Condo growth spurring industry

Condo dwellers want—and will receive—better quality landscape plantings and maintenance. This represents an additional market for the nursery and landscape industries, reports a select committee of the American Association of Nurserymen.

"New plant material introductions emphasizing small garden, high-intensity planting concepts must occur," says the committee, which meets annually to prepare a list of trends. "Like the single-family home dweller, there will be an increasing need to enhance property value and provide the psychological benefits of a beautiful environment."

Some developers, committee members feel, will operate their own nurseries and maintain landscape crews for the planting and maintenance demanded by tenants of multi-family units.

'Working' folk boost golf's impact

It's not the "idle rich" you see approaching that putt. It's working folk just like you and me. Or maybe our children, our spouses, or our retired parents.

The National Golf Foundation says 60 percent of golfers in the Southeast are either retired, students, or homemakers. The 40 percent making up the "employed" segment of golfers have a median income of \$33,000.

How much do golfers spend on their hobby? A Foundation golfer profile survey of the Southeast suggests an annual figure of \$1,280 for green fees or dues, equipment, cart rental, clothing and shoes. Again, this is a median, meaning that half the respondents reported lower expenditures, half higher.

Distributor turns baseball sponsor

David Meyer, secretary-treasurer of L.W. Meyer & Son in Sullivan, Wis., an Ariens distributor, is a big sports fan. He has found a way to plug both his company and his Milwaukee Brewers.

In each of the last three seasons, he has given the Brewer grounds crew Ariens equipment for field maintenance in exchange for a sponsorship role in local Brewer broadcasts fed to some 50 stations in Wisconsin and Michigan's Upper Peninsula. The Brewers' Charlie Moore is the Ariens spokesman during the telecasts.

"It's helped us," he says, "especially from a product awareness standpoint." On July 22, the Brewers held the third annual Ariens Dealer Appreciation Night where Ariens equipment was paraded around the field prior to the game. Some 256 people representing 100 dealers attended the event.

"The event has grown every year even though the Brewers are far from first place" and not drawing well, he says.

Harry Gill, superintendent of grounds and maintenance at Milwaukee County Stadium, and his grounds crew are now using the equipment on the field, where football's Green Bay Packers play half their home games. Meyer & Son is located some 30 miles west of Milwaukee.

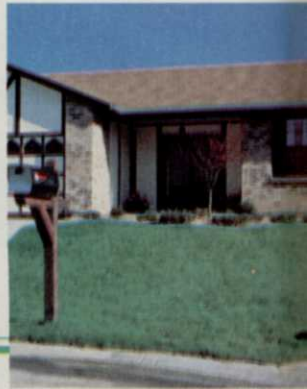

ChemLawn initiates sign-posting program

ChemLawn has begun posting signs on lawns after chemical treatment as part of a test program initiated in July in Montgomery County, Md. The signs read: "Lawn care application. Keep off until dry."

ChemLawn president Jack Van Fossen told a news conference in Rockville, Md., that other parts of the right to know program include notification of application product content, filing of chemical information with local government authorities, licensing of pesticide applicators, and prior notification to those hypersensitive to lawn care chemicals.

"While ChemLawn recognizes the safe nature of the products used in lawn care applications, it also recognizes that both its customers and the community at large may benefit from knowing when and where applications are made, whether on public or private property," says Van Fossen.

He says the right to know program is a result of pending legislation in Montgomery County as well as the trend toward local regulation of pesticides.

Van Fossen says the use of markers on chemically-treated lawns will expand if well-received in Montgomery County. "It is our hope that these markers will become a universally

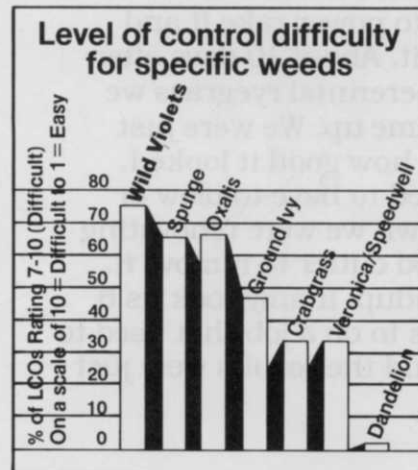
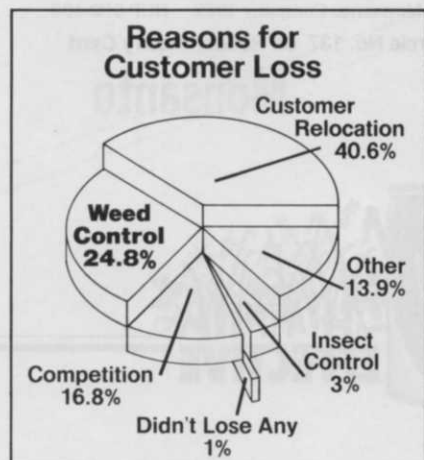
program may be expanded if ChemLawn's evaluation, scheduled for later this year, shows a positive public reaction.

Weed control is cited No.1

Weed control is the key to holding down chemical lawn care customer turnover.

According to a survey conducted at last year's Professional Lawn Care As-



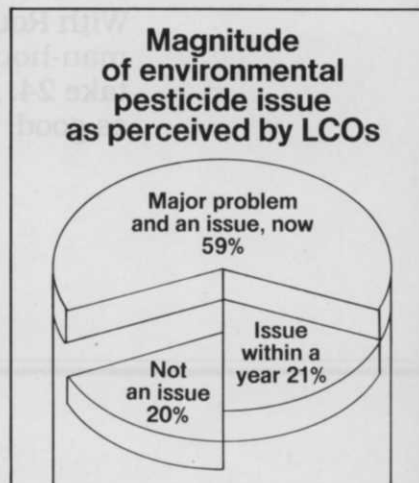
sociation of America convention, unsatisfactory weed control was the No.1 reason given for customer loss among firms with 5,000 or more accounts. Among the largest operations—those with 20,000 or more customers—poor weed control accounted for 58 percent of customer losses.

The No.1 culprit named in the survey was wild violet, with 75 percent of the respondents ranking it the tough-

est-to-control. Oxalis and spurge were next, followed by ground ivy, crabgrass and veronica/speedwell.

Overall, 40 percent of those surveyed reported customer retention rates of 90 percent or more, and 58 percent reported rates of 80 percent or more.

The survey was conducted by Dow Chemical Co., Midland, MI.

\$1.7 billion spent on course maintenance

A joint National Golf Foundation/Golf Course Superintendents Association of America study says U.S. golf courses spend \$1.7 billion annually on maintaining their facilities.

"The Golf Course Maintenance Report," available through the NGF, is based on data from a fall, 1984 survey of more than 2,300 golf courses nationwide.

The study indicates \$137 million is spent each year for new maintenance equipment and \$103 million is spent on projects to improve existing facilities. The remaining \$1.5 billion represents yearly maintenance operating costs.

"Personnel costs constitute the largest single expense category for maintaining the nation's golf courses," says GCSAA executive director Jim Prusa. "On the average, 60 to 70 percent of a golf course maintenance budget is for personnel costs, including salaries and wages, payroll taxes and employee benefits."

Dr. Joe Beditz, NGF director of research, tells WT&T that the courses surveyed ranged from the very small

to the very large. "I consider the figures to be conservative," he says.

The study also says the nation's golf courses have a maintenance equipment inventory valued at over \$1.8 billion.

Dr. Beditz says the expenditure figures will rise steadily in the future as the baby-boom generation ages and more courses are needed to accommodate the number of golfers.

He says another larger, more in-depth study will be conducted this fall on the nation's golfers and courses.

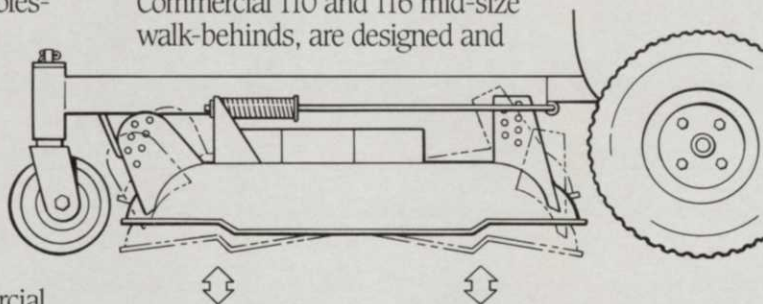

MAINTENANCE

Double engine life with simple measures

George R. Thompson of Briggs & Stratton says four quick procedures provide money-saving performance and longevity dividends with outdoor power equipment.

They are: use clean, "fresh" gas, change oil regularly, service the air cleaner, and clean the cooling system periodically.

Thompson says Briggs & Stratton engines work equally well on regular or lead-free fuels, but lead-free results in reduced combustion deposits and longer engine life. It is not recommended that fuel be used from one season to another. A 30-day supply is adequate.

An oil change is recommended after 20 to 25 hours of engine use. Thompson recommends a high-grade oil with high viscosity. Oil levels should be checked regularly.

If the air cleaner is of the "oil foam" variety it can be cleaned with kerosene or liquid detergent, then re-oiled with clean engine oil. Air cleaner elements should be cleaned

every three months or every 25 hours, whichever comes first, Thompson says, more often under dusty conditions.

A clogged cooling system can cause overheating and eventual engine damage. It's important to clean the cooling system. Debris can enter the blower housing and clog the cooling fins.

Infield action

It's arguably the most exciting play in sports and too often one of the most painful; the simultaneous arrival of baseball and runner and the slide over baked clay at home plate.



Don Sadler, the barrelchested maintenance supervisor for the Canadian city of Etobicoke (pronounced AY-TOE-BE-COE) near Toronto, works to take the sting out of the play. That's just one of the benefits of a properly prepared infield; firm for good footing and true hops, yet soft enough that it doesn't flay a sliding baserunner.

Catch the action any summer afternoon.

He's your boy, he's all arms, legs, and joints working at cross purposes and he's rounding third, jets working. The relay from centerfield to the

shortstop to the plate is chest high. The teen-age baserunner's automatic pilot flashes down, and the runner, right knee tucked, skids in a scraping duststorm of flying gravel.

First there's just a touch of red below the rip in the knee of the baseball pants (pants that some sponsoring merchant shelled out money for and under normal circumstances couldn't be cut with a chainsaw), then the blood spreads along the outside of the calf from knee to ankle.

The composition of the infield is the key. Many of Sadler's fields, particularly the softball fields, contain six inches of worked-in hazemag.

"It's crushed round gravel, not crushed stone," says Sadler. "Crushed stone has jagged edges. You don't want that."

The material—available from most sizable aggregate companies—should be screened to $3/16$ th-inch-minus.

Although Harry Gill, veteran groundskeeper for Milwaukee County Stadium and the professional baseball Brewers, prefers "more pointy" chips of sand and not round beach sand which he feels stays "loose and movey," both groundsmen agree that crushed limestone screenings or rock dust is unacceptable.

Major league groundskeepers' jobs hinge on their ability to provide major league-quality infields, but the infields of many of our community ball fields—most of them totally skin—aren't adequate. Too much clay baked by the mid-summer sun and given perfunctory smoothing and raking, they play like concrete. Rains and they don't drain; players skate.

Sadler, an avid amateur softball player, gives his infields the attention they deserve, including working the material around the bases several inches down with a rake before play.

RCRA amendments

New laws which went into effect last month could play havoc with the profit margins of commercial pesticide applicators.

Amendments to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) passed by Congress last November promise to have the general effect of tightening this country's hazardous waste management rules.

The amendments will bring many small quantity generators (SQGs) under hazardous waste management rules for the first time.

The EPA estimates an added 175,000 businesses that produce small quantities of hazardous waste will be subject to the new regulations.

The amendments lower the minimum regulated quantity of hazardous waste from 2,200 pounds to 220 pounds a month, but will add only another one-half percent (approximately 800,000 metric tons) to the total being regulated.

EPA study

The EPA conducted a survey of 22 industries considered most likely to have newly-regulated generators, including the "pesticide industry." This category is divided into two groups: "pesticide end users," such as golf course superintendents, and "pesticide applicators," such as lawn care service contractors.

Of the 11,000 possible SQGs, about 2,000 generate between 220 and 2,200 pounds a month (from half of a 55-gallon drum to five 55-gallon drums), making them subject to the new hazardous waste regulation.

All those who generate between 220 and 2,200 pounds of hazardous waste per month have begun to use the Uniform National Manifest when shipping hazardous waste off-site. The amendments further mandated that SQG hazardous waste not managed at a full hazardous waste disposal site (a Subtitle C facility), must only be disposed of at a state-approved municipal or industry facility.

By March 31, 1986, the EPA must decree final rules for handling hazardous waste generated in the SQG category.

Some states have been approved by the EPA to administer portions of the hazardous waste management program, but some state requirements may be stricter than federal requirements. Because of this, businesses believing they will be affected by the new regulation should contact their individual state environmental protection agencies.

Statutory requirement

The new RCRA amendments also mandate that on-site storage of hazardous wastes may occur for 180 days (maximum) without a permit (though there are provisions for extensions to

270 days).

During the interim period, SQGs will not be required to fill out all the information on the Uniform National Manifest form, nor complete the entire paper trail from originator to final disposition and back to original generator now required of large scale generators.

The information that must be provided on the manifest form includes the name and address of the generator, the U.S. Department of Transportation description of the waste, the number and type of containers, the quantity of the waste, and name and address of the facility to which the waste is being shipped, according to Barry Stoll, the EPA's assessment program manager for SQGs in the Office of Solid Waste.

Small quantity generators must be wary of waste disposal sites

If you come under the new definition of a small quantity generator (SQG), there are additional complications with RCRA amendments you must be aware of.

"A lot of people forget that even if you comply with all the requirements of RCRA and you send your waste to a site which later has a problem under CERCLA (Comprehensive Environmental Response and Liability Act—also known as the Superfund act), you're in trouble," says Jeff Barnes, a partner in the Cleveland (Ohio) law firm of Squire, Sanders and Dempsey, which has a significant environmental law department.

"CERCLA says if a company generates a hazardous substance, it doesn't have to be a waste," Barnes says, "and that's a very long list which incorporates by reference

the lists that appear in the Clean Water Act and RCRA. That company is responsible for it wherever it ends up.

"So, if your waste ends up in a site which later has to be cleaned up, you may be responsible for the cost not only of cleaning your own waste but 'jointly' for somebody else's wastes in the same dump," he says.

Tony Sasson, the Ohio EPA's small quantity generator expert, agrees. "We just fined a small generator \$7,000 because he gave his material to someone who was just 'passing through,'" Sasson says. "It turned out the transporter took it and just left it beside the road somewhere. We were able to trace it back to the original generator who was held responsible for that." □



Hazardous waste sites like this is what Congress hopes to end with the new RCRA amendments.

"All we're doing is letting the statutory requirement go into effect; we're not trying to impose anything further at this point," says Stoll. "The partial use of the Uniform National Manifest at this point is essentially to serve notice or as a label to inform people handling the material of what is in the shipment."

As the web of information is developed, it is wise (even for small waste generators) to check on their transporters and, if possible, to make an on-site visit to their disposal facilities to be certain things are being handled correctly.

If there is any question about what materials can and cannot be put down local sanitary sewers, it is best to check with the local waste water treatment authority. Some industrial wastes can be accommodated at the local treatment facility, others cannot. The terms and conditions of industrial wastes in sewer streams are controlled under the Clean Water Act.

Probably the first question any

small quantity generator should ask is whether his particular wastes are classified as hazardous. More than 400 chemicals and compounds are listed as hazardous under RCRA, and those lists are being added to constantly. The list appears once a year in the *Code of Federal Regulations* (at 40 CFR Part 260.30). Additions made during the year are printed in the *Federal Register*, as the definition of "hazardous waste" is a moving target.

For the most up-to-date information on listed materials, questions can be addressed to EPA's toll-free hot line, (800) 424-9346. Small quantity generators can also call EPA's Small Business Hotline, (800) 368-5888.

The EPA has a mandate from Congress to go through the full proposal, comment period, and revision cycle before issuing permanent regulations. Also, the EPA is required to undertake an educational/assistance program, working with trade associations and small business organizations, to inform and educate members.

SQGs should make sure their organizations contact the state, regional, and federal EPA's and establish lines of communication.

Other portions of the 1984 amendments which may affect applicators as well:

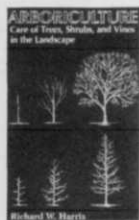
- The Leaking Underground Storage Tanks (LUST) program mandates regulation of underground storage of products and wastes for the first time. No new underground tanks may be installed after May 7, 1985, unless they meet new standards.

- There is also a massive underground tank registration program, to be issued by November, 1985, and implemented by May, 1986.

- Probably the most important provisions are those banning or restricting the disposal of hazardous wastes in landfills. These include a "hammer" provision, which says unless the federal EPA positively concludes that disposal of certain wastes is safe in landfills, the disposal becomes prohibited.

Distributors: optimistic but wary

Green Industry suppliers are becoming more aggressive in a business economy that promises good rewards, but also keener competition and tighter margins.

The concerns—stiffer competition, shorter margins—are real. Distributors and dealers serving the Green Industry can't whistle them away. Even so, the coming months should be good ones, an informal WEEDS TREES & TURF suggests.

Our poll reveals strong distributor enthusiasm for the coming year, guarded optimism for the longer haul. It also shows distributors taking aggressive action to remain players. The stakes in the game are growing, but not fast enough to allow every would-be participant a financial score.

"We are in a growth market so business will be good," says the head of a \$2.5 million dealer/distributorship. "However, margins will continue to be squeezed, particularly on our primary products: fertilizers, chemicals, and grass seed."

Almost 83 percent of those responding to the WT&T query (a surprising 35 percent of those contacted answered) anticipate increased sales in the coming year with 12 percent feeling business will remain about the same. Five percent see sales dropping.

Two out of every three respondents

beefed up inventories for the 1985-86 selling season.

Enthusiasm is tempered, however.

A chemical distributor writes: "More manufacturers. More models. More dealers. Not many more customers."

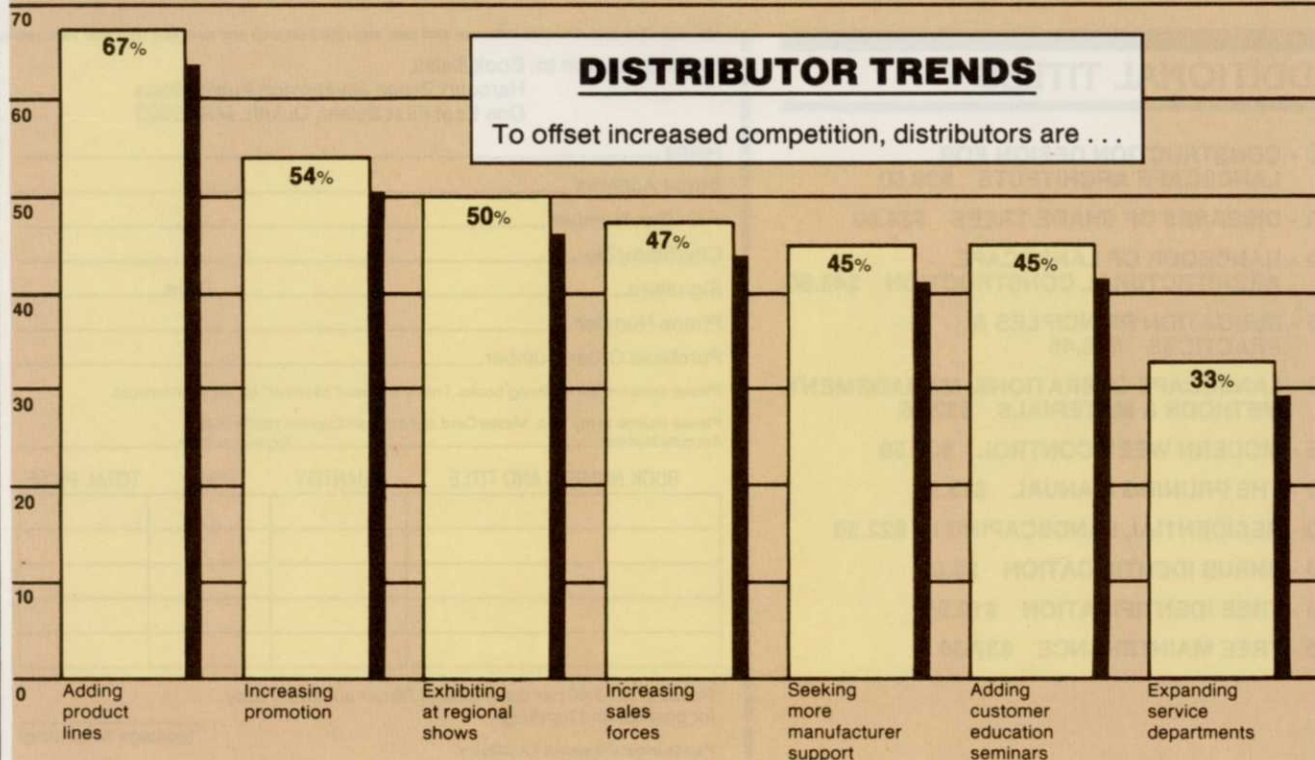

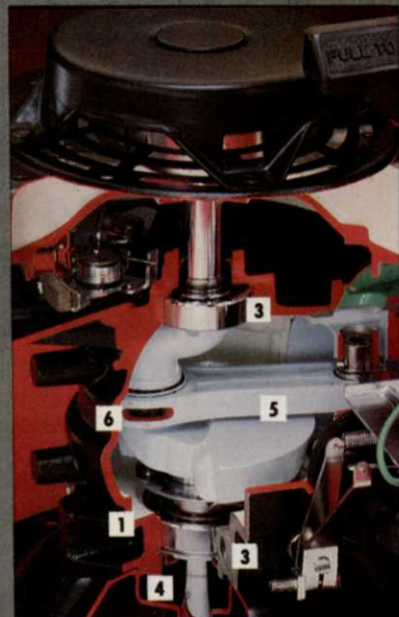

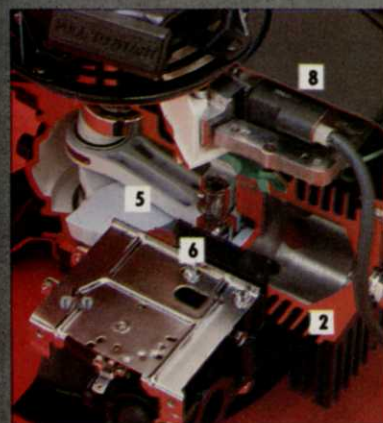

and price pressure exerted by large national and regional operators.

4. Price cutting.

5. Government regulations and the specter of additional ones for chemical applicators.

None stands by itself. All are interconnected. Respondents to the WT&T survey fretted to a lesser extent about the growth of discount chains, credit problems with under-capitalized commercial accounts, and the lack of qualified personnel entering the distributor network.

Lower margins (specifically mentioned as a "trend" by 12% of our respondents) cause one special products manager to reflect: "Just how much service can I provide and still turn a profit?" An equipment distributor sees "some dropouts within the next two to five years. The volume is not there to support a replacement for the farm market or for the consumer market." While a third supplier predicts, "the industry cannot survive on the margins being made today."

Tied to reduced margins is price cutting. Four out of five distributors feel price cutting is "more common" now than a year ago although one distributor described the practice as "not more common, just more intense."

"Many distributors and dealers feel price cutting is necessary," the head of a \$10 million firm notes. "This, of course, has gone on for years but I believe it is increasing due to the success (for a short time) of the retail discount stores."

The distributor-manufacturer relationship, like any marriage of interests, is not without its disagreements. Raising the ire of some distributors are direct sales by manufacturers to large national buyers. Customers benefitting from these sales "look for service locally or look for warranty locally and the local people get nothing

out of the sale," says one businessman.

To offset these trends distributors are:

—Adding product lines. 67% in the WT&T poll indicate they will expand product offerings. Of the remaining 33%, reductions are most often being eyed for similar products from different manufacturers, or low profit items. 33% are expanding service/repair departments.

—Increasing promotion (54% of respondents).

—Seeking more manufacturer support (45%).

—Exhibiting at regional shows (50%).

—Adding education seminars for customers (45%).

—Increasing sales force (47%. Only 5% planned sales force reductions).

And, who are the best customers of the distributors and dealers? Golf course superintendents were near the top of the list for 60% of the respondents followed by landscape contractors (55%), parks and schools (52%), commercial lawn care (35%), general public (30%), and athletic field managers (28%).

Says the president of one \$1.3 million distribution firm, "The business climate is excellent, particularly combined with the decline in interest rates, freeing up loan money and leasing money and at a better rate."

The message coming from the survey: as long as the national economy remains strong most distributors serving the turf and landscape industries are confident they will find ways to prosper.

The realities of increased competition and tighter margins, however, are causing distributors to reassess their offerings (with some expanding into turf-complimentary lines) and to rethink the amount of service they can offer to remain profitable—and competitive.

* * * *

The "typical" respondent to the WT&T survey was either the president, owner, or general manager of a business doing \$2.3 worth of business with golf and landscape customers (high of \$20 million, low of \$30,000). Slightly under half described themselves as both distributors and dealers. Almost two-thirds of those we contacted handled chemicals; 50% dealt with seed, 40% golf course equipment and irrigation supplies, and 33% consumer lawn equipment. 18% of their sales is to homeowners.

On top north of the border

G.C. Duke Equipment Ltd. remains king of Canadian turf equipment distributors by keeping abreast of the newest maintenance equipment. Its reward? \$15 million in annual sales.

Salesman Dick Raycroft eases into the cushioned saddle of the tractor as the huge Dutch-built Verti-Drain aerifier, driving 16-inch spikes into the hardpan of sunbaked parkland, bucks and heaves behind him.

Thirty years of demonstrations like this make G.C. Duke Equipment Ltd. the largest distributor of turf equipment in Canada.

"We sell by demonstration," says Duke sales manager Jim Tanner. "The customer has to see what any piece of machinery can do under his conditions."

Big doings

This month, G.C. Duke Equipment expects to attract 2,000 visitors to its Lawn-O-Rama, a day of equipment

demonstrations and displays wrapped around a fish fry at its five-acre Burlington, Ontario, headquarters. Lawn-O-Rama occurs every other year. Off-years are devoted to six weeks of customer service schools. "Hands on" is Duke Equipment's way of doing business.

The payoff is sales of \$15 million (and growing) annually.

"Our range of equipment includes everything from a \$15 string trimmer to an airport runway snow blower at \$300,000 or a Snorkle, a piece of fire fighting equipment, at \$400,000," says vice-president Richard Duke.

Richard is the son of company co-founder G.C. Duke, who at 80 is still a vigorous force in the business and well known in the Canadian turf industry. The elder Duke started as a commissioned salesman (the garage behind his home was his office), worked that into a dealership and eventually a distributorship.

Gravely was the first manufacturer he represented. He later sold that business to Studebaker.

Company expanding

Today Duke Equipment represents dozens of different manufacturers.

The airport runway equipment is new for the Ontario-based company. It could be profitable. To reflect the addition of heavier equipment several years ago, the company name was changed from Duke Lawn Equipment. "The name was getting us into trouble with some of our bids," Richard Duke recalls.

Turf, however, remains the backbone of the company and accounts for about 80 percent of sales. Says Duke, a big man with a ruddy complexion and 25 years in the business, "Our strength really comes from the golf course and parks industries."

The growth of the business had employees pumping inventory and sales figures into a new IBM 36 computer at the Burlington headquarters from last December to mid-summer. An attractive, young keyboard operator complains with a smile, "If they wouldn't keep adding data, we would be done by now." Duke Equipment has outgrown the capabilities of two previous computer systems.

The company headquartered in Lake Ontario-hugging Burlington (a city of about 100,000 an easy drive up from Niagara Falls) maintains an office in Montreal, direct lines to nearby Toronto, and sells to all of eastern Canada with dealers extending to the Maritimes.

It's a mobile and aggressive sales force that drives Duke Equipment.

Parked outside of Richard Duke's office window is muscular green ¾-ton pickup with sparkling chrome wheels, one of a fleet of 12 that cruises the long but narrow band of the Canadian turf industry. Geography defines

Duke's territory. The 12 salesmen are divided between municipal and dealer/landscape accounts in Ontario and Quebec, concentrating on that 80-mile wide strip containing most of Canada's population.

Selling turf equipment in Canada poses special problems.

"All our salesmen are commissioned and pay their own expenses," Richard Duke says. "We supply the salesmen with the basic trucks and they fix them up with all the options." All 12 trucks are powered by propane, offering a substantial savings in transportation cost.

Two tractor-trailer "traveling billboards" complement the company's road show at field days and demonstrations.

Selling turf equipment in Canada poses special problems.

The American dollar (as of press time) is worth \$1.38 Canadian, and most imported turf equipment is subject to duties of 11 percent plus a 10 percent federal sales tax.

Says Duke: "For mowers and equipment up here, the American list price is the dealer's cost. It's a problem, and it isn't. Everybody up here is faced with the same situation."

Marketers often say that selling to

Canada is selling just 1/10th of what you'd move in the States. Not true, says Duke. Professional mowing takes on more significance than the so-called 10-to-1 ratio would suggest.

Reel mowing popular

Says Duke, "I think there's a lot more reel cutting done here in parks and by landscapers. Reel mowing takes a lot less horsepower per inch of cut, and the maintenance of reel mowers has come down dramatically in the last couple of years."

He adds, "One of the biggest changes we've seen is when reel mowers went hydraulic. We were one of the first to jump on hydraulic mowing." Duke Equipment is the largest distributor of Ransomes reel mowing equipment in North America.

The sophistication of the Canadian turf market is also reflected in the growing importance of such practices as clipping removal and fairway mowing as short as 3/8th an inch. "The golfer is becoming far more demanding, and industrial customers are displaying more pride. They're becoming better corporate citizens," Duke says. "There is something new coming all the time."

When it does, Duke equipment will be there.

"We expect our salesmen to have demonstration equipment with them at all times," says sales director Tanner. "If a manufacturer comes out with a new product, they'll take that too."

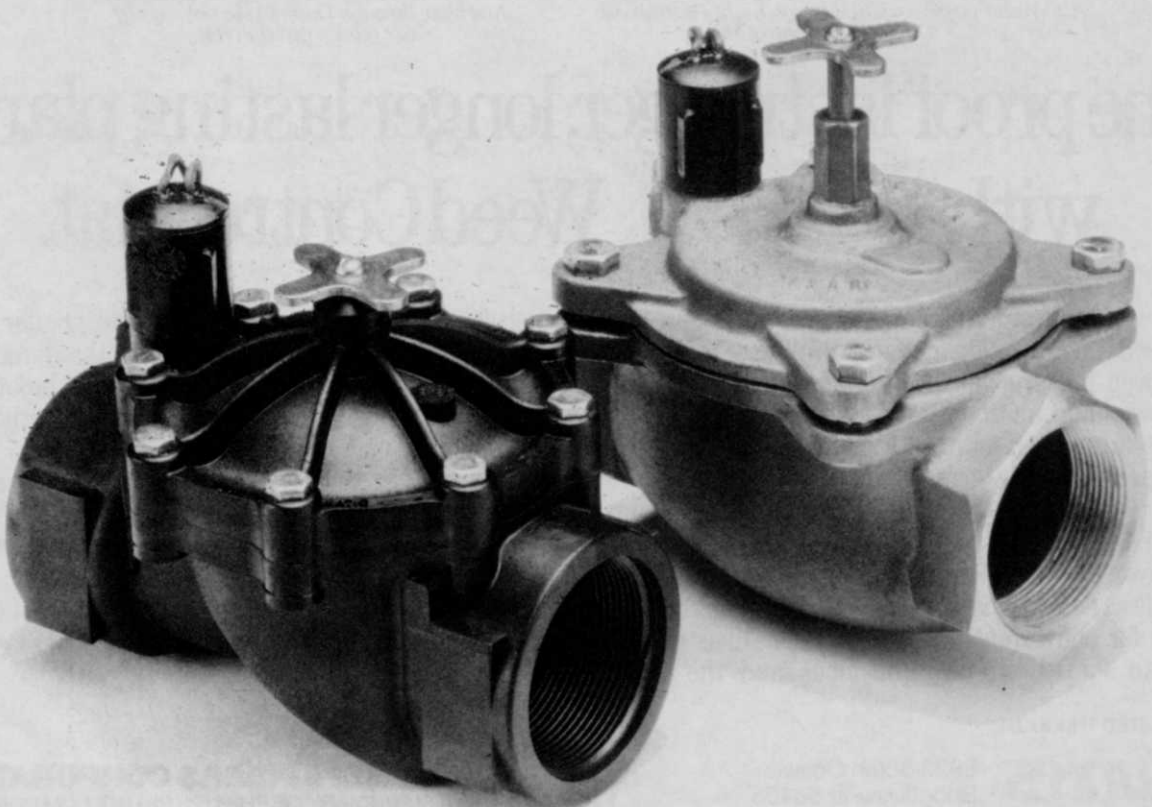

Growing in Florida

A second generation of leaders guide DeBra Turf & Industrial Equipment in the Sunshine State's expanding turf equipment market.

Jud DeBra, tan and trim at 43, his dark hair graying, cranks up the big Chevy, snaps on cruise control and settles in for the 3½-hour drive south from Orlando. Destination: Hollywood, FL. Mission: to stay one step ahead of Florida's turfgrass industry.

DeBra the company official and DeBra Equipment the company are on the move. Hollywood is the busiest of three DeBra Turf & Industrial Equipment Company offices.

"We see things changing here in Florida," Jud DeBra says.

The V-8 bends coastward and miles of scrub pine and acres of grazing cattle give way to gleaming patches of white Florida sand—bulldozed sites of future residential developments and the businesses they spawn. South Florida creeps north. DeBra Equipment, the largest Jacobsen distributor in North America

and guided by a second-generation of family members, will be pushing hard here soon with the addition of an office in Stuart, FL, just north of West Palm Beach.

New generation

Last May, Bill DeBra retired as president. He is one of the five brothers who founded the company. In 1946 he and brothers Don, George, Jack, and Jud, Sr., began selling Cushman scooters and three-wheel vehicles from Tampa and Atlanta, GA, dealerships.

"I guess there is no secret to the success of this business," Bill's son Tom says. "It was just good old hard work. They put their noses to the grindstone and got down to work."

Dave DeBra (Jack's son) is DeBra Equipment's executive vice president. He and Tom direct the East

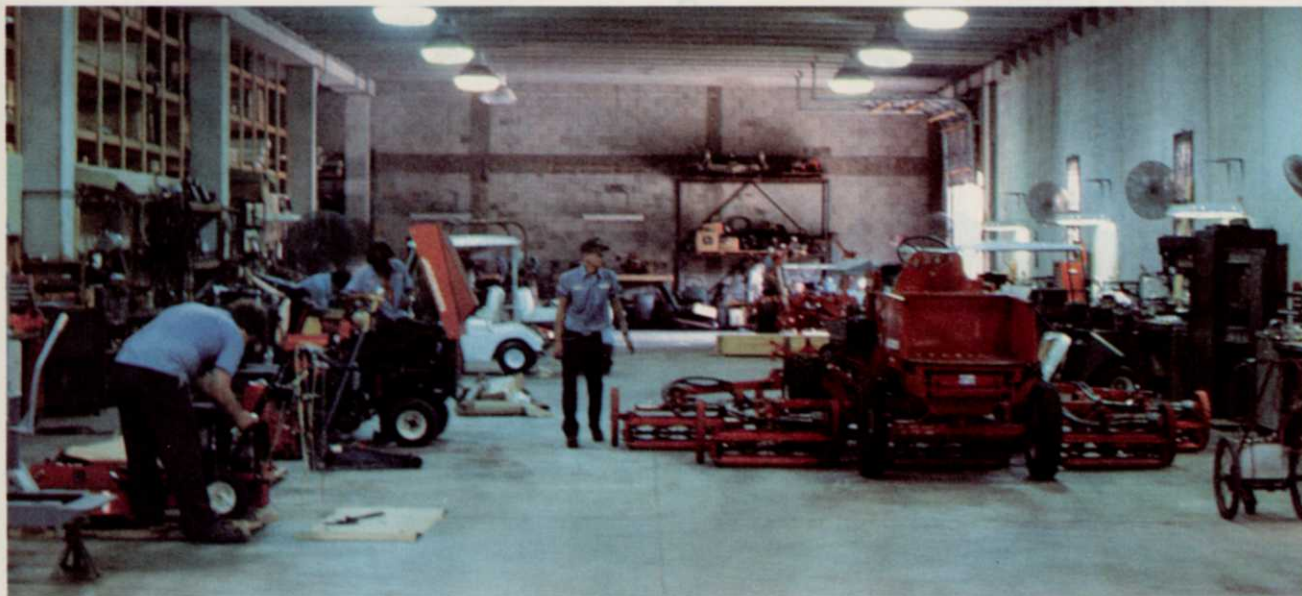
Coast operation out of the Hollywood office. Jud (son of the late Jud, Sr.) is the corporate vice president and directs the West Coast offices of Fort Myers and Tampa. Dave has been with the business 20 years, Jud 17, and Tom, the youngest of the three cousins, four years.

This is the heart of a hard-working and visible management team that takes an active role in community and professional functions. Dave is past president of the Florida Turf-Grass Association.

Golf is king

Hard work is one reason for DeBra Turf's success. Florida golf is another.

Says Jud, "Of the 100 new golf courses built in the country last year, 24 were built in Florida. People come to Florida to be near the water or to be near green. Waterfront property is

getting expensive and scarce, so a lot of Florida development centers around golf courses. Developers can pay for a new course with the sale of lots."

In 1956 the company entered the golf business by leasing golf carts (a service it still provides with the lease of 150 carts to Dade County). Not until 1960—when Jack DeBra moved to Hollywood, FL, just north of Miami—did it plunge into the commercial turf market as a distributor for Jacobsen. The introduction of a riding greens-mower by Jacobsen in 1968 made things happen for DeBra—and for Florida golf course maintenance.

Or as Jud says: "The growth explosion hit."

Latest figures show 770 golf courses in the state. Play is measured at about 34 million rounds annually. A two-year-old study described Florida golf course maintenance as a \$177 million industry with more than 6,000

employees.

Other directions

DeBra Equipment, however, found opportunities in other areas, including government accounts. Although company officials describe this as a "maturing" market, it remains profitable. More exciting is the contract maintenance market flamed by the spread of turfed and landscaped properties up the coasts and inland.

"The biggest growth will be in the landscape business," Jud DeBra adds. "And as the caliber of maintenance is pushed up in the big developments and nice resorts, it will influence the rest of the state about what is the norm and what is acceptable." That translates into the need for professional equipment.

DeBra Equipment, with 15 pickup-truck-equipped salesmen on the road, tries to anticipate these client needs. "Our involvement with residential

developments and condominiums opens new markets for us. It's a natural extension of the services we can offer," says Jud. That attention led DeBra to offer industrial equipment also, including the Clark & American warehouse and factory sweeper and the Netherlands-manufactured Ravo street sweeper. Industrial equipment has shown a 150% sales increase over the past two years, a company spokesman says. Even so, the company picks its markets carefully.

"DeBra takes a conservative approach to growth," says Gary Foote, a Michigan State grad who began his turf career with DeBra, worked the Southeast for Jacobson, then returned to DeBra as parts and service manager. "DeBra doesn't take on lines just to be adding more equipment."

The Florida company, with sales expected to exceed \$13 million this year, now represents more than 70 manufacturers (including Jacobsen, Excel, Smithco, Cushman, and Kubota in two locations). It backs its salesmen with 13 mechanics and a million-dollar parts inventory.

And its service schools are a model in the turf industry. Factory representatives from Jacobsen (which pioneered the idea of a service school) and other manufacturers visit DeBra Equipment offices on a regular basis to provide free hands-on training for client mechanics. Turnouts of 250 to 300 mechanics are common.

"We're working with the same customers over and over so what we do is build relationships with our customers rather than just making sales," Jud DeBra adds. "We know if we can build good customers, they'll be buying good products from us over a period of time."

WT&T

Ivy League player

Manager Phil Mowery put the Bunton Company back in the game in one of the nation's fastest-growing corporate centers—Princeton, NJ.

The ivy-covered walls, the tree-lined streets hadn't changed much in college town. But when Phil Mowery drove 10 minutes north from his boyhood home in Princeton, NJ, five years ago he saw a whole new world of gleaming corporate headquarters and acres of manicured turf. He saw opportunity.

Mowery, 25 years in the lawn and garden industry, says he was "hungry." So he acted.

"It all started over a phone call"—Mowery

He contacted Stan Byers, president of The Bunton Company, a Louisville-based manufacturer of commercial mowers. Presto. Bunton's putting up the money and Mowery's managing a business, a turf equipment distributorship in the middle of corporate boomtown that is alternately being touted as "the New Jersey Sunbelt" and the "next Silicon Valley."

Neither term is entirely accurate. But how do you describe a gold rush for corporate office space in central Jersey, in what had been potato fields and sod farms? We'll talk about that later, but more about the distributor, Bunton Turf Products.

A phone call away

Says Mowery, "It all started over a phone call with Stan (Byers). He set us up. We started with four people and grew from that. We worked out of our homes."

The founders were Mowery, his daughter Penny (who later left the

business to move to Washington, DC), Stan Stevenson, a hefty gregarious man with bearpaws for hands, and slender, dark-haired Dave Walter. Stevenson is Mowery's top sales rep now, Walter the company's parts and service manager.

The distributorship now has 19 employees. It is located in a small rectangular masonry and glass building off narrow Quaker Bridge Road. Not in Princeton, but close enough for lunch.

Mowery's office is not a refuge. His door is open. Everybody—customers, mechanics, salesmen—poke their grins over his desk for greetings or

guidance. The bespectacled Mowery, with the patient, polite demeanor of an accountant (he started his career as a clerk), is a good listener, and when he speaks he chooses his words carefully.

The first thing he wants to make clear is that Bunton Turf Products is owned by the Bunton Company.

New directions

For Bunton, it's a profitable departure and it's planning a second factory branch in South Florida. But, a manufacturer owning its own store isn't unknown in the turf industry.

Yazoo Manufacturing, the Jackson, MS, manufacturer of "Big Wheel" and front-cut riding mowers, controls its own distribution in Memphis, TN, Houston, TX, and Birmingham, AL. It has for more than 30 years. Howard Day, Yazoo's marketing vice president, says Yazoo factory branches sell as well as its independent distribu-

tors. Other manufacturers, however, have gone in the opposite direction.

The Toro Company sold its three final company-owned distributorships in 1978, the same year that Cushman/OMC Lincoln dealt its store, Cushman Motor Sales.

The Bunton Company's decision to bankroll the New Jersey operation, although bucking recent trends, is working. Says Mowery, "we've grown anywhere from 20 to 30 percent each year and it's still growing." Later this year the size of the company-owned store will be doubled. In addition to Bunton products, the distributorship handles Sarlo and Ryan mowers, Honda engines, and Lo-Blo leaf blowers. Additional lines will be added, Mowery says.

The distributorship, Bunton Turf, sells from the showroom and through dealers. "Believe it or not, that hasn't been a problem," Mowery says. "When we set up a dealer we tell them we also sell direct. Selling direct has been profitable, but we want to be known as a distributor."

Bunton Turf's four salesmen cover almost all of New Jersey, including parts of Pennsylvania and Long Island. One salesman sells the golf course and municipal markets exclusively. These markets are new to Mowery's business and he's optimistic. "They will fall into place. We

know enough about it. We've stayed on top of it," he says.

Boom times

Mowery credits much of the New Jersey distributorship's success to Bunton Company president Byers. "The man has great forecasting ability and he's willing to take a gamble," Mowery says. "He could see the growth that was going to happen here."

Growth? How about explosion?

The epicenter is the Princeton Corridor, an 18-mile-long stretch of U.S. Route 1 from Princeton north to New Brunswick.

Within the past 10 years more than eight million square feet of office space (enough to almost fill the World Trade Center) grew up along this highway. The total should jump to 10.6 million (more than downtown Milwaukee) by 1992.

This corporate office explosion, touched off when Princeton University set aside 1,600 acres for its Forrestal Center "corporate campus" in 1975, erupted with the addition of other neighboring private developments: Carnegie Center, 744 acres; Princetonpark Corporate Center, 650 acres; and Princeton Corporate Center, 98 acres.

Corporate bosses appreciate Central Jersey's sylvan settings, its proximity to New York and Philadelphia, and the Princeton mailing address which they see as prestigious. Image. It's important down to the turfed and landscaped grounds of the corporate buildings.

The Forrestal Center contains 500 acres (nearly one-third of the Center) of permanent open space. Other developers, eager to attract tenants and to head-off cries that they're gobbling up prime real estate without consideration for the the pastoral countryside, are following suit. That's a lot of manicured grass.

"I've seen peaks and valleys," says Mowery, "but this is probably the longest good period I've seen—and it hasn't peaked yet. Not in this area anyway."

Bunton boss Byers, although not downplaying the area's growth, puts the success of the distributorship in more personal terms. "We knew we weren't getting the market penetration we should in this area, and the right guy (Mowery) came along. He runs it like he owns it."

Mowery responds, "I think Stan found some people who were hungry enough to make it work." **WT&T**

A Distributor and Much More

Reinders Brothers of Elm Grove, Wisconsin, has roots dating to the 1860s. More than 100 years later, the company's services are still expanding to meet the needs of its varied clientele.

When Bob Reinders talks about his business, he can't help smiling.

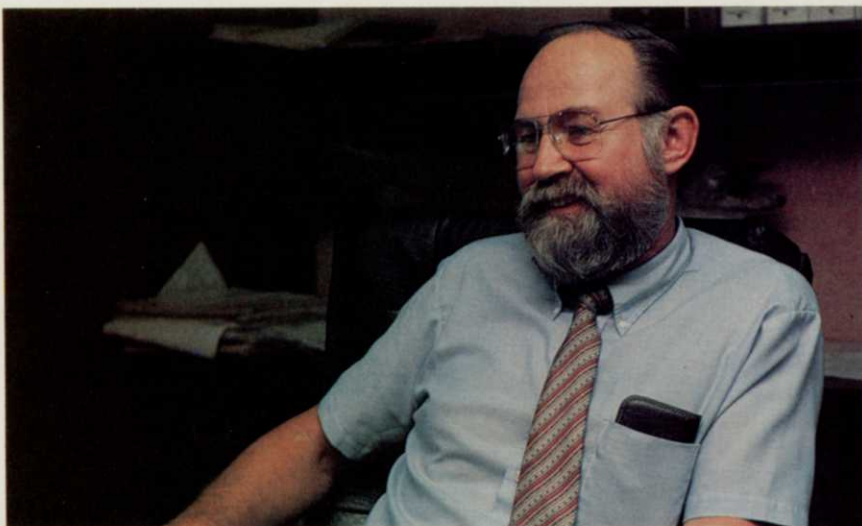
Yeah, he has the problems most turf equipment distributors have—customers with cash flow problems, problems with manufacturers, hot and cold sales and weather seasons. But company secretary Reinders, who operates Reinders Brothers Inc. of Elm Grove, WI, along with brother Richard (vice-president) and 80-year-old father Roland (president), takes the bad with the good. And the last 30 years have been mostly good for the Toro distributor.

The reasons? An ever-increasing list of services ranging from turf equipment and supplies to irrigation equipment and supplies, to consumer power equipment, to wild bird feed, to salt products, to retail garden supplies. Reinders Brothers, once Elm Grove's general merchandise store, continues as a sort of general supplier for those in the turf and irrigation business.

An aggressive company

Bob Reinders is an avid hunter and fisherman. His suburban Milwaukee office is lined with his conquests, including a tremendous muskie landed in a Wisconsin lake. A big man given to staccato speech and hand gestures, Reinders enjoys the public relations work involved in promoting a multi-million dollar operation. Far from pretentious—yet quick to point out his company's strength—he is quietly aggressive.

And so is his company. He and Ed Devinger, manager of the turf division, realize that the company's success (\$11 million in sales in 1984) is due partly to that aggressive stance. Devinger, a friendly man with a booming

voice, has been with the company since 1971. Before that he was a golf course superintendent in Iowa and then a five-year man in fertilizer sales. They agree that you can't relax and spend your time tallying profits if you want to make it.

"Yeah, we're aggressive," says Devinger. "You have to be to survive. It's survival of the fittest in this business." Adds Reinders: "I think our competitors would tell you that we're aggressive. We're hungry and I think we see some of our competition not being as hungry as they once were."

In the Reinders' turf division, six outside salesmen comb the eastern $\frac{2}{3}$ of Wisconsin and Michigan's Upper Peninsula. They're young, experienced in turf, and more than order-takers. They want to survive.

"Our sales people have a genuine

interest in the customer," says Devinger, lighting a Newport. "Sometimes it's awfully difficult to convey that to the customer. The point I always try to make to them is that there's no way that getting their business today is going to make us rich. We have to get it tomorrow, then the next day, and the next day."

Devinger doesn't get out on the road much but handles much of the inside turf sales.

"We've got to do what's right by you and if we can't come back with a smile on our face and on the customer's then we don't want the business. No one order is that important," says Devinger.

Complementing divisions

When sales orders in Reinders' turf division slow down, sales orders in

the irrigation division increase.

This summer has been particularly dry in Wisconsin. "There's been a drought," says Devinger. "I mean there is no grass to cut. But the irrigation division is absolutely knee-deep in work. When it happens the other way—it's raining and the grass is growing—we're selling equipment and the irrigation division's phone

isn't ringing. There's a great complement there," he adds.

Reinders Brothers occupies 10 acres of land in the sleepy town of Elm Grove (population: 6,735), a 20-minute drive from downtown Milwaukee. Irrigation equipment occupies a good chunk of the land. There's room for expansion and if the irrigation division continues to grow, it will occupy even more space.

Bob Reinders doesn't mind. With brother Richard directing the division, irrigation has turned into big business for Reinders Brothers. The company, offering full lines of both Toro and Rain Bird irrigation equipment, covers the same territory with its irrigation division as it does with turf.

"We'll take a job from A to Z," says Reinders. "We consult with contractors for installation purposes, we'll design an irrigation system for a golf course or condominium or you name it. We'll do it for the contractor, we'll do it as a consultant, we'll general the job if it has to be—the big jobs that run a couple hundred thousand dollars."

Reinders also functions as a manufacturer within its irrigation division. They build pumping plants and wholesale to other distributors.

The Turf Conference

Yet another service Reinders provides the customer is its Turf Conference, held every other year in neighboring Waukesha. In 1985, over

1,400 attended the March conference. It's not a cheap undertaking—cash outlays totalled almost \$20,000 this year excluding labor.

After all attendee and exhibitors' fees are collected, it still registers red figures. But Reinders will continue to sponsor the event, with its well-known speakers and top-of-the-line equipment displays.

It's a standing joke among Reinders employees that the show is a hassle because of the work involved, but Devinger and Reinders know the service it performs.

"We know it's worthwhile," says Devinger. "We realize it has definite benefits. It's a lot of work, but it's worth it."

Reinders Brothers also hosts a series of one-day educational seminars each year throughout Michigan and Wisconsin. This year's events, held July 29-Aug. 9, took place in rural areas like Escanaba, MI; Franklin, WI; Bristol, WI; and Beaver Dam, WI.

Stick Cities, yes, but Reinders aims at serving all his customers no matter where their locations.

Still growing

Bob Reinders has seen "continuous growth" in each of the 30 years he's been with the company. Sales figures topped the million dollar mark in 1969 and grew to \$9 million 10 years later.

Today's annual sales figures of \$11 million indicate the company has sprouted nicely from its roots as a grist mill run by Reinders' relatives in the 1860s.

Three expansions, the most recent just completed, have increased building space to 100,000 square feet. A good chunk of Elm Grove is occupied by Reinders Brothers. Reinders gives most of the credit for his success to his customers.

"We feel we get our business from the quality of the people out there. They know their equipment, their chemicals, they know their business," says Reinders. "They're sharp, they're educated. That's one of the reasons we're successful."

Reinders cites a steady service organization as a second reason for his company's success. And finally, the product.

"We have good products to sell. We think we have the best—be it Cushman, Ryan, Toro, or Rain Bird. Plus our allied lines are super. Any allied line that comes out we normally can get hold of," he says.

Adds Devinger: "We set the pace. The competition looks to us." **WT&T**

Team Management

Knowing how to motivate your staff and letting employees know how they're performing is the cornerstone of efficient management.

In the August issue, we started to talk about team management and the requirements for good hiring and interviewing.

We can assume that you have hired wisely and now are starting to have problems with motivation and retention.

In a team management system, there are certain questions that every member of the team asks, and a good manager will be responsive to these in order to make the team work well with a high motivational level. The biggest question is always, "What's in it for me?"

Owners often announce that they are building a team workforce that is as motivated as they are personally, as if that will take care of all of the problems facing the company.

If you have employees that are part-time, paid minimum wage, and working on an unset schedule, you can announce that you have put together a team all you want—but it won't help to motivate employees. You must make a personal commitment.

Ten commandments

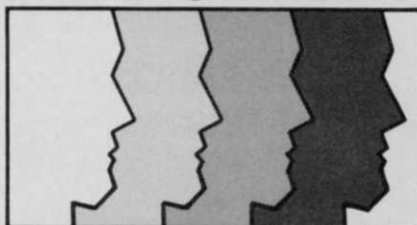

tivation of employees, and their research, coupled with our own, has led to the development of the following list of 10 rules for motivation that you can follow to build a team atmosphere in your company.

■ **1. The manager has the responsibility for motivating the team.**

The key to motivation is communication . . . feedback, both positive and critical, helps let a person know that they are appreciated.

Don't believe you can recruit "self-motivators" all the time. There aren't that many around. If you won't take the responsibility for performance of the team, why should the team members?

■ **2. What is motivational to you may not be motivational to the team members.**

The "Golden Rule" works in a lot of situations, but don't think that team members are motivated by the same factors and rewards that you are. Many managers make this mistake and can't seem to figure out why the team is less than successful.

■ **3. Take care of basic needs first.**

If the team members are making a low salary, they will worry more about that fact than they will about whether the company is successful. Talk to your employees: they will usually tell you what they need to be motivated. If you can do something about these needs, you will have a better chance of motivating the team. You will still have to manage effectively to do so.

■ **4. Money, or salary, is not a motivator.**

If you think money is a motivator, ask yourself what would happen if you raised all the salaries 50 percent. Do you think you would get a 50 percent increase in output? Salary is something that we need to live on, not a motivational factor. Motivation comes from management, not money.

■ **5. The key to motivation is communication, specifically feedback.**

If someone knows that their work is being watched and appreciated, it is likely that they will work harder than if they simply go about their job with no feedback from their manager. Feedback, both positive and critical, helps let a person know that they are appreciated. This is called recognition.

■ **6. Most people in organizational life could wear a large sign on their forehead asking, "How am I doing?"**

Remember that feedback is neither positive nor negative. It is communication in both modes. Letting someone know how they are doing is a key to motivation.

■ **7. Set objectives that can be met.**

This seems so simple that many managers forget it. Give every team

member an objective that he or she can reach. Simply telling them to "Be better!" or "Work smarter!" isn't managing, it's chanting slogans. If someone can achieve in your organization, they might want to stay.

■ 8. For many people, what they do to earn a living isn't what they do to establish their own personal image.

The higher up in an organization a manager goes, the more the job becomes a part of his or her total outlook. For entry level people, this isn't necessarily true. Don't confuse your personal commitment to the organization with the motivation of an entry level worker. They aren't the same.

■ 9. If your employees can't see how

the goals of the organization meet with their own, they aren't going to be motivated.

By talking to your employees you can find out what they are trying to get by holding their job. Once you know the reasons that someone takes a job in your organization, you can be motivational.

■ 10. There is a big difference between motivation and inspiration.

Motivation occurs over a period of time and is a mixture of both internal and external forces. Inspiration is temporary. It can be used under high stress to get a team to perform at maximum levels, but it is very tiresome to have a manager who constantly tries to be inspirational.

Motivation requires the manager to manage, not to yell things in a loud voice. That's why it's so tough to bring about.

Motivation is a very complicated human process.


We wish we could write down everything it takes to be a good motivator. Fortunately it's hard, and this separates the good from the average. The good managers will take the time to motivate properly and the average ones won't.

It's a choice that every manager has to make, to be good or to be average. How about you?

A New Tool

Cloning and genetic recombination to tailor new cultivars to specific purposes.

Biototechnology, a tool for speeding up the process of evolutionary development, will have a significant impact on landscape horticulture. Biototechnology is the understanding and manipulation of biological systems to propagate new clones by genetic recombination or through selection.

One technique of propagation, specifically propagation of trees by cuttage, stimulates the introduction of regionally-oriented cultivars from superior trees, using current technology.

In selecting regional cultivars, a frequent concern is provenance, a photo-periodic response affecting vegetative growth, carbohydrate storage, abscission, dormancy, and overall winter hardiness. Further, when selecting cultivars, factors such as disease resistance, environmental tolerance, and/or unique phenotypic expression (habit, flower color, and/or fruit color) may be important. These new cultivars can result in designed or tailored trees for use in parks, street, home, or commercial landscapes.

Propagation of trees by softwood cuttage (see Table 1) has been proven successful for certain species or cultivars.

From the aforementioned list of trees that can be clonally propagated by cuttage from current season's wood, it becomes apparent that many crab apple cultivars, a significant number of maples and several native trees, (American hophornbeam and pin oak, for example) can be produced using this technique.

This propagation approach, which is successful 65 to 100 percent of the time, should lead to the stimulation of selection, development, introduction, and use of new cultivars. With many plants being propagated by cuttage (that is using parts of the plant and regenerating the missing portion), regional cultivars should be available in increasing numbers.

The advantages of propagation by cuttage include reduced suckering and elimination of incompatibility. Yet it allows the introduction of superior native trees that are tolerant to disease, low-oxygen soils, and chlorides.

This should lead to the increased availability of clones from native trees such as *Ostrya*, linden, pin oak, dogwood, and magnolia.

Further, hedge maple, Japanese maple, and sugar maples, exhibiting tolerance of low oxygen-high water tables, can be selected and introduced. Plants which are normally difficult to propagate, such as paperbark maple (*Acer griseum*), can be propagated by cuttage relatively easy and should stimulate their additional use.

Finally, many crab apples, such as "Mary Potter," "Profusion," "Red Jewel," "Snowdrift," "White Angel," and Sargentii, are a few proven cultivars or species that are disease resistant and can be propagated by cuttage. Propagation by cuttage should become one more biotechnological technique which should stimulate the introduction of superior shade or flowering trees. **WT&T**

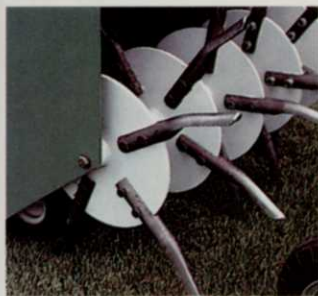

A GUIDE TO LANDSCAPE MANAGEMENT CONTENTS

The science of landscape management today is more of planning ahead than reacting to problems. Products that prevent weed problems with predictable control have replaced emergencies. When curative products are required, the problem is often less serious when preventative measures were originally taken than if they were not. Advances in preventative products, such as preemergence herbicides, have improved the predictability of results landscape managers depend on. Weed prevention in cool-season grasses

Each year, unwanted grass and broadleaf weeds are a multimillion dollar problem. They rob beauty from lawns, golf courses and landscaped areas; steal water, nutrients and profits; and squander millions of dollars in labor as workers try to remove them.

But in weed control, an ounce of prevention truly is worth a pound of cure. That's why more and more professionals are using preemergence herbicide programs to control weed problems before they get started.

Turf management practices differ according to the turfgrass manager's needs. Length and spectrum of control are two of the most important variables turfgrass managers must decide upon when choosing a preemergence herbicide. For the turf manager who wants control of specific problem weeds such as crabgrass in the spring, or poa annua in the fall, the full season preemergence herbicide may not be necessary. Control of the target species

Weed prevention in warm-season grasses

For years, southern turf managers have had to take products developed for northern turf and adapt them to their situation. Today, a number of products have been introduced specifically for warm-season turf maintenance.

The southern turf season is considerably longer than its northern counterpart. Management programs for both warm-season turf and winter overseeded turf are necessary. Preemergence herbicides, such as *Balan*, have long played an important role in both programs.

Southern turf managers typically apply preemergence herbicides in February or early March for crabgrass, barnyardgrass, and foxtail control. In June, they re-apply for goosegrass control. Finally, annual bluegrass is a threat from October through December.

In addition to length of control, preemergence herbicides vary in their effectiveness on target weeds. *Balan* has shown consistent effectiveness against

As in the North, the lawn care industry in the South needs a preemergence product that fits their treatment cycles. The longer residual and improved goosegrass control of XL gives lawn care companies improved weed control for their customers. An XL

Controlling turf diseases

Preventative maintenance is not only an issue when dealing with annual grass and weed control. The same concept holds true when dealing with turf disease control. Preventative measures for dealing with diseases of the turf allow the turf manager to control the turf pathogens before they reach the visible symptom state, when control measures become more costly, not to mention the fact that the damage is already evident, unsightly and detrimental to the health of the overall stand of turf.

PROBLEM SOLVERS

Quackgrass headaches

Problem: I think we have a quackgrass problem in our lawn. Would you please describe how it can be identified and also how it can be controlled? I would appreciate your comments. (Pennsylvania)

Solution: Quackgrass (*Agropyron repens*) is a perennial weed which spreads by lateral, underground, whitish stems called rhizomes with many nodes (joints) and pointed tips. These tips can turn upward and become fast-growing leafy shoots. The plant produces roots from the nodes. Every leaf has a membranous "ligule" at the base of the leaf where it joins the sheath, and a pair of small, hook-like "auricles" which clasp around the stem.

There is no herbicide registered for selectively removing quackgrass from established lawns. Non-selective herbicides like Roundup can be used but they will kill the desirable grass also. A quackgrass problem can be minimized by following good cultural practices.

Reports indicate quackgrass is not able to compete with a well-maintained turf with good density. Repeated mowing, especially if the mower is not set low, can create stress on quackgrass. Maintain a good turfgrass management program, such as mowing and fertilization, to improve the density and health of desirable turfgrass. Well-maintained turfgrass may crowd out and reduce quackgrass over a period of several years. Remember that reinfestation of quackgrass can occur through seeds or rhizomes from nearby areas or from topdressing materials.

Moles a gridiron problem

Problem: How do you get rid of ground moles in a football field? (Michigan)

Are there any new products to eradicate moles other than using Oftanol for grubs? (Indiana)

Solution: Moles damage lawns and gardens through their tunneling activities in search of insect larvae and earthworms. They dig a network of deep tunnels (10-18 feet deep) for permanent use and a network of surface burrows with characteristic ridges of soil above them for temporary use.

These tunnels cause grass roots to die and present a problem while mowing. Moles are active tunnelers and can tunnel at a rate of 12-15 feet per hour. Sometimes surface tunnels can be formed at a rate of one foot per minute. Surface tunnels are used once for feeding and then abandoned.

Moles are difficult to control because they live mostly within their deeper tunnels. Common control measures include: trapping, elimination of food supply by use of insecticides, use of poisonous baits, or fumigation. Trapping and the elimination of in-

sects are the most effective control measures.

Traps (harpoon or choker seem to work best) should be set near tunnels that are in current use. To detect inhabited tunnels, roll or tramp down the ridge of soil. If the tunnels are raised the next day, set the trap in that place and repeat this for several days. Deeper tunnels can be located by pushing a pointed rod or stick into the ground.

If grubs are the major source of food they should be controlled with insecticides. Poisoned baits are usually not effective because moles, being carnivorous, generally ignore them. Gas treatments don't solve the problem because gases diffuse out of the tunnels.

However, reports indicate that a fumigant tablet called Phostoxin can effectively eliminate moles.

First, inspect the property and detect all active burrows showing signs of freshly excavated soil. Abandoned burrows often end abruptly and collapse. For effective control, large portions of active burrows should be treated. Carefully make holes in the top of the burrows and place two Phostoxin tablets every five to ten feet in the active burrows. Moist but not wet conditions are preferred for treatment. Seal the hole with wadded paper and soil. Wait for three days and then tramp or roll the untreated area. Repeat treatment may be necessary if new burrows develop. Read the label and follow the directions.

Another report suggests that Juicy Fruit gum (Wm. Wrigley Jr. Company) also can manage the mole problem. Wear gloves to avoid getting human scent on the gum, make holes in the active burrows, unwrap a fresh pack of gum, roll each piece like a carpet, place them in the burrows, and seal the openings with sod. Moles cannot digest chewing gum and die a day or so after eating it.

Unightly raised areas should be leveled with light rolling using a tank roller without the water. Make sure the area is moist but not wet to avoid compaction. This should help minimize problems during mowing.

Nutrient pellets feed container stock

Controlled release plant nutrition in the form of egg-shaped pellets might be a valuable tool for nurserymen in keeping container stock healthy and vigorous for long periods of time. One company, Estech, Inc., will soon introduce a 6-gram "briquette" to complement its established 16-gram Woodace pellet.

Research conducted at the Burden Research Center, near Baton Rouge, LA, by Director Dr. Warren Meadows and Don Fuller, a research associate, suggests smaller packaged briquette formulations could have advantages nurserymen might want to consider. But are they effective?

Yes, say the researchers.

Nurserymen who use fertilizer briquettes correctly can maintain the vigor of stock long after it is moved into wholesale channels and even several months beyond.

The root system of the containerized plant surrounds the briquettes, and the matrix—the coating which surrounds the actual plant food—maintains a desirable rate of release for use by the plant.

The Woodace briquettes contain IBDU as the source of nitrogen. IBDU is known for slow release by soil hydrolysis; the product does not require soil bacterial action to release.

High temperatures do not appreciably increase the rate of nitrogen release and cold weather slows release only slightly and where needed. Plants have the opportunity to harden off.

The researchers note the smaller-sized pellets provide more surface area (in relation to their size) and a

higher release pattern.

And they are handy. Application using a dibble is made only once during the growing season.

Error is minimized because workers are given a number of briquettes to add to each container—as opposed to having to measure a specific amount. Also, no topdressing is needed as is common, usually on a monthly basis.

Also, briquettes are not subject to leaching. Container plants normally get 1/2 inch of water daily and a quick release nitrogen will readily leach, with loss to the owner.

Although the studies concentrated on the use of briquette plant nutrition for container stock in 1 and 3-gallon containers, preliminary trials indicate excellent potential for the 5, 10, 20, 30, and 50 gallon containers also. The research center recently began formal studies on these larger sizes. Greater periods of control release plant feed-

ing may be possible.

"I think their (briquettes) potential is going to be in the larger containers because of the long release factor," says research associate Fuller. "There might be some potential in using the briquettes on outside landscape material also."

But Fuller feels acceptance of the briquettes will ultimately be determined by commercial cost effectiveness.

Researchers feel they can take most any fertilizer material on the market today and adapt it to use on woody ornamentals. But each material has a prescribed use determining both amount and frequency of application. A grower finds what best fits his own operation.

Nurserymen may be using more of the controlled release, briquette form of nutrition to provide healthy and attractive stock months beyond the nursery itself, a better situation for grower and dealer. Fuller says it's not uncommon for retailers to get plants and not know how to handle them until they show symptoms of being nutritionally starved.
