Biographical Note

Fred Ettawageshik was Chief Pipigwa of the Odawa (formerly called Ottawa) tribe. He ran a store started by his father that sold Native American art. He was married to Jane Esther Willits and they had a son, Frank who makes pottery using traditional methods.

Scope and Contents

The collection contains material about the Ettawageshik family. There are copies of newspaper articles about Joseph Ettawageshik, Fred's father; a copy of a certificate signed by President Zachary Taylor, declaring ownership of land to the Ettawageshiks; a copy of a dog license;
