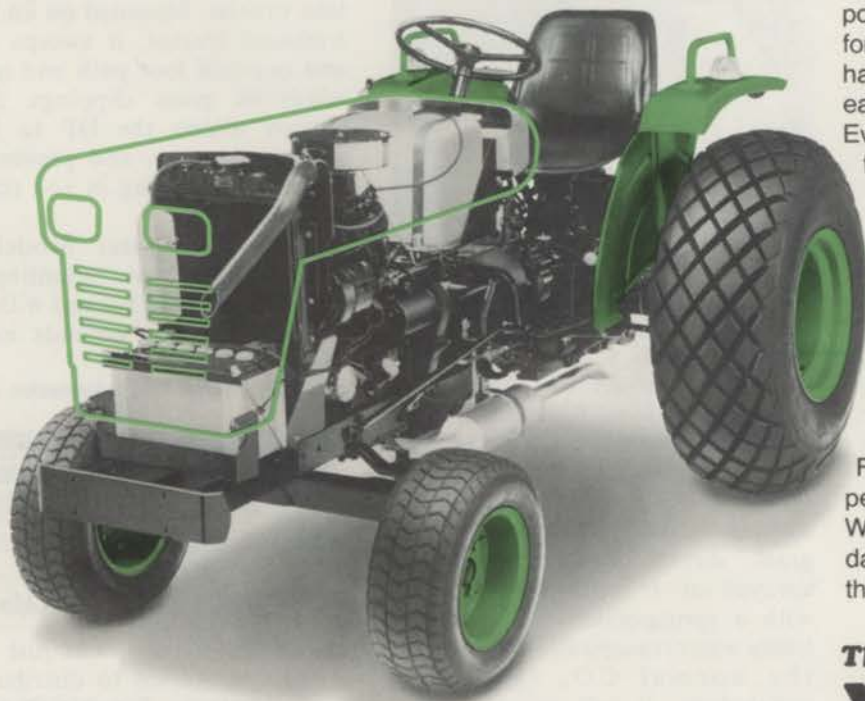

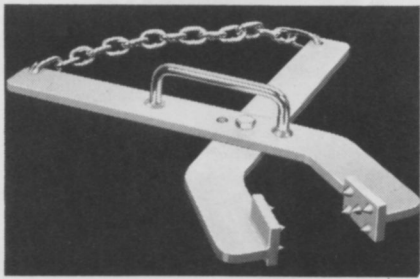

Pallet Puller Division, National Packaging Corporation has introduced their newly designed **Shark Pallet Puller** to remove loaded Pallets from trucks.

The new pallet puller is inserted into the center 2 x 4 (or 4 x 4, 4 x 6) of the pallet and attached by chain to the forklift truck on the street. When the forklift moves away from the truck, the sharp teeth of the puller grips firmly and the pallet moves to the rear of the truck.

One of the primary features of the Shark Pallet Puller is that it has a handle to assist in applying it to the middle rung of the pallet. It has the ability to pull a loaded pallet of six to ten thousand pounds positively because it has hardened steel jaws. It will work equally well with either soft or hard wood strings. It will accommodate even a 1/2" wooden stringer, as the jaws will close completely.

The Shark is cadmium plated to make it more durable in normal situations.

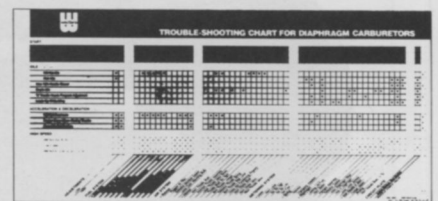

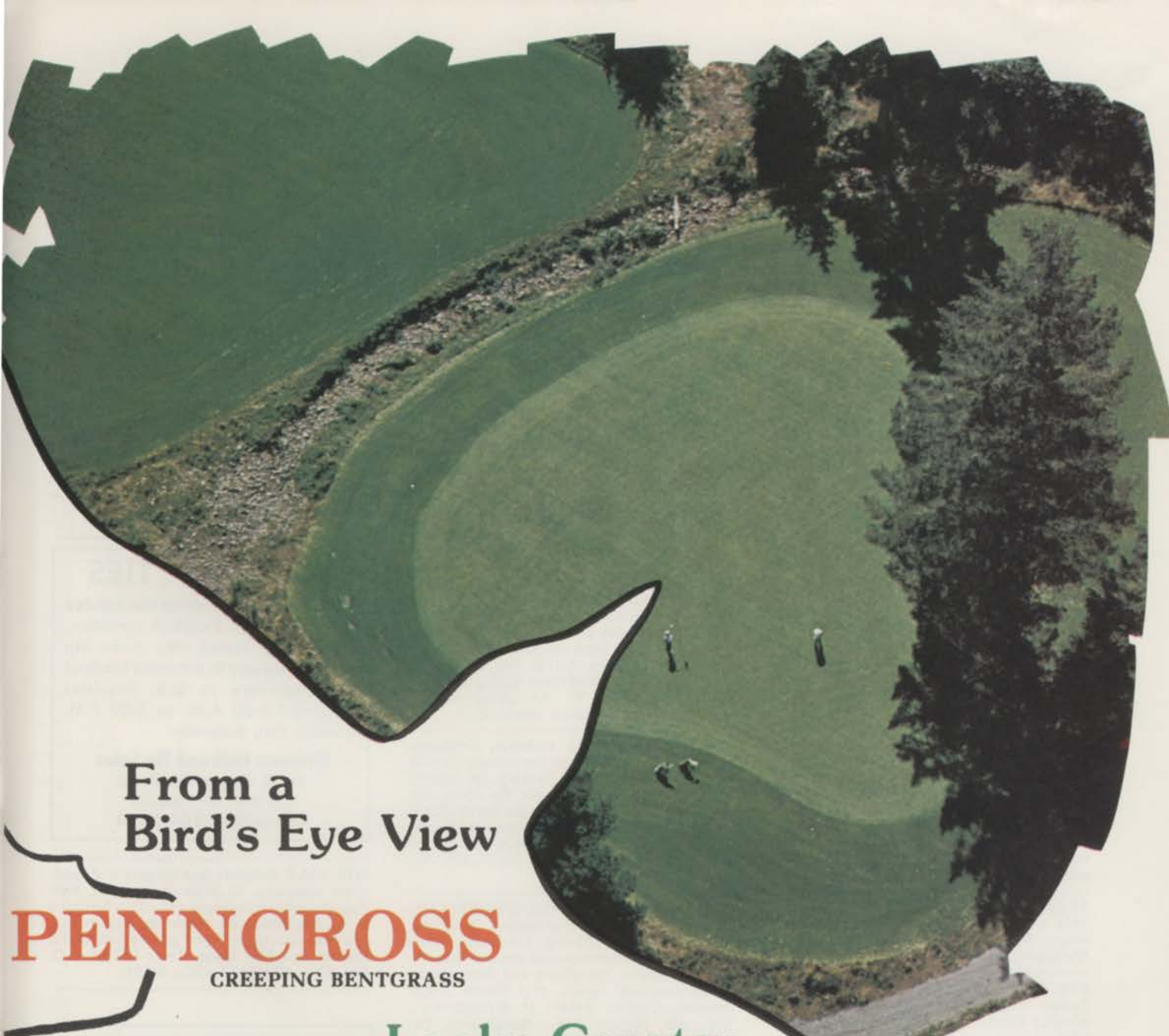
