counteract the force of winter winds prior to root growth. Deciduous trees and shrubs offer little wind resistance and staking may be unnecessary.

Fall is an excellent time to apply mulches. Mulching helps conserve moisture, discourage weeds, and reduce frost heaving and possible root damage. Composted materials (bark, wood chips, or leaf mold) provide moisture and temperature benefits without taking soil nitrogen to decompose.

Recent research has shown excessively thick layers of mulch, more than three inches, can damage shallow-rooted plants. Mulch depth should be watched and overmulching avoided.

Turf

Sodding new turf areas is still possible through October with good success, depending upon the weather. As one moves south, sodding can continue through November. A rule of thumb is one should be able to mow the sod twice before the onset of winter.

October is a good month for broadleaf weed control. Advantages to fall weed control include reduced damage to deciduous plants by drift and leaching, desired cool-season turfgrasses have time to fill in for weeds before the next weed season (June), and areas shaded by deciduous trees are now sunny.

Difficult to control weeds, such as chickweed and henbit, and standard dicot weeds, such as plantain and dandelion, can be controlled as long as they are actively growing. Standard phenoxy herbicides are still effective in October and burn potential is reduced. **WTT** 

# LANDSCAPE LOG

#### **OCTOBER JOB FOCUS**

- 1. Trees and Shrubs
  - a. transplanting
  - b. mulching, winter protection
- 2. Turf
  - a. sodding
  - b. weed control

October is a key month for transplanting deciduous trees and shrubs, weed control, late season sodding, and winter protection.

#### **Trees and Shrubs**

Fall is second only to spring as the best time to transplant deciduous trees and shrubs.

Physiologically, plants require less moisture after losing their leaves and becoming dormant. Transplanting success is improved to the 80 to 95 percent range by using balled and burlapped plants.

Basic guidelines for transplanting are: the hole should be 6 to 12-inches deeper and wider than the ball; addition of manure, compost or peat moss to topsoil for conditioning; and mulching with less than 2-3 inches of composted bark, peat moss, or leaf mold.

Plant slightly above the soil level in poorly drained soils and slightly below in sandy, well-drained soils. Soak the soil around the plant thoroughly before mulching.

Staking is generally advised for conifers or evergreens to

**Q**: The needles of several spruce trees around our patio have turned a dingy gray. Many but not all of these needles have fallen. Will a fungicide help? [Indiana]

A: A fungicide will help if the problem is caused by a foliage disease. As head of the plant problem diagnostic clinic for tree care, I've seen a marked increase this year in the number of samples having spruce needle-cast. This disease is caused by the fungus, *Rhizosphaera kalkoffii*. The samples have off-color foliage, i.e., the needles were a mottled yellow-green, brownish-purple or chocolate-brown color. If fruiting bodies are present they look like small, black "pimples" and they emerge from the needle pores or stomata. Bordeaux is the fungicide most often recommended. Timing varies but the first application should go on about the first week in June. If the infection is severe repeat once or twice at approximately 14-day intervals.

Another pest problem on spruces with symptoms fitting those you describe is mites. A heavy infestation will cause the foliage to lose its color and appear yellow, reddishbrown, olive-green or gray. To confirm the presence of mites look for eggs, egg shells, silk between the needles or the mites themselves. You will have to look closely because mites are very small animals. A 10X hand lens will help, or beat the foliage. Collect what drops on a white surface. If you see tiny dots scurrying about they are mites. If you could count the legs there would be four pairs for an adult and three pairs on the immatures or nymphs. Mites are not insects and it's better to use a miticide rather than an insecticide on them. Since spruce mites have many and overlapping generations, more than one miticide application is needed. Also, a superior oil applied while the trees are dormant is effective against the overwintering stages. Oil should be used no more than once a year. Oil may result in a temporary loss of the waxy bloom, expecially on blue spruce. The needles should produce more wax and regain their normal color in four to eight weeks.

**Q**: We have a large purple-leafed plum tree and for several years now limbs have died off. I have pruned them out but it doesn't stop. I found some gummy stuff coming from what looks like holes. What can we do? (Illinois)

**A:** A common problem of purple-leaf plum especially older, larger trees is borers. Borers are detected by looking for small, usually circular areas of sap-soaked bark or gummy sap which oozes from wounds caused by these insects. The sappy exudate may be mixed with "sawdust" (larval borings).

Most garden centers carry borer sprays which you could apply not to the trunk and branches. The adult, a clearwinged moth, is controlled with insecticide sprays which are applied in May or June. Phermone traps are available for this insect (Synathedon spp.) and can be used to determine the presence of egg laying moths in your locality.

If there are many small holes as if the tree was blasted with a shotgun, the problem is caused by bark beetles. The "shotholeborer" (Scolytus rugulosus) can also be controlled with a borer spray such as Lindane.

Cut out and destroy all borer-infested, dead and dying branches. Keep the tree healthy by watering and fertilizing regularly. Heathly trees are more resistant to borer attack.

#### Integration important

I want to respond to your editorial, "The Time is Now to Coordinate Educators With Our Industry," in your March issue.

It is very important to have a strong integration of formal education and industry. That has been our philosophy at Lake City Community College [Lake City, FL) over the past 16 years with our highly successful Golf Course Operations and Landscape Design & Sales programs. Our golf course program is a three year program: one year of mechanics and two years of golf course operations. Landscape Design & Sales is two years. An important part of both our programs is the two required onjob-training periods our students must complete before they graduate. They get college credit for their experience, and the students are evaluated at the sites by us, the instructors. This gets us out into the field to find out what is going on, and it helps us keep good control over what is happening to our students in the field. We place our students anywhere in a 500 mile radius of Lake City, so we cover a lot of miles in the summer. This OJT program has been extremely successful.

Another part of our industry contact is our advisory committee made up of golf and landscape industry professionals. We meet with them once a year to discuss our program and evaluate the courses we are teaching and the job market. We have made changes in our program based on their suggestions.

What we need is more motivated young people to meet the industry demand. The Associated Landscape Contractors of America is making a good initial national effort to increase young people's awareness of the opportunities that exist for them in the landscape industry. However, I feel this is something that all landscape companies should also get involved with at a local level. They should take quality slide shows to high schools to let students know what they do. This might entice a student to work for that company for the summer and perhaps go on to school for further training.

I am very excited about our programs because they are vocational education as it should be: training students to get jobs.
