Biographical Note

Gerald Alden Faverman was born November 21, 1935 in Boston, Massachusetts. He earned a B.S. in history and government from Boston College (1957), a M.A. in history and African studies from Boston University (1960), and a Ph.D. in administration and higher education from Michigan State University (1975). Faverman was a professor in the Department of History at Delta College, University Center, Michigan. He then joined the Michigan Department of Education and was later transferred to a position in the Legislative Fiscal Agency. He began his career at Michigan State University (MSU) in 1971 as assistant dean in the College of Osteopathic Medicine. In 1975, he left MSU to serve as acting dean for the newly established College of Osteopathic Medicine at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio.
