Penneagle is a new seeded creeping bentgrass developed from a program beginning with 156 vegetatively propagated bents, then paired to 21. These were turf-tested in combinations of three for crossing for turf performance. In addition, component testing was carried out in seven states.

The end result was a four-parent variety, giving Penneagle a broad genetic base to perform under various climatic conditions. More than a ton of Penneagle seed has been distributed for testing in the United States and Canada prior to its formal release by Pennsylvania State University.

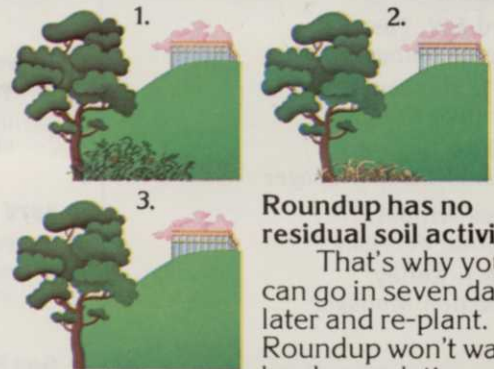

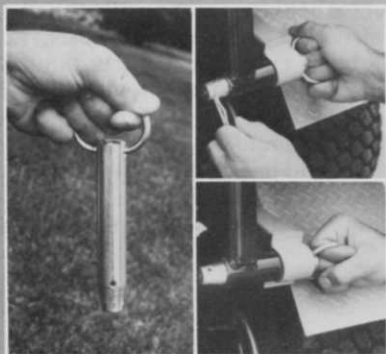

RECLAMATION

ALCA eyes prospects

About 100 ALCA members attending the group's revegetation and erosion control symposium August 1-3 in Denver were told to look to small coal companies, the Texas Department of Transportation and other government agencies for future revegetation work.

Jim Brown from North American Coal Corp. Bismarck, N.C. office told the contractors that their biggest source of potential business is coal companies without reclamation staffs. "They may set up consortiums to get the work done more cheaply. But they must have it to survive," Brown said.

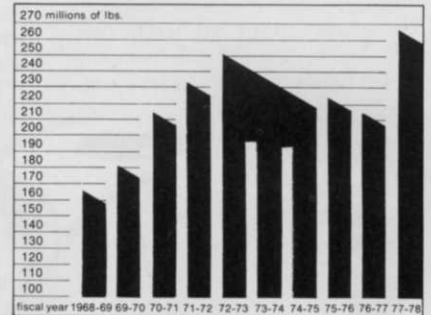
Texas will continue its road programs in the next few years, and Paul Northcut from the Department of Transportation promised work for

contractors during that time. "Most of the highway districts are understaffed, so the percentage of landscape contracting will increase substantially in the next few years. I suspect it will increase 100 percent at least in the next five years," Northcut said.

Jim Lincoln, of Southwest Hydro-Mulchers Distributing Co. in Dallas, Texas, also reminded members to look for work at various government agencies.

He suggested the U.S. Forest Service, the Army Corps of Engineers, U.S. Soil Conservation Service, local flood control districts and river and port authorities.

The show was capped by an exhibit in the Marriott Hotel and a field trip to revegetated areas in the Rocky Mountains.



Ryegrass seed hit record levels for the 1977-78 fiscal year according to the Oregon Ryegrass Commission. The record crop for both annual and perennial ryegrass was due in part to increased demand for ryegrass seed brought about by introduction of new ryegrass cultivars. The record of 268 million lbs. upsets the previous 1972-73 record of 251 million lbs.

PESTICIDES

Experimental sprayer avoids handling risks

A system to eliminate dangerous pesticide handling is being developed by agricultural engineer Donald L. Reichard and technicians D. L. Collins and P. T. Keck, stationed at the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center (OARDC).

"On our sprayer, all liquid flows are controlled from the control panel by the operator," Reichard says. "Metering pumps draw the chemicals from their containers, at rates proportional to travel speed, and mix them with water in a small mixing chamber on the way to the sprayer nozzles."

As well as eliminating the pouring operations, the system also does away with disposal of left-over tank mixtures. And the operator can flush the containers from the control panel, Reichard adds.

The sprayer development is only

part of the scientists' overall federal research effort to improve the efficiency and safety of chemical pesticide application equipment.

NURSERY

IRS offers chance to switch accounting

A recently issued policy by the Internal Revenue Service provides nurserymen with one chance to switch from accrual to cash accounting to solve a problem with inventory taxes.

Previously, the nurserymen had been grouped with farmers in a ruling which requires farmers doing less than \$1 million per year to use accrual accounting for crop inventory.

The opportunity to switch to cash accounting is a one-time offer which must be filed for the first taxable year beginning on or after Jan. 1, 1978.

RECLAMATION

Prairie hay mulches also provide seed

Prairie hay is showing promise as a mulch for revegetation of strip mined lands, according to range scientist Ronald E. Ries. The hay could be a feasible alternative now that Public Law 9587, passed in 1977, requires mulching as part of the reclamation effort.

Dr. Ries, stationed at USDA's Northern Great Plains Research Center in Mandan, ND, harvested prairie hay at five monthly intervals, beginning June 1, and applied the hay as a mulch to seed flats in the greenhouse at a rate equal to 3000 pounds per acre. The flats contained topsoil similar to that normally returned to strip mined areas.

Hay harvested October 1 contained the most viable seed, Ries said, and the most common seedling was the native perennial broadleaf herb, cutleaf goldenweed.

Subcontractor is liable for site safety

If a subcontractor does not protest safety violations to the contractor, he can be held responsible for those violations by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, according to a recent ruling by OSHA's Review Commission. The Association of Landscape Contractors recommends that subcontracting landscape contractors complain in writing to the contractor whether or not the safety violations are serious ones.

ALCA to establish student chapters

Student organizations at accredited two- and four-year colleges with a curriculum in landscape contracting or related horticultural field may affiliate with ALCA according to a recent ruling by the ALCA Board of Directors. The group must have an advisor who is an affiliate member of ALCA and contain four or more students. Dues will be set by the Board of Directors.

Southern California turf expo approaches

One of the largest turfgrass and landscape shows in the Southwest is coming up Oct. 18, the Southern California Turfgrass/Landscape Equipment and Materials Educational Exposition in Costa Mesa, California. More than 4,000 landscape contractors, golf course superintendents, nurserymen, and other grounds managers are expected each day at the two-day show.

The exposition was started in 1960 to combine numerous industry events into one centralized show with exhibits and educational sessions. Interested persons should contact the Southern California Turfgrass Council at 213-798-1715.

Conwed opens new fiber mulch plant

Hickory, North Carolina will be the site of a new wood fiber mulch plant to produce Conwed Hydro Mulch products used in hydraulic mulching for turf establishment. Construction is scheduled to begin in mid-1978 with production beginning in early 1979.

Demand for Conwed's Hydro Mulch product has reached the point where production at the Cloquet, MN facility is nearing capacity, according to F. T. Weyerhaeuser, president. The North Carolina site was selected to meet the increasing demand and to better serve the growing market in the eastern United States.

Mississippi degree attracts out-of-staters

Nearly a third of the students in the Mississippi State University Landscape Contracting Program are from out of state says program advisor Robert A. Callaway. A fourth come from outside the South he adds.

MSU offers a four-year program which includes on-the-job time, agricultural mechanics, botany, land surveying, soils, basic drawing, design, architectural graphics, plant materials, accounting, business law, landscape construction, and finance.

Callaway says the demand for graduates exceeds the supply. The contracting program is a part of the landscape architecture department at MSU. Persons interested in the program should contact Callaway at P.O. Drawer MQ, Mississippi State, MS 39762.

AQUATIC WEEDS

"Natural" herbicide may be possible

Government and university scientists are going to study the toxic compounds released by spikerush, an aquatic weed sometimes used to control larger, more troublesome weeds growing in irrigation canals. If the joint project of the University of California, Davis, and the USDA is successful, development of a "natural" aquatic herbicide may be possible.

Scientists will try to isolate, identify, and synthesize the toxic compounds produced by spikerush, under a one-year \$35,000 cooperative agreement.

The project is under the direction of Floyd M. Ashton, plant physiologist at U.C., Davis. Peter A. Frank, Science and Education Administration plant physiologist, will coordinate the studies for the USDA.

HORTICULTURE

Solar energy, rocks to heat greenhouses

Scientists at the North Carolina Agricultural Experiment Station, under a cooperative agreement with the USDA, will develop a rock-bed heat storage system they hope will eventually supply as much as 50 percent of the heat needs of greenhouses.

The rock-bed will store excess heat from the sun-heated greenhouse that will then be available for use at night or during cloudy weather to maintain a desirable temperature for plants in the greenhouse.

The one-year \$32,455 project is being funded by the Department of Energy, administered by USDA's Science and Education Administration, and is part of government efforts to conserve fossil fuels by finding ways to use solar energy. D. H. Willits will be the principal investigator.

Texas A&M, Toro to study water use

A contribution to Texas A & M University by the Toro Company will help finance a four-year study of water use rates for turf-grasses. The work will be directed by Dr. James Beard and was conceived by graduate student Don Johns.

The purpose of the study is to improve water irrigation efficiency and to help identify water requirements of certain turfgrass cultivars.

Arborists report growth in volume

Despite bad spring weather, arborists are reporting growth in business volume this year. A survey conducted by the National Arborist Association revealed that more than 75 percent of arborists are experiencing increased volume in tree spraying, trimming and general tree care.

However, arborists indicated a reduction or no increase in landscaping work. Only Midwest arborists said they experienced an increase in landscaping work for the first half of 1978.

The arborists expect the remainder of the year to produce excellent sales.

Funds appropriated for chestnut blight

Funding proposed by Sen. Robert Byrd (D) of West Virginia has been appropriated for research on a possible solution to chestnut blight at the Northeast Forest Experiment Station in Morgantown, W.Va.

The research to be performed by West Virginia University and Virginia Polytechnic Institute researchers centers around a strain of the chestnut blight and a phenomenon called hypovirulence. Strains of the disease can actually heal chestnut blight cankers. The object is to isolate this strain and produce it for use against the blight.

Options sought for disposal regulations

Triple rinsing as a label requirement is one option to proposed pesticide container disposal regulations termed not enforceable by EPA's Office of General Counsel.

The lawyers said FIFRA is a labeling act and enforcement is legal only in cases of label violations. Current proposed regulations do not involve specific labeling instructions and therefore would be not enforceable nor would they mean criminal penalty. Pesticide suppliers may be asked to implement recycling programs under options being considered by EPA.

Conference Committee agrees on state primacy

The House-Senate Conference Committee reviewing FIFRA amendments agreed that states with approved plans will be the primary enforcers of FIFRA. The committee also defined pest control operators as commercial applicators and not distributors subject to warrantless inspection and stiffer penalties.

Thirty states have approved pesticide use plans and therefore will come under the primacy rule if the amendments are approved by the House and Senate and signed by the President. States without approved plans will be subject to Federal enforcement. A condition permits Federal intervention in the case of emergencies.

Inconsistent use exceptions settled

The House-Senate Conference Committee has reached an agreement on proposed FIFRA legislation regarding use inconsistent with the label. If passed by House and Senate and signed by the President, the exceptions will be:

- using a pesticide at less than label concentration
- mixing pesticides with fertilizer if not specifically prohibited by the label
- applying a pesticide for a target pest not listed on the label providing the application is to a labelled crop, animal or site and the label does not specifically prohibit use against that target pest
- using a method of application not listed on the label.

Cloture fails again, labor bill delayed

The controversial, pro-union Labor Reform Bill will not be passed this year because an effective filibuster and failure to invoke cloture have made a final vote impossible.

OSHA permits access to safety records

Rules have been revised by OSHA permitting worker access to the employer's log of job-related injuries and illnesses. All employers with 11 or more employees must maintain such records under law.

McMicken has won the Top Volume award for his company four times, putting him at the top of all U.S. Jacobsen distributors. He has been active in many turf-oriented projects in Southern California and in Hawaii. Assistance to young turf students is a favorite endeavor.

"We are fortunate in having a man of Ray's caliber join us in our efforts to develop trained leaders for the future," said Dr. Grau.

UNIVERSITIES USE SHREDDERS FOR RENOVATION AND COMPOSTING

Grounds maintenance at a university, particularly a large state university, requires mechanization — a considerable number of vehicles and other equipment. Tractors, loaders, mowers, spreaders, dozers, sprayers, scrapers, chippers. You wouldn't think, however, that a university would have use for a high capacity soil shredder. But several large universities have found ways to keep shredders busy and cut maintenance costs at the same time.

Two such schools are Penn State University and Georgia Institute of Technology, better known as Georgia Tech. Both are using shredders to reduce labor costs and improve the quality of grounds maintenance. Penn State has two shredders. One is used by the Joseph Valentine Turfgrass Research Center to prepare soil mixes for turfgrass experiments. The other shredder is used by the university's Landscape Operations department for a variety of construction and maintenance projects requiring clean, homogeneous soil mixes. Georgia Tech's principal use for its shredder is to convert composted leaves into "free" humus that's used for various purposes on campus grounds.

Penn State Turf Research Center

There were few turfgrass schools in the nation in 1928 when Joseph Valentine, superintendent at Merion Golf Club in suburban Philadelphia, traveled to Penn State to ask for the same kind of support and help for turfgrass problems that farm research was getting from the school. He apparently was a good salesman because a turfgrass program was started the following year. Through Joseph Valentine's continuing efforts, the school was sup-

ported through the difficult years of the Depression by state appropriations for turf research.

In 1932, the school started the academic phase of turfgrass management by accepting the first students. Then, in 1967, Penn State officially named the turfgrass facilities the Joseph Valentine Turfgrass Research Center. Today, Penn State's Turfgrass Center in University Park is part of the Department of Agronomy and provides teaching and research programs on turf breeding, management, physiology, fertilization, soil physics, and weed control. Disease studies are done in cooperation with the Department of Plant Pathology.

Dr. Joseph Duich has headed the program at the Valentine Center since 1959. "A good proportion of students in our turf program are here because they want to be golf course superintendents," Duich says. "We try to teach them the basics they need to know to do that job well. Our studies dwell on the different types of grasses, soil chemistry, and soil physics, particularly from the point of modifying soils to achieve certain ends. We also stress disease and insect control."

At this time, the Valentine Turfgrass Center has approximately 110,000 square feet of close cut turfgrass devoted to its experimental bentgrass research program. Most of it is cut to putting green height because a large part of the school's current program involves putting greens research. Because the turfgrass research area isn't that large, its use must be managed wisely. After an experiment is completed, the area must be reconditioned quickly to make it suitable for the next round of experiments.

Reconditioning is necessary because of the nature of the experimental work. Fertilizer experiments, for example, might run continuously for four or five years. After the research, the area is checkered with hundreds of 6 by 16 ft. plots, all with different fertilizer and pH levels. To put the plots back into condition for more research, the entire area has to be dug up and all of the soil shredded and aerated.

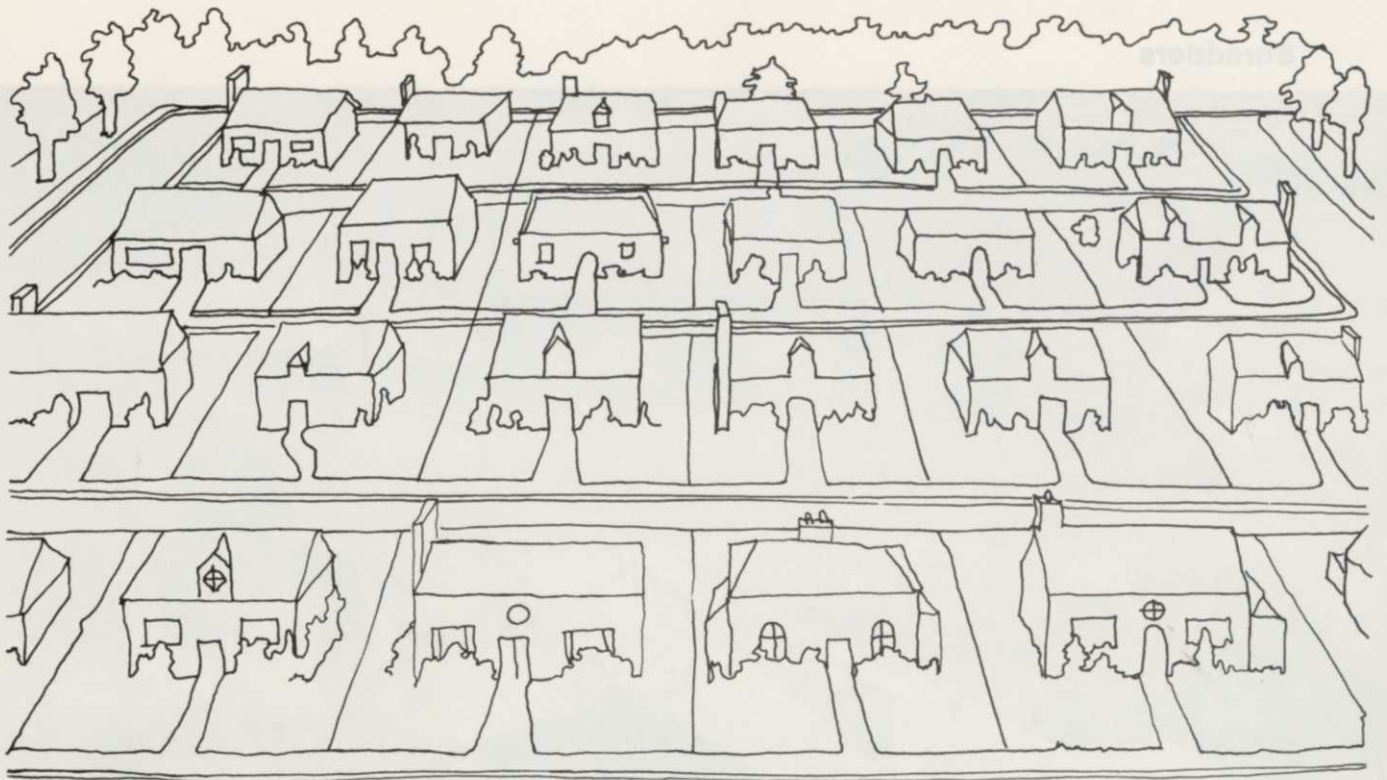
The Valentine Center attacks this reconditioning by first rotovating the entire area to a depth of approximately six inches. Then loaders push the loosened soil into large piles. Next, the loaders dump the soil into a shredder for processing — shredding, mixing, separating non-shreddable material, and aerating. Because superfine soil mixes are needed for the reconditioning, the processed soil goes directly from the shredder into a powered screen. What the Turf Center ends up with is a homogenous soil mix from which nearly all stones have been removed. This results in an ideal base for turf research.

"We recently reconditioned about half our bentgrass research area," says Duich. "The soil

from a 50,000 square foot plot containing 243 different mixtures was shredded, aerated and screened so that it was all uniform to a depth of 12 inches. We wanted the soil to be as similar as possible to the modified soils found on most golf tees and greens. Because the shredder made the work so easy, we were even able to process a large supply of the same soil and set it aside in a protected bin for topdressing the turf later in the experiment. The research requires that the topdressing be exactly the same as the soil base."

Because so many new homes are built on plots from which all topsoil has been removed, Penn State is also getting involved in research on growing turf on subsoil. Many new homeowners try to establish high fertility grasses on such soils and the grasses don't do well. For that reason, the school is continually involved in research to develop low-maintenance grasses that can tolerate less than ideal conditions. In these homeowner turf programs, soil reconditioning follows the same soil processing procedures used for other plots in order to have uniform soil for research.

Penn State's turfgrass research programs have already paid off with the development of Pennlawn, Pennfine and Penncross grasses, soil modification procedures, and various management aids.

Shredding, mixing, cleaning, and aerating soil without harming its mechanical properties is vital to turf research. "We prefer a belt-type shredder to a hammermill because it does not pulverize the

soil," Duich says. "If the soil is dry, a hammermill can destroy the mechanical properties by turning it to dust. By the same token, we purchase fibrous peat to mix with topsoil to construct new plots. We use fibrous peat precisely because it is so structured. If we try to mix fibrous peat and topsoil with a hammermill, it would pulverize the peat and reduce its effectiveness."

Methods to produce modified soil mixes for construction or renovation of golf tees and greens are stressed in the turfgrass program's curriculum. "No longer do we spread topsoil over a green and plant grass," says Duich. "We teach our students to analyze their situation and then mix the proper soil to suit the particular conditions. They can see how easily we do this work here on campus with a soil shredder, and I'm sure they will make use of shredders when they are called on to renovate areas under their responsibility."

Campus Maintenance

The main campus of Penn State is situated on a 4936-acre tract of land in the geographic center of Pennsylvania. Approximately 540 intensely landscaped acres of this tract make up the central campus. Streets, athletic fields and landscaped areas are maintained by the University's Landscape Operations. Penn State's Landscape Operations uses a shredder for a wide variety of jobs. According to Dave Rice, who heads up Landscape Operations, "The shredder is in operation approximately 50 to 60 days per year."

On a campus as large as Penn State's, there is usually a building under construction or a utility ditch being dug. Normally, whenever a trench is opened, the soil is stored off-site while the work is in progress. Once the work is completed, a final layer of shredded and cleaned topsoil is spread over the dug up area. This saves the time-consuming labor required to rake out stones prior to re-planting grass.

Landscape Operations also uses the shredder to convert composted leaves to a beneficial leafmold humus for its flower beds and for mixing 2/1/1 with topsoil and sand for topdressing. Leaves are usually stored for approximately 3 to 5 years and then shredded.

Clay and sand for topdressing baseball fields are also processed by the shredder. The sand often has large rocks in it that must be removed and the shredder both cleans and mixes the dressing to the correct consistency.

The school's greenhouses and mushroom growing operations often call on Landscape Operations to provide clean soil mixes for their needs. This replaces a time-consuming hand screening operation used previously to get suitable growing media.

"The shredder has spoiled many of our people," says Rice. "Since they have experienced working with shredded and mixed soils, they don't want to put up with the stones and lumps in unprocessed soils. When they have a certain job to do, like reseeding a turf area, they want the soil processed so that all that has to be done is to put the soil down and level it."

Maintenance on the school's athletic fields keeps the shredder busy cleaning soil. Hundreds of tons of topsoil are processed each year just for this purpose. By not purchasing processed topsoil, Landscape Operations saves the University an estimated \$35/cubic yard.

Georgia Tech

David K. Walker, Jr., is the staff horticulturist at Georgia Tech. Through his efforts, recycling programs have been started that aid the City of Atlanta and also benefit the school by reducing reliance on purchased mulches and soil amendments.

Walker believes that grounds maintenance people have to switch their thinking about some things. "We've got resources around us, like leaves and tree trimmings, but it's up to us to turn them into something useful, says Walker. "I've based my leaf and wood chip recycling programs on putting to good use what we used to pay to get rid of."

"Up to now," Walker says, "the easiest answer to a trash situation was to say, 'Let's throw it away.' That was the cheapest way to dispose of it. Then we began to realize that grass clippings, leaves and wood chips have nutrients and other qualities that can be beneficial to our grounds maintenance operations. It began to dawn on us that we were disposing of certain materials and then turning around and purchasing materials that were similar."

Georgia Tech's downtown Atlanta campus occupies 350 acres, or about 10 square blocks. Fine residential properties and businesses surround the school and keeping the grounds attractive is an important job.

Atlanta has a wealth of trees, with oaks and elms predominant. The annual leaf fall used to be trucked by city crews to landfill sites 10 or 20 miles from their pickup points. That was until Georgia Tech's Walker contacted city officials and told them he'd be happy to provide a free, close-by dumping place for a large portion of Atlanta's leaves.

Walker had recognized the value of leaf compost to the school's grounds maintenance operation and knew that he needed more leaves than accumulated on campus each year. With buildings and parking lots occupying a large proportion of the school's property, Georgia Tech's own leaf collection operation is not a big one. The school's vacuum sweeper and street sweeper collect about 300 cubic yards each fall. The city, however, more than makes up for the school's lack of leaves. Each fall city crews deliver about 1500 cubic yards of compacted leaves to the school's leaf composting area.

Georgia Tech's present leaf composting area occupies a 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ -acre lot that someday will serve as a building site. It is well drained so that stagnant water never causes undesirable odors or mosquito problems.

"We employ a lazy man's approach to composting," says Walker. "Unlike some composting operations which windrow leaves and turn them regularly to speed decomposition, we turn the leaves only once. We do it about a month to six weeks after they are delivered. At that time, our people use a front-end loader or a bulldozer to lift and tumble the leaves and mix in a little of our good red Georgia clay. The leaves are left in a big pile until we need them. If the leaves sit there two years before we get around to shredding them, there's no problem. We simply work off the oldest part of the pile where the leaves are the most decomposed."

"We had to go through a learning cycle with our leaf composting program," says Walker. "We knew we had to shred the compost to get it to a particle size suitable for mulch, for mixing with top soil for lawn renovation, and for potting plants in our greenhouse operation. We tried to find the smallest and cheapest unit that could do the job. However, the 5 hp shredder we bought didn't have the capacity we needed. We now have a 18 hp shredder that handles up to 25 cubic yards per hour. Running it for a full work day gives us 200 cubic yards of material, a worthwhile amount to work with."

Georgia Tech's shredding crew consists of three men. One operates the front-end loader which feeds the composted leaves into the shredder's hopper. Another is positioned on the operating bridge of the shredder to watch over the operation of the machine and to keep the material falling freely onto the belt. The third man works on the

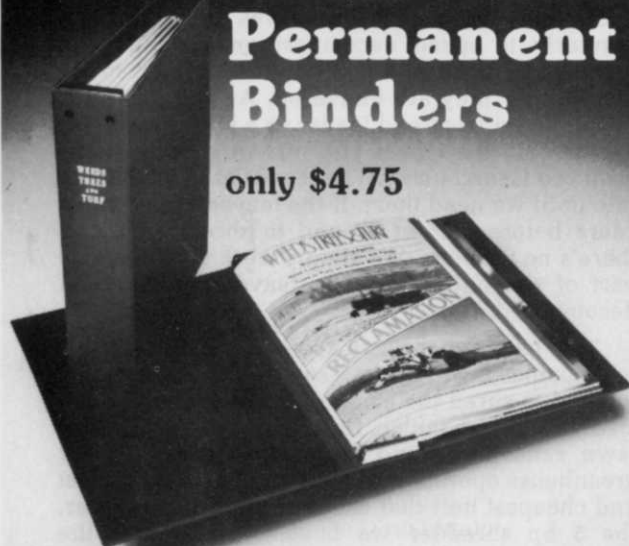

ground and tries to keep large debris such as tree limbs and construction materials out of the way. The shredder processes the composted leaves and discharges the finished product directly into a dump truck. Since the composting area does not permit on-site storage of equipment, the crew tows the shredder back to the garage after they are finished for the day.

"You have to consider the economics of what we're doing," says Walker. "We get the leaves free. We save both the school and the city money because there are no hauling and dumping fees charged. We also save on labor, fuel, and wear and tear on our trucks since they don't have to travel to dumps.

"We shred the leaves when we need them, mostly during the late spring and summer months. I estimate we have a stockpile of about 2,000 cubic yards of compost on site. At the going rate of \$7 per cubic yard for equivalent material, we own \$14,000 worth of material. These numbers are very attractive to our operation. So far, we haven't had to buy any topsoil since we began our composting program. Previously, we purchased up to 4000 bales per year of pine straw and other materials."

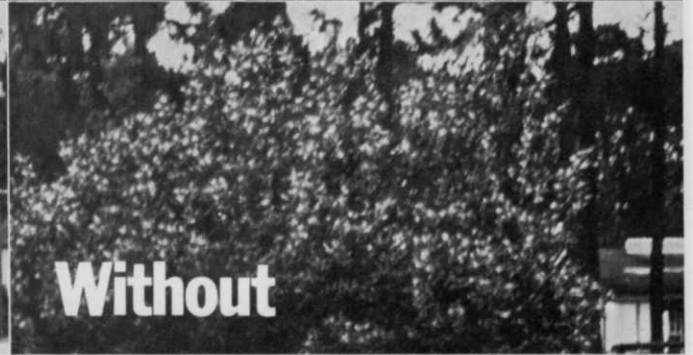
For mulching around shrubbery and flower beds, Georgia Tech's grounds crew applies a four-to-six-inch layer of wood chips and the leaves which drop to the ground each year are allowed to remain in place as extra compost. The chips are acquired in the same way the leaves are. The school has provided an all-weather free dumping area for local landscapers and tree surgeons to dump their chips. Almost 30,000 cubic yards of chips have been given to the school since 1971.

As part of a current research project, Walker is dumping leaves directly on a wide highway median strip to study how this affects renaturalization. He hopes the study will yield results on new ways to stabilize soil in problem areas. Other benefits anticipated are: reduced labor costs for maintenance; elimination of leaf blowing by passing traffic; increased moisture retention for shrubbery and trees, and regeneration of a natural flora from seeds brought in with the dumped leaves. The leaves are spread to a variable thickness ranging from 6 to 12 inches and are allowed to settle by natural means (wind shift and rain). Some portions of the median have been covered with a two-to-three-inch layer of wood chips to minimize the chance of fire during hot, dry weather.

A recent project called for shredding of 300 cubic yards of compost to be incorporated into the soil for a new four-acre athletic field. The availability of shredded compost eliminated the need to buy peat moss. Walker estimates that nearly one-quarter of the shredder's cost was amortized by this single project.

The success of Walker's composting program has been recognized by the Georgia Chapter of the American Soil Conservation Society, which recently gave the school its Merit Award. If imitation is the sincerest form of flattery, then the city of Atlanta thinks the program is a good one, too. The city has begun its own composting operation and is using the finished material in its parks. **WTT**

FIXED SOD COST DECREASES AS MARYLAND FARM SIZE RISES

This article discusses fixed and variable costs and returns by size of farm for producing unharvested turfgrass in Maryland in 1976.² A previous article detailed the importance of the commercial sod industry in Maryland. In 1976, the industry was composed of 63 growers who produced 8,712 acres of turfgrass. Of this acreage, an estimated 2,497 acres were sold for \$5.4 million at the farm level.

Total cost estimates derived from conducting interviews with Maryland turfgrass producers were divided into categories of variable and fixed costs. Variable costs refer to all expenses that are a function of output and are incurred only if production is carried on. Fixed costs refer to those expenses incurred for employing fixed resources.

Variable expenditures for the production of turfgrass included seed, fertilizer, top-dress fertilizer, herbicides, lime, fuel and oil, production labor (labor used in field operations) and interest on variable capital (calculated at 8.25 percent). These variable costs of production for the various sizes of turfgrass farms are presented in Table 1.

The largest expenditure for any item of average variable cost for all growers was for top-dress fertilizer. This was followed closely by the expenditure for seed (Table 1). Producers were willing to spend these amounts for seed and fertilizer to promote a good stand of quality turfgrass. Individual costs for seed and top-dressing requirements were 22 and 24 percent, respectively, of total variable cost for the all growers category.

The next most important expense item of average variable cost was for production labor. Expenditures for production labor were based on labor requirements and hourly wages used in performing various typical cultural practices.

Table 2 shows that total labor requirements decreased as farm size increased to 300 acres then increased for farms with more than 300 acres. However, production labor cost economies were offset by an increasing average hourly wage paid as farm size increased. Wage rates ranged from \$2.88 per hour on the smallest farms to \$3.67 per hour on the largest farms, or a 27 percent increase. This increasing average wage rate caused average production labor expenditures to vary little for all farm sizes except farms with 151-300 acres. Pro-

ducers in this category reported an average production labor cost of \$45.44 per acre while other categories averaged around \$60.00 per acre. The large decrease in production labor to 14.22 hours accounted for the lower labor cost for this size group (Table 2). Too, these 14.22 hours required for production labor were 35 percent less than the highest reported figure found on farms with less than 100 acres and 27 percent less than the state average.

Variable input cost requirements (seed, fertilizer, top-dressing fertilizer, herbicides, lime and

interest on variable capital) ranged from a high of \$354.48 per acre on farms with more than 300 acres

to a low of \$301.75 per acre on farms with 151-300 acres (Table 1). The largest farms were charac-

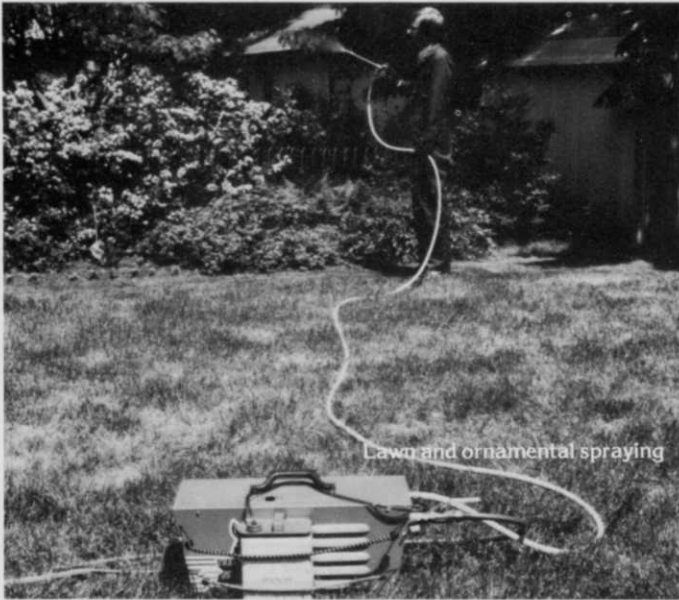

terized as spending above or near average per acre costs for seed, fertilizer, top-dressing fertilizer and production labor. The use of these inputs at or above average cost was not a function of farm size, rather a function of production management decisions. The more intensive applications of production inputs were an effort to insure adequate growth, appearance and quality of the grass which would ultimately help in the marketing and sale of the product.

Fixed costs incurred in the production of sod over a two-year production period are reported in Table 3. The calculated annual fixed cost for all machinery and equipment was based on an assumed life of the asset of eight years with 20 percent salvage value. The average fixed cost per acre for buildings and permanent structures assumed a 20 year life and zero salvage value. The resulting annual cost for depreciation, repairs and insurance was calculated at 15.6 percent of the value of the machinery and equipment complements and seven percent of the new value for permanent structures.⁴ Interest on fixed capital was charged at an annual rate of 8.5 percent of the average value for fixed investments. A land rental rate of \$70 per acre (\$35.00 per year) was used as the opportunity cost of land for sod production.

The cost of supervisory labor (other than required for field operations) increased per acre as farm size increased, except for the 100-150 acre farm size category which was nearly equal to that reported for the less than 100 acre category (Table 3). Costs for these services ranged from \$6.70 per acre for farms with 100-150 acres to \$26.05 per acre for farms with more than 300 acres. Producers on the larger farms generally spent more time for travel to the fields, hired more supervisory labor and spent more time finding and negotiating sales.

Table 3 shows that average fixed cost per acre decreased as average size of farm increased up to the farm size of greater than 300 acres. Fixed costs attributed to machinery and equipment, permanent structures and interest on fixed capital decreased per acre as farm size increased for all farm sizes. Since the land rental rate was assumed to be constant for all farm sizes, and real estate tax over the two-year period was reported to be nearly equal for all farm sizes, the increase in the total fixed cost per acre on farms of greater than 300 acres can be traced to increasing supervisory labor costs as farm size increased. Again, the higher supervisory cost is explained by time being spent in supervising a large number of employees and managing the intensive cultural practices, while also spending time in transacting sales for the extra volume of output on the largest turfgrass farms.

To summarize, an examination of the average total cost items shown in Table 4 reveals there are four areas which affected the total cost structure for the various farm sizes:

1. Average fixed cost per acre for machinery, equipment and permanent structures decreased as farm size increased for all farm sizes.

2. Costs of supervisory services increased per acre as farm size increased except for the 100-150 acre farm size category where the cost was nearly equal to that reported for the less than 100 acre size

category.

3. Average variable cost decreased through the three smallest farm size groups but increased to its highest level on the largest farms.

4. Hourly wages paid, according to farm size, increased as farm size increased, virtually offsetting any dollar savings from lower per acre labor requirements on the larger farms.

Gross receipts per acre for mixtures of Kentucky bluegrasses and Red Fescue or Kentucky-31 Tall Fescue and Kentucky bluegrass sold on an unharvested basis for an average of \$657.09 per acre in 1976 (Table 5). The receipts ranged from a low of \$611.36 per acre on farms with less than 100 acres to a high of \$734.50 per acre on farms with 100-150 acres.

Return to management (gross receipts minus expenses) from the sale of turfgrass sold on an unharvested basis for various farm sizes is also reported in Table 5. Under industry conditions prevailing in 1976, farms with 100-150 acres, selling turfgrass on an unharvested basis, realized the highest return to management of \$199.98 per acre over the two-year production period. Farms with less than 100 acres, which incurred the lowest average price per acre and the highest total production costs per acre, realized a negative return to management of -\$8.76 per acre for the two-year production period.

VEGETATION MANAGEMENT

By Roger Funk, Ph.D., Davey Tree Expert Co., Kent, Ohio

Q: I have a turf area in an industrial lawn that has a cation exchange capacity of 7.5. What would you recommend as a top dressing to build up the soil, and how often should this material be applied?

A: As you probably are aware, many people consider the cation exchange capacity (CEC) of a soil the best single index of potential soil fertility. A "good" CEC would be in the range of 14 to 20 milliequivalents per 100 grams of soil. The CEC of your soil (7.5) indicates a fine sandy loam that would have problems retaining both nutrients and water.

Organic matter improves the CEC of sandy soil more rapidly than mineral soil (clay or silt) additives, although a good top soil would be satisfactory. However, the use of a top dressing that is distinctly different from the underlying soil may result in the development of an interface, a layering affect that impedes penetration of air and water. Top dressing in conjunction with a coring process will minimize the layering by providing some integration of the soil and top dressing. The top dressing process may be repeated over a period of several years until the desired CEC has been achieved.

Q: What is the best application for getting rid of broadleaf weeds when one doesn't want to affect or damage (kill) newly planted trees. We've lost trees with spray applications.

A: We have had good success with paraquat or Roundup although you may get some injury on young, green-barked trees.

Q: I have a maple tree with roots that are on the surface and are injured when I mow. Can I cut off these roots safely?

A: Unless there are a number of large roots, you should be able to prune them without causing injury to the tree. However, the roots are differentiated near the surface because that is where conditions are favorable for root growth and development. Maples are notorious for surface rooting, but compacted soils, waterlogging and other factors which inhibit air penetration contribute to surface root development. Unless these conditions are corrected, new roots may reappear on the soil surface.

Q: I always used a wetting agent when I applied paraquat, but someone told me not to use one with Roundup. I have been using it anyhow. Who is right?

A: Whoever told you not to use a spreader sticker with Roundup is right. Always follow the recommended application procedures on the chemical

label. The Roundup label states, "DO NOT ADD ADDITIONAL SURFACTANT."

Q: What is the latest status on tree wound dressings? Should we still be using them?

A: Although there has been some fairly recent research indicating that tree wound dressings do not prevent the entry of decay organisms, other evidence has shown that certain beetles are attracted to fresh wounds on trees if they are not painted. One Minnesota tree company was sued for not painting cuts on oaks which subsequently died from oak wilt, a disease carried by sap feeding beetles. Of course, the best policy would be to avoid pruning whenever possible during periods of beetle flight.

New research is being performed and projected by the Davey Company and by others in the field of arboriculture. Until more conclusive evidence is available which suggests that pruning cuts should not be treated, our recommendation will remain to paint all pruning cuts over one inch in diameter. **WTT**

PROSCAPE

By Michael Hurdzan, Ph.D., golf course designer and consultant

Q: We have had little success removing *Poa annua* from our bent greens. Is there any new chemical I can use this fall to eliminate or at least slow down the annual bluegrass?

A: Although researchers at many universities and chemical companies are working on this problem, there have been no recent major advances in selectively controlling *Poa annua* in bentgrass. The physiology of the annual bluegrass is so close to that of desired turfgrasses it is difficult to develop a selective control mechanism.

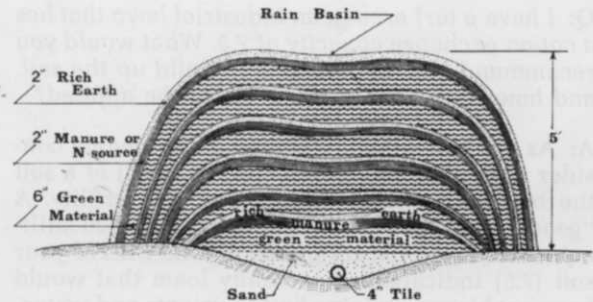
Annual bluegrass germinates during cool, moist times of the year (spring and predominately fall). It produces seedheads in late spring and early summer. Preemergence materials must be applied in both spring and fall during active germination. Post-emergence materials are applied after germination when the plant is most susceptible to the specific chemical. Although some superintendents have had remarkable success with post-emergence materials on bentgrasses, pre-emergence materials appear safer to use on bentgrass.

Bensulide (Betasan®) is a preemergent herbicide manufactured by Stauffer Chemical Co., which kills germinating *Poa annua* seeds. To be effective, the chemical must be in the root zone during germination. Disruptions of the root zone after application reduce the effectiveness of bensulide. Maintenance procedures such as thatching, vertical mowing, aeration or heavy topdressing should be done two to three weeks prior to application. In addition, overseeded or sodded turf should not be treated for a period of at least three mowings after installation or seeding.

The residual period of bensulide is about 4-6 months on sand-base greens and 8-12 months on soil depending upon soil type, soil texture, pH, and rainfall or irrigation frequency. This means that no reseeding should be done within four months of application. However, bensulide can be deactivated by applying seven pounds of activated charcoal per 1000 sq. ft. and washed into the soil by irrigation. Then reseeding can be done after only seven days.

Although our arsenal against *Poa annua* in bentgrass is limited, bensulide has a good safety factor, can be quickly deactivated with charcoal, and is readily available. It must be integrated into the overall maintenance and renovation program, but when properly done over a three year period, it has given good results.

Right now is the time to apply the fall application of any pre-emergence material. If you are uncertain of its performance, at least establish a test area for yourself on half of a green, tee, or well maintained nursery area. This field observation is valuable not only to yourself and other superintendents but to the chemical companies as well.



Q: Can you recommend a good method of compost pile construction?

A: The standard compost pile is made by first laying down a 5-6" layer of green material, a 2" layer of manure, (blood or bone meal, sewage sludge, or other high protein material), a 2" layer of rich earth, ground limestone and rock phosphate. This process of layering is continued until the pile is about five feet high and five feet wide. The length of the pile is optional. This gives the best aeration to the compost pile.

After this material has been piled up and the surface lightly tamped to prevent blowing, form a shallow basin on top of the pile to catch rain water. Lastly cover the pile with a thin layer of topsoil. All that remains is to thoroughly wet the pile and let it decay, turning the pile every 4-5 weeks.

From this basic method many variations have been developed such as pits, using fencing to hold the compost pile, or bricks, and using different materials. As long as the pile is turned every 3-4 weeks as the temperature inside the pile reaches 150° F.

Compost piles provide a perfect way to get rid of leaves and grass clippings and return a profit from the sale of the compost. To make a leaf compost requires a good size pile of leaves that have been shredded by either being put thru a shredder or mulched with a rotary mower with a mulching attachment. Since leaves are low in N they must be supplemented with a fertilizer for optimum composting. A good formula is a 1:1:1:2

100# of leaves


100# of grass clippings or old hay

100# of manure (2-3# N)

20# of ground rock minerals (P,K, Ca)

Mix all these shredded materials together and wet the pile thoroughly. By the second day the pile should start to heat any by the third day it should be turned. Then turn the pile for the next 12-15 days on a three day cycle until the pile starts to cool. Place the material thru a shredder and it is ready to use.

LAWSUITS

Almost all interim regs upheld; possible changes up to OSM

Industry had few reasons to celebrate over the holiday weekend since it was still suffering from the impacts of U.S. District Judge Thomas Flannery's August 24 decision that struck down most of its lawsuits challenging the OSM's interim regulations. The few bright spots in the lawsuit pertained to reclamation, but even some of those decisions were sent back to the Secretary of the Interior and OSM for further comment, with no promise of revision.

The only area where Judge Flannery has told OSM that the regulations must be changed pertains to prime agricultural farmlands.

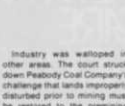
Flannery struck down the clauses in the farmlands regulation saying that any land used during five of the last 20 years would be placed in the prime farmlands category. Saying the regulations were "clearly over-broad in achieving its stated purpose" he has asked OSM to come up with a new definition.

There were some partial victories. Judge Flannery has required OSM to reconsider its rule on sedimentation ponds and dams that imposes a three-foot difference between the top of the dam and the surface of the water. But OSM was only asked to reconsider this since Flannery felt it did not document its reasons for the requirement in previous court briefs. He seemed to feel that the government should more or less double-check this since "these dam requirements are

MONTANA ACREAGE BONDED UNDER STRIP MINING PERMITS



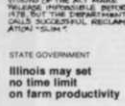

STATE GOVERNMENT
Illinois may set no time limit on farm productivity

No official word has yet been issued in Illinois on prime farmland regulations, but the state's Department of Agriculture says it will allow coal companies as much time as they need to grow crops that produce 90 percent or more of the yields than before mining occurred.
