

Conflicting signals on pesticide develpment

A recent increase in the number of pesticide products gaining registration will hopefully continue, but signals from industry and government seem to indicate otherwise.

Mergers may play a role equal to government regulation in the future development of pesticides. Mobil's sale of its agricultural chemical division to Rhone Poulenc was surprising in light of its participation in the Conoco takeover. Du Pont's interest in Conoco is fairly evident since it is highly dependent upon oil resources for its products. The Boots/Fisons merger in the U.S. seems to show togetherness is better in chemical development and marketing.

The result of mergers is obvious; fewer, bigger chemical companies. Does this mean that combining resources will improve research investment and result in more new products? Or will it mean less competition, dropping of minor use products, and higher prices?

Both the cost of registration and liability in case of disposal problems is forcing chemical companies to be more selective in products offered. This extra caution is necessary for chemical companies to protect their market stability in today's merger-mad market.

Integrated pest management is expected to cut agricultural chemical sales in the next decade. Since most landscape products are developed from agricultural products, the prospects are not as rosy even though IPM is not expected to cut landscape chemical use appreciably.

Biological or bacterial production of chemicals is the new wave. No chemical company wants to be left out of that market as it develops due to technological breakthroughs.

Data compensation between chemical companies is still not resolved by the Environmental Protection Agency. Data is still duplicated at high cost to support new registrations when it exists in the files of other companies.

On top of all this, EPA's new administration has reorganized the enforcement division. Companies now have to get new assurance of the rules before proceeding with current and new products.

The small manufacturer must feel lost in all this confusion.

Regardless of the intent of the Reagan administration to provide more encouragement to manufacturers, market conditions are keeping the lid on and finishing the job EPA started in the early 70's. The numbers get bigger and bigger. Small users have a harder time gaining the attention of chemical manufacturers. And the prices keep going up.

You can't blame the chemical companies. They, like you and I, are trying to survive. With so many conflicting signals, they have to be cautious and we have to fight harder for attention. **WTT**

Medfly impact small on contractors

The Mediterranean fruit fly infestation has embarassed state officials, traumatized consumers and imperiled California's lucrative fruit crop. Arborists and landscapers, however, have not been greatly effected. Tree people throughout the infected area in central California say that they were besieged by requests for help and information but weren't able to do too much to help.

"We had an awful lot of telephone calls. People wanted advice," says Susan Pitt, office manager of S.P. McClenahan Company in the Portola Valley. "We gave them support and advice. There was no real impact on business, but it caused an awful lot of office work."

Jane Lesh, secretary-treasurer of Lee's Tree Surgeons in Saratoga thinks that the controversy may have "caus d people to look at their trees and thick about them." Lesh voiced a common complaint when she explained that possible business increases from fruit stripping were offset by the "indecision about the whole thing. People would call one day and say 'you have to strip the walnut trees,' and the next day they would be told no."

Gil Mitchell, a partner in Able Tree Surgeons, San Jose, says that in addition to the "vacillation" of officials, demand for stripping was low because "people didn't want to put out the bucks for it. A lot of people thought they could strip the trees themselves or waited for the California Conservation Corps to come by or they just didn't give a damn.

Some didn't think it would be effective."

Even when people were sure they wanted their fruit stripped, tree surgeons weren't always able to be of service. "We just don't have the time to do it,' says Susan Pitt. The man hour rate is too expensive to send a tree surgeon to strip trees. We advised clients to get someone local to strip the trees."

Arborists were not asked to spray against the Medfly. The government took care of the aerial and ground spraying and "preferred that people not spray by themselves," according to Pitt. Agricultural Pest Control Operators were asked not to duplicate the job. Mitchell says that there was a negative impact on spray business because people "think that malathion spray is sufficient for all pest troubles. Sprayers lost a lot of business."

Malathion did eliminate many insects and was good for indoor landscapers, according to Alrie Middlebrook of Interior Landscape Design, Inc. in San Jose.

The long range effects of the infestation are mixed. The public is more aware of the importance of tree care. Some people may want to avoid plants, shrubs or trees that attract the Medfly. Fruit trees may not bear as well next year because of the damage caused by improper stripping.

One thing is clear. As Andrea Golden of Interior Landscape Design observed: "it will certainly be a lot of work for people cleaning up the mess."

Floraboard stalled in Congress

Congressional action on the Floraboard plan to establish a research and promotion program that would increase demand for flower and plant products has been delayed. The bill has been introduced in the House of Representatives, but has not yet been introduced in the Senate.

Floraboard is a "producer's program designed to increase demand for floral products similar to the programs for other agricultural commodities such as cotton, wool and milk," according to Barbara Kratchman, publications editor for the Society of American Florists (SAF).


Under the Floraboard system, growers and importers would be assessed a certain rate of sales per year, thus generating a fund of \$7-9 million in the program's first year. For the first two years producers and importers would pay at a rate of one half of a percent per year. Each year the rate increase may not exceed one quarter of a percent, with a maximum assessment of one and a half percent of sales. Only firms with more than \$100,000 of growth sales would be assessed.

The program will be administered by

the Floraboard, a 75 member board consisting of industry representatives nominated by producers' and importers' organizations, and appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture. The board's major objective, Kratchman says, will be to increase demand for flowers and plants and thereby "even out consumer buying patterns. On five major occasions each year (Valentine's Day, Easter, National Secretary's Week, Mother's Day and Christmas) growers sell all they can. They are forced to produce in an inefficient manner." Kratchman points out that 'demand hasn't increased in six years. The full market potential of cut flowers, cut greens and foliage has not been realized.

"The program is producer conceived, created and directed," Kratchman emphasizes. "Because it's a mandatory assessment the government has to have its finger in it, but it is a producer's program. Floraboard will only implement what the producer's okay."

The program must have major industry backing. A referendum will be held and two thirds of all producers have to *Continues on page 8*

NLA landscape tour views Cincinnati

More than 200 members of the National Landscape Association toured a cross section of Cincinnati landscapes during the recent America Association of Nurserymen Convention and Trade Show there.

Ken Natorp, president of W.A. Natorp Co., Cincinnati, guided the tour to urban parks, office plazas, suburban apartments complexes, and two residential estates. Much of the construction and design had been performed by Natorp's firm, Thorton Environmental Industries of Maineville, Ohio, and Ammon Nursery, Florence, KN.

Highlights of the tour included Harper's Point, an apartment complex where many water features and plant material provide unusual privacy. Water sound was heard everywhere in the complex due to numerous lakes and waterfalls. One estate contained a three-acre private arboretum with numerous dwarf conifers and an elaborate collection of plant material. The tour also saw baseball star catcher Johnny Bench's home.

The 1982 NLA tour will take place with the AAN Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, July 17-21. The NLA Board put finishing touches on its management Clinic held each February at the Gault House in Louisville, KY.

Deadline for ALCA award is November 15

Entries for the 12th Annual ALCA Environmental Improvement Awards are sought by the assocciation. Awards in seven categories will be awarded: commercial landscape contracting, residential landscape contracting, interior landscape installation, interior landscape maintenance, exterior landscape maintenance, land reclamation/revegetation, and design/build landscaping.

A panel of judges will evaluate each entry on its own merits, without comparison to other entries. There is no limit to the number of awards the judges can make in any one category and no limit to the size of the project. Project entries will be accepted until November 15, 1981 at a cost of \$85 per entry (\$70 for members). Awards will be presented at the Annual Meeting in January.

Information and entry forms are available from Associated Landscape Contractors of America, 1750 Old Meadow Rd., McLean, VA 22102. Awards chairman is Ann Lambeth.

ALCA prepares for Palm Springs show

Exhibit space for the annual ALCA Trade Exhibit is going faster than usual for the 1982 meeting in Palm Springs, CA. Indoor and outdoor displays make the show attractive to more than 1,000 landscape contractors each year. The date for the show is January 24-27, 1982.

First interior landscape exam nears

The National Council for Interior Horticultural Certification plans to give its first exam during the Interior Plantscape Association Show, October 28-30, at the Radisson Hotel, St. Paul, MN.

NCIHC is an independent self-sustaining council formed to recognize qualified interior landscape contractors and their job worthiness. Requirements for taking the exam include five years experience in the field, four years experience and an associate's degree in horticulture, or three year's experience and a bachelor's degree. Each applicant must submit photographs and documentation of four jobs completed and belong to either IPA or the Interior Landscape Division of ALCA. The applicants must pledge adherence to a code of ethics.

The exam will also be given at the ALCA Show in Palm Springs, CA, in January 1982. ALCA has endorsed NCIHC and its certification program.

approve of the program or Congress won't pass it. The Floraboard Development Committee of the SAF will administer the referendum, with Congressional oversight.

In the House, the bill's primary sponsor is Rep. Tony Coehlo (D.-California). By mid-July, 28 other representatives had signed on as co-sponsors of Floraboard. Floraboard hearings before the House Agriculture Domestic Marketing, Consumer Relations and Nutrition Subcommittee were scheduled for July 14. The hearings were postponed in order to allow the SAF time to respond to some questions raised by officials in the Office of Management and Budget and the Department of Agriculture.

Originally, administration officials contested 11 provisions in the bill. After meeting with SAF representatives, eight of the 11 problems were eliminated. The three remaining issues concern reimbursal of funds used to send out information to educate growers for the referendum, whether or not to have a consumer representative on the board, and the access government departments other than the Justice and Treasury Departments should have to the board's records.

At the SAF's convention in Denver on July 31, special sessions dealing with Floraboard, in general, and the issues dividing the SAF and the Administration, in particular, were held. During Congress' August recess, Administration officials, SAF representatives, and legislators met to iron out the difficulties.

The Senate version of Floraboard is sponsored by Senator S.I. Hayakawa (R.-California). Introduction of the bill was delayed as a result of the avalanche of legislation already introduced, the Senate's preoccupation with President Reagan's economic package and the Administration's objections. Senate strategists are not sure if the revised bill will be introduced in the fall on its own or as an amendment to the Farm Bill, the periodic reauthorization of major farm programs.

Regardless of the route taken, little opposition is expected. Barbara Kratchman says that although there has been some opposition from nonorganized growers, no organizations have come out against Floraboard. Floraboard's similarity to other agricultural boards which have been extremely successful has bestowed legitimacy to the legislation in the eyes of the Congressmen.

The precise time the bill will come Continues on page 11

EPA reorganizes enforcement

EPA Administrator Anne Gorsuch abolished EPA's offices of Enforcement and Planning and Management in a major reorganization that became effective on July 1. Gorsuch named John Horton, a New Jersey engineer and businessman to be the Assistant Administrator for Administration, a new position created in the reorganization shuffle. Horton will direct personnel, organization, information, data systems, facilities and fiscal and contract management functions. Other Assistant Administrators in the new reorganization will be Pesticides and Toxic Substances, Water, Solid Waste and Emergency Response, Research and Development and Air, Noise and Radiation.

Gorsuch also created two Associate Administrator positions—one for Policy and Resource Management and a second for Legal Enforcement Council. The Office of Policy and Resource Management will oversee resource allocations, standards, policy, regulations, legislative analysis and development processes and program and management evaluation activities.

The reorganization provides that enforcement relating to Pesticides and Toxic Substances, Solid Waste and Superfund, Water, Air and Noise and Radiation will be established in the program offices.

Sanford Harvey, Jr., now Deputy Administrator for Mobile Source, Noise and Radiation Enforcement was chosen by Gorsuch to be Director of the Office of Pesticides and Toxic Substances Enforcement. Kitty Adams, formerly a private environmental consultant, and Joseph A. Cannon, a staff member on the Reagan-Bush Presidential Committee, will each have the title of Gorsuch's special assistant for Regulatory Reform.

Disasters and Finances Plague Minneapolis

One of the most active shade tree programs in the country is in Minneapolis, MN. The spread of the Dutch elm fungus to that part of the nation several years ago destroyed thousands of elm trees and emphasized the need for such a tree program. More than 100,000 trees have been planted on city streets since 1975. Maple, linden, pin oak, hackleberry, green ash, honey locust and ginko trees now stand where elms once stood. While the city still has about 125,000 elm, 4000-5000 trees are lost each year. Over the next thirty years all of the city's elms will fall victim to Dutch elm disease.

This disease is not the only worry of the city forester, Dave DeVoto. Community grant funds from the Minnesota Department of Agriculture have been cut from \$2 million to \$1 million next year. To add to his woes, on June 14, a tornado blew through a part of the city and knocked down more than 4000 trees. It cost \$350,000 to remove downed trees and weakened limbs from trees that were damaged but not uprooted. The trees will not be replaced so quickly since it costs about \$75 for each new tree, not including labor and equipment costs.

Ingredient Analysis Reflects Well

FIVE YEAR TESTS REVEAL TRAITS OF WINTER OVERSEEDING MIXTURES

Winter overseeding is the late fall seeding of one or more cool season turfgrass species/cultivars onto the surface of an established warm season turf. Winter overseeding practices are well established and date back to the early uses of grass for putting surfaces in the South. Overseeding of bermudagrass putting greens provides an improved putting surface and more aesthetically pleasing turf compared to the dormant turf of bermudagrass. Species selection for winter overseeding putting greens 10-12 years ago was dominated by annual ryegrass. Today, improved cultivars of perennial ryegrass are the predominate species used in winter overseeding. The number of commercially available perennial ryegrass cultivars advertised for winter overseeding on putting greens has increased each year and presently stands at approximately 20 available cultivars.

The use of perennial ryegrass for overseeding putting greens includes both monostands and polystands (blends and mixtures). Overseeding mixtures of perennial ryegrass are generally composed of one or more cool season turfgrasses including fine-leafed fescues, rough bluegrass (*Poa trivialis*), Kentucky bluegrass and creeping or colonial bentgrass. The perennial ryegrass component of these mixtures provides rapid establishment, environmental hardiness, wear tolerance and sustained and uniform growth. The other turfgrass components used in these mixtures are generally added to provide improved characteristics of putting quality (fine texture,

high shoot density, smoothness, etc.) and/or regulate stand persistence in the spring.

The evaluation of cool season turfgrass blends and mixtures for winter overseeding putting greens is unique compared to other types of turf evaluations. Winter overseeded species are evaluated as an annual turf, when in fact, all species except annual ryegrass are perennial in nature. In addition, seeding rates of overseeded blends or mixtures on putting greens exceed by 3 or 4 fold recommended seeding rates for establishment of these same species when planted as a perennial or non-overseeded turf. The evaluation of overseeded species takes into account not only turf quality as a component of performance, but establishment rate and density of the overseeding (fall transition) as well as rate and schedule of overseeding dieback (spring transition). Ideally, an overseeding selection for putting greens should provide rapid, uniform and high initial shoot density during fall transition, followed by sustained, uniform and high shoot density and green color throughout the winter and early spring. Spring transition, which occurs in late spring or early summer, should be a smooth and controlled dieback of the overseeding allowing a gradual and uniform green-up of the bermudagrass without significant sacrifice in putting quality.

The most common approach to a turfgrass evaluation program is to utilize replicated field trials at state, federal or private research locations using small plots (20-50 sq. ft.). Although this evaluation approach is beneficial and most times the only available procedure, the information gathered is limited by plot size and actual elements of turfgrass use and culture. The close proximity of small plot field trials allows rapid and convenient observations of comparative difference between entries. These comparative differences, however, can be readily overemphasized and may or may not be significant to the consumer (homeowner, golfer, etc.).

In the fall of 1976, an overseeding evaluation approach was undertaken to evaluate overseeding species performance using large plots (1000-2000 square feet) and a cultural and use environment representative of putting greens. This evaluation approach was conducted by utilizing an 18-hole public golf course owned and operated by Mississippi State University. All entries were evaluated by splitting each of the 18 putting greens into half and each half section seeded to a randomly selected overseeding entry. This design provided a total of 36 plots or half greens. All *Continues on page 18*



entries were replicated twice and provided space for 18 selections. Overseeding entries used in the evaluations were limited to commercially available monostands, blends and/or mixtures marketed for overseeding use. Performance evaluations were based on a minimum of monthly visual observations and ratings using a numerical scale of 1 - 9; with 1 =poorest and 9 =best. Performance ratings were conducted by various groups including golf course superintendents, golfers, golf professionals and university students and researchers. All seed companies participating in these tests supplied entries on a voluntary basis and were required to supply seed for 2 replications. Seeding rates and choice of entries were decided by the seed companies cooperating. Due to changes in yearly participation of individual seed companies and entry choices, a wide variety of different entries were used in the overall 5 year evaluation period. The list of overseeding entries used for one or more years over the past 5 years is presented in Table 1. Overseeding performance scores which are reported represent only those selections which were evaluated 3 or more years out of 5 (Table 2). The findings in overseeding performance, as shown in Table 2, are generally representative of the other entries included in the evaluation program 2 years or less. The entire evaluation using putting greens for plot area was carried out over 5 consecutive years (1976-1980).

The 5 year average scores showed little or no difference between winter overseeding entries when compared side by side under actual putting green conditions. The anticipated complaints from golfers putting across the center dividing lines on each green rarely occurred. Nearly all golfers were surprised to learn they had just played across 18 different overseeding combinations. No entry evaluated showed consistently high or low performance ratings across the 5 year period. The greatest similarity in putting quality among overseeding entries were observed for the perennial ryegrass blends and monostands. The characteristics of texture, uniformity, density, disease resistance, wear, fall transition and spring transition were similar for all perennial ryegrass blends and monostands evaluated. Color was slightly different among several perennial ryegrasses in which the cultivars Regal, Citation, Derby, and Caravelle showed a slightly darker green coloration; whereas, Loretta showed a lighter green color when compared to the other perennial ryegrasses.

Differences in overseeding performance that were noticed in addition to color were representative of overseeding mixtures including rough bluegrass (Poa trivialis). These overseeding mixtures which included perennial ryegrass plus rough bluegrass were Marvelgreen + Sabre, Super Celebrity or Dixie Green + Sabre. Differences in these mixtures compared to blends or monostands of perennial ryegrass were most noticeable in the spring. The rough bluegrass mixtures generally showed higher shoot density, finer-leaf texture and greater smoothness compared to the other entries. Mixtures containing rough bluegrass, however, did not rank superior overall as based on a seasonal average. This was due, in part, to poor spring transition characteristics which resulted in prolonged persistence into the spring and inhibition of the bermudagrass spring green-up.

The differences in seasonal average scores were not found statistically different and therefore can not be attributed solely to the overseeded entries. Greens characteristics, including soil type, drainage, slope exposure, shade and/or other factors collectively resulted in more variation than could be overcome by an individual overseeding entry. This result points out the high variability in environmental and site conditions golf course superintendents manage turf and close similarity of the overseeding entries evaluated. This similarity in putting quality and performance ratings of the perennial ryegrass entries provides the consumers (golfer, golf course superintendents, golf professionals, etc.) with the option to direct additional attention to price and service when products perform equally. The overseeding mixtures including rough bluegrass showed improved characteristics of putting quality and performance which can be utilized by individual golf courses based on needs. Care should be taken, however, to manage and control the inherent growth characteristics of rough bluegrass for a smooth and controlled spring transition. WTT

LATE FLOWERING TREES PROVIDE MID-SUMMER COLOR, INTEREST

Trees which flower early to mid-summer can be particularly important in the landscape. These trees add not only color at a time when the landscape is otherwise green, but diversity as well. Four particularly exciting plants for midsummer bloom include Yellowwood, Goldenraintree, Kousa Dogwood, and Goldenchain Tree.

American Yellowwood (Cladrastis lutea), a native mid-summer flowering tree is particularly spectacular. This round-headed tree, at maturity, reaches 30 to 50 feet in height and width. While young, it is somewhat narrow and upright. V-crotches can be a problem, but prompt pruning will correct the problem. The bark is smooth and gray, resembling American Beech. The pinnate compound leaves make this plant particularly interesting. Each leaf has seven to eleven leaflets which are oval and smooth.

The new and summer foliage is a vibrant yellow-green. Fall color, which is quite dependable in Central Michigan, is a good yellow to brown. The white flowers are at their peak in Central Michigan during mid- to late June. These drooping flowers normally are in full bloom in the Boston and northern Ohio areas during late May or early June. The white flowers are held in drooping clusters or racemes, 8 to 16 inches in length. Fruit becomes brown and is quite effective with the shape mirroring the flower shape. This is an excellent specimen tree in groups or as single plants.

Yellowwood prefers fertile, well-drained soil, while being adapted to a wide range of pH's, from acid to alkaline. It should be planted in full sun or at least 80% sun. When planted in semishaded areas, *Botryosphaeria* Canker can become a severe problem.



Drooping clusters of white flowers grace American Yellowwood in late May or early June in northern states.

Goldenraintree (Koelreutaria paniculata) has a bipinnately compound leaf, about 14 inches long, with seven to fifteen leaflets. At maturity, this perfectly round, dense small tree, reaches 25 to 35 feet in height. The leaves are purple when unfolding early in the spring, becoming a dull green during the summer with dependable yellow to yellow-orange fall color. Koelreutaria flowers during mid-July with unique bright yellow flowers, 12 to 15 inches in length.

This plant competes extremely well in turf or in beds. It prefers well-drained to droughty soils and is quite adaptable to areas of high air pollutants, as well as salt and many urban problems. It is a particularly outstanding tree with few or no insect or disease problems.



The bright yellow flowers in mid-July are just one benefit of the relatively disease and insect free Goldenraintree.

Kousa Dogwood (Cornus kousa), a native of China, should be looked upon as an exciting understory or specimen plant in full sun. It is more upright than Flowering Dogwood, usually reaching 25 to 30 feet in height. When young, it is somewhat upright-vase-shaped, becoming oval at maturity. It can be grown as a multiple-stem or single-stem tree. The bark is spectacular as the plant becomes older, exfoliating, being multicolored (pale yellow and brown).

Flowering in the most northerly area is dependable. In Central Michigan, it flowers from early through late June, sometimes into July after the leaves are out. Kousa Dogwood's flowering bracts are a pale to clear white. They are usually somewhat pointed and, again, extremely low temperature hardy, often to minus 30°F. Of the cultivars available, *Cornus kousa chinensis* 'Milky Way' is the most dynamic, with a somewhat more spreading habit of growth and the flowers being considerably more delicate with extremely pointed bracts. *C. kousa* can be used as a small tree specimen or in mass planting. It seems to thrive in sunnier locations as contrasted to *C. florida*.

The fruit is effective late August through October, being ½ to 1 inch in diameter. This reddish, globular fruit somewhat resembles raspberries. Although seedy, they are quite tasty.

The summer foliage is a good clear green with fall color either not developing or developing extremely late in the season. When it does develop, the fall color is a dull maroon. Kousa Dogwood's main advantages over our native *C. florida* include extremely low temperature hardy flower buds, ease of transplanting, and flowering during early summer. Kousa Dogwood is an exciting addition to our summer landscape.

Goldenchain Tree (X Laburnum watereri) is 12 to 16 feet in height with a 9- to 10-foot spread. The foliage is a dull blue-green with little or no fall color. The trifoliate leaves are all elliptical in shape. Perfect yellow flowers come out during early or mid-June. They are borne in 7- to 10-inch pendulous racemes. This small tree is a good specimen in full sun or in protected areas, usually exposed to the north or northeast.

These trees with summer flowers are not only outstanding as specimens, but also integrate well into mass plantings. They all seem relatively drought tolerant, having few or no insect and disease problems.

Although their fall color varies, the uniqueness of early to mid-summer blooms makes these truly exciting additions to the landscape. Although borderline hardy in Central and Northern Michigan, they should be considered somewhat commonplace from Detroit all the way south to the Washington, DC area.

When looking for diversity with excitement, yet low maintenance, Yellowwood, Goldenraintree, Kousa Dogwood, and Goldenchain Tree should be high on the list.

GYPSY MOTH INVASION RUNS ARBORIST RAGGED

It's 4:30 a.m. The arborist wearily hops into his truck to start yet another day of non-stop spraying against the gypsy moth. He may work as late as 10 or 11 this night. Some of his fellow arborists start spraying college campuses, industrial parks and normally bustling city streets at that hour. Our hero works through the Memorial Day weekend. He works over the Fourth. Hopefully, he'll be able to take some time off soon. But it's not up to him—he's held captive by the whims of the dreaded gypsy moth.

This spring and early summer, throughout the Northeast and scattered parts of the rest of the country, arborists took up the herculean task of controlling the gypsy moth. By many accounts, this year's infestation was the worst ever. Experts estimate that between 10 and 15 million acres were defoliated this year, surpassing the record five million acres defoliated in 1980. The area from Maine through Wilmington, DE, extending as far west as Pennsylvania Dutch Country, was blanketed by the ravenous insects. Isolated infestations were reported in California, Oregon, Nebraska, Michigan, Ohio, Florida and Vancouver, British Columbia.

"I've been spraying since 1955, and this is the worst year I've ever seen," says Robert Mullane, president of Alpine Tree Care, Inc., in White Plains, NY, confirming most arborists' observations. Erik Haupt, president of Haupt Tree Company in southwestern Massachusetts, contends that this year "had the greatest variety in the stages and life cycle of the moth I've ever seen in 25 years. The gypsy moths started laying eggs in late April, early May, and they were still hatching the end of May into June. There were all stages of instar at the same time. This was more from lack of food rather than pronounced, staggered hatching."

Arborists Inundated

The intensity and the expanse of the infestation caused widespread public distress. Arborists were inundated with calls. "You couldn't reach any tree company," says Walt Dages, public relations manager of the F. A. Bartlett Tree Company in Stamford, CT. "A lot of people complained that our phone was off the hook." The firms weren't refusing to answer calls; they were constantly on the phone. Alpine Tree Company didn't take any orders after April 1. Other companies were also unable to satisfy all of the customers in need.

Carl Bosenberg, president of H.F. Bosenberg and Son Corporation in North Brunswick, NJ, didn't take over half the calls that came in. "It's very unfair to customers to say 'yes, we'll be there to spray,' when you know in your heart that you'll never be able to make it. It's like a guy with a doctor's appointment at two who sits around until four, and then is rushed through by the doctor who's in a hurry to get home."

Bosenberg is not willing to sacrifice the quality of his service in order to satisfy the increased demand. "We could have done a lot more if we had been willing to cut corners. We don't try to produce volume. Doing fewer jobs and doing them well is more important. Others' business more than doubled. They'd work until 10 and wake up at five. It's fine if you do it for a couple of days. But after a while, you become so bleary eyed you're just going through the motions."

Business Booms

Despite all the unanswered calls, business increased dramatically. Bosenberg's company had at least a 30-40 percent increase in spraying jobs over the previous year. Estimates by other arborists ranged from a 20 percent increase to 100 percent. Robert Mullane says that established companies would tend to have a less dramatic rise. "When you've been in business a long time you get a lot of regular customers. Ninety to ninetyfive percent of our business is from return customers."

The increase experienced by both new and old firms strained supplies of chemicals, labor and equipment. Eric Haupt says that even though his company was braced for an increase in demand, they still ran out of spray on occasions. "When you're involved in a major increase of that type, no matter how carefully you plan it's difficult to set up.

"It was impossible to foresee," Haupt explains. "We ran through three, four, five times the amount of spray material expected. The gypsy moth respects no calendar, it respects no weather forecast. You're vulnerable to weather and to other factors. But you have to move quickly, a tree has leaves one day and is defoliated the next."

Walt Dages estimates that business at the Bartlett Company is "almost double. We could have done a lot more but we lacked equipment and trained manpower." Bartlett and other firms updated, reequipped, and purchased new machines.

Supply and Demand



The Task Master Tractors from John Deere Circle No. 115 on Reader Inquiry Card Corporation, Jonesboro, AR, is the largest manufacturer of sprayers in the United States. "We tried to foresee demand, but we still didn't have enough. We sold out earlier than we ever had," exclaimed Marion Meredith, advertising manager at FMC. "Our 600 and 1000 gallon sprayers ran out in early spring. We ran out of our smaller units in early summer." Although FMC hasn't started building new sprayers yet, dealers are already ordering sprayers for next spring.

Not all equipment companies were overwhelmed by the gypsy moth infestation. A spokesman for Broyhill Company in Dakota City, NB, says the gypsy moth infestation in the Northeast "hasn't changed a thing. The Mediterranean fruit flies had more of an impact on our sales."

Chemical companies that supply Sevin, methoxychlor and other weapons for use against the pest experienced sales increases, but did not run out of material. Roy Lockett, communications manager of Union Carbide Agricultural Products Division in Raleigh, NC, estimates that even though less than 10 percent of their sales of Sevin are used against the gypsy moth, the fight against the moth helped make 1981 "the best year we've had in sales for our program. The supply fluctuated, but we had anticipated heavy use because of the gypsy moth."

Miller Chemical and Fertilizer Corporation had also anticipated an increase in demand. Charlie Svec, executive vice president of the Hanover, PA firm, said the gypsy moth "very definitely had an impact" on the Sevin and methoxychlor his company sells. "A pretty substantial volume of product was sold. There might have been some delays in getting the product out, but we were consolidating two plants during the year. I wouldn't expect a recurrence of the minimal delays next year."

Arborist's Arsenal: Results

The arborist has a variety of weapons in his arsenal against the gypsy moth. Most agree that a well-timed, well-planned, integrated pest management program (IPM) is necessary. "The gypsy moth should be dealt with as part of an overall biological problem and not as if there is one solution to stamp them out in one fell swoop," says Charles Roth, chief educator and naturalist of the Massachusetts Audubon Society.

Nevertheless, different arborists rely on different weapons as their mainstay in the fight against the gypsy moth.

The most popular method still remains spraying, with arborists mentioning Sevin as the pesticide used most often. Bruce Walgren, Jr., director of operations for Walgren Tree Experts in West Hartford, CT, says that his firm uses a two spray approach. They spray early with Sevimol, a Sevin with an additional "sticky" substance to keep the chemical on the tree. They then do a second application of malathion and Sevin for good knockdown. "Sevin did a super job," says Walgren. "We achieved very good control. Approximately 97 percent of our customers were satisfied. There were not many complaints, especially for the volume of business we did." Robert Mullane of Alpine Tree Care prefers a combination of Sevin, malathion and methoxychlor. Others, like Carl Bosenberg, used Sevin by itself.

Sevin was neither universally used nor was it universally acclaimed. Eric Haupt uses methoxychlor "almost exclusively. It's very effective from a money standpoint and a control standpoint."

Okay to Spray?

Some ecologists object to the use of Sevin because it is "broad spectrum like so many of our pesticides," according to Dr. Dick*Plunkett, a staff ecologist with the National Audubon Society in New York. "A broad spectrum pesticide affects the natural controls—parasites and predators. Whatever controls we destroy increases the intensity of the next outburst."

Plunkett points to the adverse effect of Sevin on honeybees as but one example. "Natural pollination is of great importance to fruit crops. The commercial beekeeper is warned to keep away for a week after Sevin is sprayed."

Others maintain that Sevin is less than beneficial to humans and animals in the area being sprayed. Sufficient doubts exist, they claim, but the pesticide still remains on the list of accepted chemicals.

Roy Lockett of Union Carbide is unconvinced. The Environmental Protection Agency just completed a four year investigation of Sevin. "They went through all our files, and through information from outside laboratories," Lockett explains. "They found that Sevin poses no threat to humans or animals—they gave it a clean bill of health."

Few people on either side insist on taking their case to its extreme. Plunkett says the Audubon Society approves of the United States Department of Agriculture's program which advocates an IPM scheme to combat the gypsy moth. Plunkett also says that he would not object to the "use of chemical insecticides for extreme conditions. What I do object to is aerial spraying near people."

Many arborists who are confident that Sevin and other pesticides are not harmful to humans, are still wary of spraying wantonly. Carl Bosenberg "firmly believes that the fewer chemicals we have in use, the better off we are in the long run. If we could control the gypsy moths without chemicals we would be very happy. It's not that Sevin is harmful, but we would do any-*Continues on page 34*

thing to avoid spraying into the atmosphere. We like to soft pedal the use of chemicals."

Eric Haupt agrees. "We view spraying as a necessary evil. We won't take advantage of the concern of the public to scare them into additional spraying. We won't sign them up for 30 years. There's too much indiscriminate use of pesticides."

Charles Roth was particularly disturbed about indiscriminate spraying in reaction to the gypsy moth attack. "There's an awful lot of garbage being sprayed around. People are spraying chlorox, kerosene, anything, into the atmosphere."

The attitude of the general public toward spraying was, as usual, mixed. Bosenberg found that this year "people were so glad to see us, it was fun to spray. Last year we had lots of hassles; this year anybody who could spray was accepted. People's trees were being chewed up, they were willing to accept anything. If your neighbor's tree is chewed up you feel sorry; if yours is chewed up you get excited."

Walt Dages of Bartlett Tree Expert Company says that when the company's helicopter landed for a break or to check an address "people started running up to the helicopter and asking to be sprayed."

Attitudes toward spraying seem to be determined by how desperate the individual is for relief. Tom Wolf, a forester with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, discovered that in New York City. The DEC was going to spray 800 acres in the Bronx and Staten Island with Dylox. In Staten Island, where homeowners were suffering, a public protest was made and the environmentalists were "hooted down." In the Bronx, the outbreak was localized in Van Cortland Park. DEC officials were besieged with protests and petitions from community groups, assemblymen and state senators. The city was forced to drop the program.

Wolf discovered that you can't please everybody. "Before the gypsy moths start chewing, people yell 'don't spray, you'll poison children and dogs.' After they start chewing, people yell, 'how come they didn't do anything?' "

Alternatives: Bt and NPV

Given the widespread discomfort with spraying, other alternatives were examined. Many people advocate *Bacillus* thuringiensis (*Bt*), a spore-forming bacteria, as a safer, but equally effective, alternative. Charles Roth recommends *Bt*. "There's less of a biological impact, it's better in the long run" and knocks out the gypsy moth, according to Roth.

Last year, Alpine Tree Care used a considerable amount of Bt. "This year, says Robert Mullane, "we used it on a limited scale. We got terrible results. The gypsy moth lays eggs over a six week period, from May 1 to June 20. It takes Bt a week to become effective. It works for the next week, but it couldn't control them the next month."

Roth grants that *Bt* "is more expensive and needs to be applied at proper times." However, its major advantage, "that it is only effective with caterpillars of the lepidoptera family," outweighs its additional cost and inconvenience.

Another highly touted alternative that only affects the gypsy moth is a gypsy moth virus, nucleopolyhedrosis (NPV), trade named Gypchek. It is also known as "wilt disease" because when killed by the disease, the gypsy moth hangs in an inverted "v." The advantages of the virus, which occurs naturally in high gypsy moth populations, is that it is specific to gypsy moth larvae and has "no effect whatever on anything else in the environment," according to Tom Wolf.

The disadvantage of the virus, Wolf notes, is that two applications, between five and ten days apart during the early instars, are required in order to be effective. Also, it takes one to two weeks to start killing the moth. Once the disease starts, if it has been properly applied, Wolf says you can expect a 75 percent mortality rate.

"Wilt disease" has been synthetically reproduced, but it is not yet commercially available. One of the reasons is that the virus is specific to the gypsy moth. The episodic nature of the gypsy moth makes the synthetic virus a less than profitable investment.

Stuart Aimsworth of Abbot Laboratories in North Chicago says that NPV is a "dead issue. Its control is as good as *Bt*, rarely if ever better than *Bt*. *Bt* has certain advantages over the gypsy moth virus and has some safety profits as well."

Injections and Pheromones

For one who does not wish to use biological agents or resort to spraying, injections are also possible. Injections of Bidrin, made at the base of the tree, become effective within 24 hours and sometimes as early as six hours, according to Dr. Arthur Costonis, president of Systemics Inc., in Massachusetts. Injections to the root flare send the poison throughout the tree. Only insects which eat the leaves are affected. "The poison stays six times as long as a spray-30 days conservatively, and up to 60 days. A minimal amount is used, only target trees are treated, it's non-blowing and the concentration found in gypsy moth larvae is almost non-detectable. If you compare it cost-wise, biologically-wise, efficacy-wise, as far as I'm concerned there are no disadvantages," says Costonis.

Costonis injected the street trees in Babylon, Long Island. "We did 30-40 trees at a time," says Costonis. an average oak tree 80 feet tall and 24 inches in diameter.

If policed properly, no danger to humans or animals exists. Costonis warns that if not policed properly, that is, if the capsules are not supervised while they are in the ground and removed before the applicators leave, you're "asking for a hell of a problem." Once the chemical with a concentration of 80 percent is in the tree, the danger of poisoning is minimal. "When seven or eight milliliters are put into trees which flush through 150-200 gallons a day, you get a dilution factor. An insignificant amount remains in the trees. You'd have to eat an awful lot of leaves to become ill," Costonis claims. "If the rules are followed, you can get 75-80 percent foliage protection.'

Some experts fear that the injury the tree sustains during the injection may make the cure worse than the disease. Dr. Alex Shigo, chief scientist of the USDA's Forest Service Northeastern Forest Experiment Station in Durham, NH, states that "injections properly done can be beneficial; injections improperly done can be harmful.' Shigo says that often holes are too deep, too wide and too far from the base of the tree. Too much pressure is also applied. "Don't go beyond the current growth ring," Shigo warns. "We have to trade off the injury to the tree with the benefits it gets. The process of injection will be with us; it's our responsibility to find ways to inject for the benefit of the tree and not to the detriment of the tree."

Costonis concurs and draws an analogy with a human doctor. "If you shoot yourself up with a compound, you get hurt. If a doctor does it the risk is minimal.

Arborists throughout the Northeast had positive results with their sporadic usage of injections. Ellis Allen of Allen Tree Experts, Inc., in Medfield, MA, summed up the feelings of many when he said although injections are effective they "won't take the place of sprays. They're too slow. Two men can't inject as quickly as they can spray. It's good for use on isolated trees or for people leery about spraying."

Sex pheromones were also used with mixed results. The scent given off confuses the male gypsy moth in order to decrease mating. It can also lure gypsys into traps. The expense, the incredible number of eggs spawned from one successful male and the fact that the traps draw the moths onto your property before they are caught prove that pheromones, like most weapons against the gypsy moth, are not a panacea.

Moth is a Nuisance

In late June, the gypsy moth stops chomping on trees and starts to pupate. From then on, the gypsy moths are more of a nuisance than any-Continues on page 108



thing else. "The moth's sole purpose in life is to mate," Walt Dages explains. Pesticides to stop the moths are not in use because they are either too expensive, or, like DDT, have been outlawed.

Consumer Reaction

Given that all the weapons against the gypsy moth have their advantages and their disadvantages, consumers beleaguered by the insatiable insects were bound to be frustrated. Some firms realized that during a crisis such as this one, education has to supplement insect control. "There was more education and a lot of media coverage this year. The crisis was more fully understood in 1981," according to Walt Dages. Dages's firm, the Bartlett Tree Expert Company, sponsored public meetings to further educate the public.

"From midwinter on, even before the season began, we had educational meetings to teach about the gypsy moth," says Dages. "They were extremely well attended. We held them in town halls and school auditoriums, people spilled out into the hallways. Very intelligent questions were asked. We always made sure there was a scientist, usually an entomologist, on hand. The meetings were very effective—you learn what to expect and what not to expect."

The Haupt Tree Company sent letters out to its clients at the end of the season. The letters were a "recapitulation of the season. We want people to be prepared for more," says Eric Haupt.

Even with the education and publicity, all was not quiet on the public relations front. People who had been sprayed but were unaware of the effective date of application, complained when they were revisited by the gypsy moth. People who were unable to get through to any tree companies and helplessly watched their trees lose their leaves, complained. People who feared the side effects of aerial spraying also complained.

Some arborists complained about inaccurate media coverage and emotionalism emanating from environmentalists. Old allegations that Sevin produces birth defects were resurrected and vehemently denied.

"By and large," according to Haupt, "the people we serve were very understanding. There was relative calm. A majority of our existing and new clientele had an understanding of the nearly crisis nature of the infiltration."

Refoliation Debate

The issue of refoliation surfaced and divided environmentalists and arborists. Dr. Dick Plunkett pointed to the Taconic State Parkway in New York as a good example. "Three weeks ago," Plunkett said in mid-July, "hundreds of thousands of acres were defoliated. The Taconic was completely bare with nothing in sight; it looked like the landscape of the moon. It's now refoliated—you can't say you have a denuded landscape anymore."

"That doesn't mean there weren't trees that died," Plunkett continued. "Defoliation does accelerate tree mortality. In one or two years the number who would have died in eight or ten years, die. But those are the diseased and damaged trees, it will even out in the long run."

Some arborists contend that statements made by Plunkett and others foster a false sense of complacency. Plunkett and his compatriots maintain that they are trying to calm the hysteria and place the "crisis" in proper perspective.

All agree that "defoliation certainly doesn't help the tree." Dr. William Wallner, Forest Service research project leader for the ecology and management of northeastern forest insect pests, explains that after a "defoliation of one or two years, the tree is susceptible to invasions by secondary organisms, which are attracted to a weakened or declined tree. Whether a tree will die or not depends on other factors as well. After a complete defoliation in forest areas, it takes up to ten years to get back to what is considered normal growth."

Refoliation depletes the starch reserve of the tree, thus reducing the amount of food energy reserves that the tree needs to maintain itself during the winter months and to bud in the early spring.

This year, some trees that refoliated still had larvae on them and were defoliated for a second time around.

Better Luck Next Year?

While the various controversies and debates about the 1981 gypsy moth infestation have yet to die down, arborists are digging in for the 1982 infestation. Preliminary reports based on the number of egg masses laid seem to point to another busy year for arborists. "Unless we have a very cold winter or there's a great deal of disease, we could be due for even greater gypsy moth infestation and even greater defoliation," Plunkett warns.

This year's incredible infestation may have tipped the scales against the gypsy moth. Many larvae starved before they fully developed. The egg masses of females might be smaller and therefore more susceptible to egg parasites. The population of predators might increase.

Even if next year's infestation is worse than this year's, slightly different areas could be the hardest hit. Wallner compares it to an "old war movie with guns in the distance and big flashes at night. The pattern of movement is from the core area. They're blown out of the area, and they *Continues on page 110*



spread into another area." Mullane agrees: "They start in an area adjacent to what was worst."

Next year, arborists should be better able to handle the gypsy moth. Mullane observes that "each year some improvements are made over the previous year. We were more prepared this year than last. We had minimal equipment breakdown. This year we didn't have as many headaches with chemicals as we had the previous year. The pH of the water we were using would change and it would affect our spraying. This year we used litmus paper to test the water. We saw that it did change in some streams and became very alkaline."

Marilyn Mulhern of Woodwind Associates, Inc., Princeton, NJ, says that next year they'll have "more effective planning. This year we were running and putting out fires, we have to tighten up the planning."

Arborist's Windfall?

Was all this activity a windfall for the arborist? "It's an expensive proposition," says Walt Dages. "Everyone thinks the tree companies are cleaning up. We're doing an awful lot of billing, but the profit margin is not all that different. Infestation kills trees. Tree companies can't work on dead trees. It's not all favorable."

Richard E. Almstead, president of Almstead Tree Company, Inc., in Westchester, NY, says that the "picture everyone paints that we're all making a fortune is a lie. What with time-and-ahalf for overtime, working Saturday and Sunday, and the prices that keep on going up, we're not making that much. For instance, chemicals keep on going up. You use a chemical at \$1.50 a pound, you have to reorder it at \$1.75 a pound. You price a job for \$40, it costs you \$38.50. We're doing a great volume, but at the bottom line, there's no great difference."

All the extra work and effort notwithstanding, doubts remain as to whether the gypsy moth has been conquered or if it will ever be conquered. Eric Haupt noticed that the Governor of North Carolina declared war on the gypsy moth. "I wish him luck. There were efforts in the '30s with the Civilian Conservation Corps to eradicate the gypsy moth. Thousands of men worked on a more limited infestation with literally no success."

Arborists will have to keep trying.

VEGETATION MANAGEMENT

By Roger Funk, Ph.D., Davey Tree Expert Co., Kent, Ohio

Q: Why do trees in waterlogged soils show signs of wilting as if they are not getting enough water?

A: Excess water replaces oxygen in the soil and the resultant poor aeration impedes water absorption by roots. It also reduces photosynthesis.

Many trees produce adventitious roots until they reach maturity, which may help explain why older trees are more apt to die back in waterlogged, compacted or construction-altered soils.

Q: For the past two years the pine trees we had planted along a highway were severely injured by salt applied in the winter. Could you recommend some evergreen trees that would not be injured? (Michigan)

A: All trees are probably injured, but some are more tolerant than others. Evergreen trees listed as salttolerant include Austrian pine, Japanese black pine and pitch pine. Evergreen trees listed as salt-intolerant that should not be planted, include Eastern white pine, hemlock and red pine.

Q: What would you recommend for lawns that are growing in high sodium soils?

A: Aside from the possible effects of excess salts which impair the absorption of water and nutrients, a high sodium content causes deaggregation of soil particles, resulting in compaction and a severe reduction in soil aeration and water infiltration. In addition, the availability of certain nutrients such as iron and manganese may be limited, whereas other micronutrients such as boron may become available in concentrations high enough to be toxic.

Sodic soils are usually corrected by amending with sulfur or gypsum (calcium sulfate) which replaces the exchangeable sodium on soil colloids. However, these materials are relatively slow-acting and repeated applications over a period of years may be necessary.

Ideally, the soil should be drenched prior to adding the soil amendment unless the soil is waterlogged and does not drain properly. If the materials are not incorporated, the soil should be watered after the application to move the materials downward into the root zone. After a period of several months, the soil should again be drenched to leach the soluble sodium salts.


Core cultivation will improve the exchange of air and water between the atmosphere and soil and improve the penetration of fertilizers, pesticides and materials being used for the correction of sodic soils. The net effect is to encourage deeper, more extensive rooting less susceptible to environmental stresses.

Until the sodium problem is corrected, particular attention should be given to fertilization since many of the nutrients will be "fixed" as a result of the high sodium content. Soil tests and field plot studies will help determine the special requirements of turf growing in sodic soils.

Q: What can you tell me about the rust disease that is affecting ash trees in the Philadelphia area? A: Ash leaf rust is caused by the fungus Puccinia peridermiospora. The fungus overwinters on the leaves of salt marsh and cord grasses. In midspring, wind-borne spores are carried as far as 100 miles to ash trees and infect leaves, petioles and shoots. Symptoms of ash leaf rust appear in late spring as yellow-orange spots on the upper surface of ash leaves and on petioles and shoots. After about two weeks, yellow-orange cups appear beneath the spots on the under surface of leaves and on other infected tissue. Heavy infestations cause leaf distortion and girdling of petioles and shoots. Early leaf drop is common, often resulting in complete defoliation by midsummer on severely infected trees.

Ash rust is seldom destructive enough to warrant either prevention or control measures. Sulfur sprays are sometimes recommended when trees have been infected for successive years or to protect ash for aesthetic reasons. Contact your local extension service to determine the status of sulfur sprays in your area.

In early spring, 5 to 7 ounces of Furadan 10 G should be applied to each one inch of basal diameter in young southern pine plantations. Furadan 10 G should be applied to the soil under the drip-line of the trees and incorporated with a suitable device. Pines planted for Christmas trees should be treated two times per year, once in early spring and once in early summer, using 5 grams in the tree's first year, 10 grams in the tree's second year, 15 grams in its third year, and 20 grams in its fourth year. Five grams equals about one-half of a teaspoon.


