority for making this all happen.

This Summer and Fall be on the lookout for another education event and a social as well. Networking and education makes us all more resourceful and able to handle whatever this profession throws at us.

2023 Education Seminar

It was another fantastic day at Turf Valley Resort for the our annual Education Seminar. Kicking off the day was Steve McDonald with a presentation covering a variety of pests with strategies on how to scout and control them. Christopher Fields-Johnson was up next with an in-depth presentation of soil care and irrigation, root zone reclamation and pest and disease controls. After a short break, Tyler Bloom gave a workforce development update stressing the importance of the workforce development resources we have on our website and the successes some of our members have had using those tools.
