



## New Ideal Roller Greens Mower



Mich., have just announced a new roller type putting green mower which has a number of very important features that the manufacturers claim have had a big appeal

among green-keepers where the mower has been shown in action.



A very important feature of the new Ideal Mower is the fact that it is equipped with a very small reel, same being only 4" in diameter. This reel is geared to turn up at a very high speed which produces a wonderfully smooth job of cutting and at the same time lessens cutting resistance to an extent where it is claimed that the mower pushes easier than any hand putting green mower with which it has been tried out in competitive tests.

The most careful workmanship is evident in every detail of construc-

tion and only the very best of materials are used throughout. For instance, every moving part is equipped with the very highest grade ball bearings procurable, those on the reel being adjustable to take up end play. Even the small front casters are equipped with double oilless bearings.

The grass box is of all metal construction, rigidly built and scientifically designed in combination with the deflector to handle cut grass under all conditions with maximum efficiency. To arrive at a combination satisfactory under all conditions the mower was tested in long grass, short grass, in grass that was dry, and grass that was soaked with dew and rain.

The mower is of an 18 in. cut and can be adjusted in height from 3/16 in. to 1 in. The reel revolves at a speed to give a frequency of 7/16 in. between cuts, leaving all mowed areas in a velvety, smooth condition. A carrier is also provided, having rubber tired disc wheels and being equipped with ball' bearings.

to the tile and requires no tying or wiring.

Ric-Wil tape is water-proof and durable and is made in various widths adaptable to other uses. It may be used to place lengthwise of trench, between broken stone and backfill to keep the stone clear for flow of water. It is also invaluable where pockets of quicksand are encountered in digging trenches. It is also used as a blanket separating gravel and sand in sludge bed bottoms.

The special water-proofing of this tape makes it practically permanent even under constantly wet conditions. And its ease of application in most cases makes it more economical than other materials.

Greenkeepers who have trouble with drainage especially in bunkers were very much interested in this Ric-Wil tape and Mr. Howden was kept busy explaining what it was and how to use it. He had samples of drain tile with the tape around the joint proving its practicability beyond a doubt.

### Hal Billig, Chicago

THE feature of this exhibit was the MacGregor Compost Distributor which has been used successfully on many of the best golf courses in the United States.

with gang labor, to distribute the compost or topdressing more evenly on the greens and to economize this important operation. It is claimed on the average golf course the Mac-Gregor Distributor will pay for itself in four months because it does the work four times faster and bet-

The MacGregor company also makes a compost brush mounted on a light two-wheeled carriage which helps to stimulate the turf and to bring up weeds and bent stolon runners so that the green when cut is even and smooth. Mr. Billig himself was in personal charge of this exhibit and received a fine reception from the greenkeepers.

#### U. S. G. A. Green Section

NE of the most interesting exhibits at the Show was that of the U. S. G. A. Green Section in charge of John Monteith, Jr. Mr. Monteith brought from Washington soil samples taken from the Arlington nurseries representing the soils usually found in different parts of the United States. He also had specimens of insects, such as grubs and beetles in different stages of growth and he had a microscope for inspecting these insects in magnified form.

He also showed specimens of grass infected with brown patch showing how this fungus eats away the blades and he also had mounted specimens of the different kinds of turf grasses and weeds showing root and stem in plain relief on white cardboard.

This exhibit was intensely educational and attracted close attention of the greenkeepers, all of whom are interested in the technical work which the Green Section is doing for golf clubs. This is the first exhibit that the U. S. G. A. Green Section has ever made and was prepared especially for the Greenkeepers' Show at Buffalo.
