



FREE BALL MARK REPAIR TOOLS PROVIDED AT CHARLES SCHWAB CUP CHAMPIONSHIP

The Golf Course Superintendents Association of Northern California (GCSANC) distributed free ball mark repair tools at the Charles Schwab Cup Championship at Sonoma Golf Club. The championship, won by Jim Thorpe, featured the top 30 money winners on the Champions Tour, plus Jay Hass and Loren Roberts battling it out for the million-dollar Schwab annuity. Ball mark repair tool distribution took place at the Play Golf America booth from October 26 through October 29, 2006.

"In addition to seeing some spectacular golf, attendees were able to stop by the Play Golf America booth for a free repair tool and quickly learn how to properly fix a ball mark," states GCSANC program chairman Chris Mains. "Just as folks seek tips on how to improve their golf game, the superintendents want to share quick tips on proper ball mark repair which will help improve putting surfaces as well as on-course playing experiences for golfers."

In addition to the booth at the Charles Schwab Cup Championship, ball mark repair tools were distributed at Welcome to Golf Day, Play Golf America Day and during Women's Golf Week.

CALIFORNIA HONORS SEVEN WHO WORK FOR A BETTER ENVIRONMENT

The California Department of Pesticide Regulation honored seven diverse groups - from a top-ranked golf course in Placer County to a pair of Fresno advisors who assist immigrant farmers--for their work to sustain California's environment.

DPR presented its IPM Innovator Awards today at the California Environmental Protection Agency headquarters. IPM -- integrated pest management--promotes natural pest solutions to build a healthier environment that sustains itself with less chemical intervention.

"These Innovators are an eclectic group, but they share one important characteristic," said DPR Director Mary-Ann Warmerdam. "Each award winner has created an enduring partnership with nature -- not just to co-exist, but to contribute to a sustainable environment and economy. And each one of these recipients is building on the success of our previous IPM Innovators."

DPR's IPM Innovator program has recognized nearly 100 individuals and organizations since 1994. They represent a range of business and community interests, including farms and other businesses, community groups, schools, and advocacy organizations. Most importantly, all have actively shared their successful ideas with others.






