

Recommends Standardized Turf

By JOHN MACGREGER, Greenkeeper, Chicago Golf Club

URING my career as a greenkeeper, and having at various times been called upon to prepare my own course for Tournament, both State and International, and in official capacity as Vice President of the N. A. G. A., my attention has, on various occasions been called to the fact, that a good deal of complaint is made relative to the condition of grasses on a golf course, especially on putting greens. Believing that a number of criticisms rendered are of a constructive nature, yet I am mindful of the fact that these criticisms often cause the greenkeeper to be criticised unjustly.

I believe that the time is fast approaching when the U.S.G.A. will realize that in order to have uniform and regulated turf, especially on putting greens during tournament play, they will outline a standard texture of grass. Inasmuch as all clubs given the honor of holding National tourna-

ments are given two to three years notice, this should create no great hardship of expense to the club, and it would have a great tendency to prohibit among tournament players, unjust criticism which often reflects on a course holding a National tournament.

I would offer a suggestion, that the U.S.G. A., through its Green Section appoint a committee of three and that the N. A. G. A. also appoint a committee of three thoroughly competent greenkeepers to work together and decide on the proper grass to be used on putting greens for the future, during tournament play.

This book is encouraging and informative to the prospective home owner and to those who already have homes with lawns. It does not dwell upon the most expensive methods in lawn building or culture, nor does it make the reader feel that his lawn is poor and impossible to improve without considerable cost




