Biographical Note

Edgar G. Nesman (1926-2016) was born in Lansing, Michigan in 1926. He graduated from Springport High School in 1944. He served in World War II in the Merchant Marines in the Pacific and the Atlantic. He graduated from Michigan State College (now Michigan State University) in 1950 with his B.S. in agricultural engineering. He earned his M.S. in 1960 in agricultural extension. He completed his Ph.D. at the University of Florida in 1969.

Nesman taught agriculture and mechanics at the Methodist Agricultural and Industrial School in Cuba from 1950-1960 and extension and community development at the Methodist Rural Center in Costa Rica from 1960 to 1966. Nesman taught sociology and Latin American studies at the University of South Florida for 25 years and retired in 1991.

He and his wife, Marjorie married in 1954 and they had four children. Nesman passed away November 10, 2016.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of an autobiography written by Edgar G. Nesman who graduated from Michigan State College (now Michigan State University) in 1950. The autobiography covers his life from childhood, his relatives, high school, service in World War II, student life at MSC, work in Cuba and Costa Rica, work at the University of Florida, and other professional travel. There is also some information about Nesman's grandmother who served as a housemother to male student boarders.
